Access to Company Records

Dear Ms. Bayo:

On June 5, 2006, Arrow Communications, Inc. d/b/a ACI, filed its Petition on Proposed Agency Action in Docket No. 050948-TX. ACI did so because ACI believed that the company had not intentionally and willfully refused to comply with the Commission's request for data.

In all the years that Indiantown Company and its affiliated companies have been in business, there has never been an instance of refusal to comply with orders or requests of the Commission. Until this docket, all reports have been filed, including the category of report at issue in this docket.

The report in this docket was admittedly not filed, but the failure was not attributable to a willful or intentional refusal to file. The company was simply negligent.

In spite of the company's allegation of simple negligence, it is clear that the Commission is intent on proving that there was a different legal standard present in the failure to file the report in question. Under these circumstances, the company has decided that it is not in its economic best interests to continue the proceeding it initiated.

ACI hereby withdraws its Petition on Proposed Agency Action with the full understanding that this action will result in the cancellation of its Certificate No. TX033.
