PURPOSE

The purpose of the workshop is to discuss the damage to electric utility facilities incurred due to recent hurricanes and explore ways of minimizing damage and resulting outages to customers in the future. One objective of this workshop will be to identify the type of damage incurred to existing facilities and whether any patterns can be discerned which would assist in developing mitigation techniques. A second objective is to identify areas for more in depth inquiry. The workshop will be conducted by Commission staff, however, one or more Commissioners may be present during the workshop. Utilities should be prepared to discuss in technical detail all studies conducted in house, or at the utility's request, or which they have reviewed, which examines the nature and extent of damage to different types of facilities.
