Lee Eng, in going through yesterday's filings, I see that we issued an order in the "undocketed docket"....Actually, we should have opened a docket beforehand to address BellSouth's formal request, since we had to issue an order on it.

We do occasionally get undocketed requests for confidentiality (most frequently from BellSouth). If they're filed by telephone companies, we don't open a docket to handle the request unless the Commission actually has to make a ruling on the request. Most undocketed telco requests are treated more as claims than requests (i.e., remain undocketed, no order issued, returned when PSC no longer needs).

So, with all that said, what we will need to do is open a docket (titled "Request for") and issue an amendatory order to reflect the docket the request has been moved to.
