Dear Ms. Bayo,

In accordance with the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") staff letter dated November 15, 2005 and the request for extension filed by Qwest Communications Corporation ("Qwest") on November 28, 2005, Qwest is filing the following tariff changes to comply with the Commission's interexchange carrier ("IXC") flow through order requiring tariff modifications to account for retail Residential and Business switched access saving.. These changes reflected in the tariff will be effective on December 23, 2005. As indicated in Qwest's October 28, 2005 letter, Qwest's IXC intrastate long distance rates declined in Florida due to the competitive nature of the IXC business as well as in anticipation of the ordered access rate reductions. However, Qwest is now incorporating an additional four million dollars of reductions. The total IXC revenue reduction that Qwest's Florida consumers will now receive for 2005 and 2006 is over 13 million dollars.

The Commission staff letter dated November 15, 2005 asked that Qwest's tariff filing specifically include several items.

- (1) *A calculation of the dollar benefit associated with the ILEC's intrastate access rate reduction.*

Qwest determined the dollar benefit associated with the ILEC's intrastate access rate reduction in the following manner:

- Calculating the actual number of consumer residential and business minutes of use (“MOU”) for each ILEC over a period of five consecutive months in 2005.
- Annualizing the MOU in originating and terminating ILEC traffic separately for residential and business retail customers. .
- Each ILEC residential and business MOU was then multiplied by the access rates for each ILEC both before filing their reductions and the currently filed ILEC access rate reductions.
- The difference between the old rate and new rate annualized is the dollar benefit associated with the ILEC’s intrastate access rate reductions.

The underlying data regarding minutes of use were internally generated and then checked against data supplied by the ILECs who chose to generate reports for the IXC’s. The total amount of consumer switched access savings anticipated in 2006 will be \$4,031,505. The detailed calculation can be found in the enclosed Confidential Attachment A.

- (2) *Separate demonstrations that residential and business long distance rates have been reduced and the estimated annualized revenue effect, residential and business, including how those estimates were made.*

Qwest’s IXC residential and business flow-through reductions are demonstrated in its enclosed tariff filing including changes to its FPSC Tariff No. 1, by the following:

- Qwest will reduce its in-state access recovery fee for residential customers from \$1.95 to \$1.37, or \$.58 per pic’d line. This will amount to a savings of \$109,845.
- Qwest will reduce its commercial (business) long distance rates by \$0.0135 per minute for the Qwest Total Advantage (“QTA”) and Qwest Loyal Advantage (“QLA”) plans. This reduction will result in a forecasted amount of \$3,921,660.

Qwest has included as Confidential Attachment B to this letter, the anticipated monthly amount of flow through savings to its Florida consumer and business retail intrastate long distance customers.

- (3) *A demonstration that all rate reductions have been flowed through.*

Qwest’s total flow through rate reductions for residential customer amount to \$109,845 and the rate reductions for business customers equal \$3,921,660 which together total \$4,031,505 in annual reductions. The savings received from the ILEC reductions indicated that Qwest needed to flow through required was \$4,031,505. Therefore, Qwest has reduced long distance rates for residential and business


customers at the same level as savings realized on those products with the switched access reductions by the Verizon, Sprint, and Bell South.

The information contained in Confidential Attachment A and Confidential Attachment B is proprietary confidential business information pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 366.093 (3) (e) (2005). The disclosure of this information, which contains competitively sensitive market penetration data, would cause harm to Qwest's competitive business operations and affect its ability to compete in the state of Florida.

Qwest respectfully requests that both Attachments be classified as confidential pursuant to Rule 22-006 (4). *Florida Public Service Commission Rules*. Correspondingly, Qwest respectfully requests that the information contained in both Attachments be exempted from Florida Statutes Section 119.07 (1), thereby according it stringent procedural safeguards against public disclosure.
