Dear Ms. Daniels:

The Department has reviewed the application of Colina Bay Water Company, LLC, for an original Water Certificate to operate a water utility in Lake County for the purpose of providing potable water service to 73.75 acres (Colina Bay Subdivision consisting of 73 new houses). The proposed service territory (73.75 acres) is located in unincorporated Lake County in Sections 14 and 23 of Township 22 South, Range 26 East as described in the application. The proposed service territory is designated as "Urban Expansion" on the Lake County Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map (FLUM). The Urban Expansion FLUM category allows residential use (4 dwelling units per acre) and nonresidential uses (commercial and office, FAR 0.70). The provision of central potable water facilities to the proposed territory is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan FLUM. The water facilities would support residential land use that is consistent with the Lake County FLUM. The Department has identified no potential inconsistency of the application with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan.
