

## AMENDMENT No. 1 TO THE INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN GTC, INC. D/B/A GT COM, INC. AND MCIMETRO ACCESS TRANSMISSION SERVICES, LLC

WHEREAS, ILEC and MCIm (hereinafter individually referred to as a Party or collectively referred to as the "Parties") desire to amend the existing Interconnection Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual provisions contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Section 1.1 of the Interconnection Attachment shall be replaced in its entirety by the following language:
  - 1.1 This Interconnection Attachment sets forth specific terms and conditions for network interconnection arrangements between MCIm and ILEC for the purpose of the exchange of IntraLATA Traffic for Local Access Transport Areas (LATAs) 448 and 450 that is originated by an End User Customer of one Party and is terminated to an End User Customer of the other Party, where End User Customers are physically located in each respective LATA. This Attachment describes the physical architecture for the interconnection of the Parties facilities and equipment for the transmission and routing of Telephone Exchange Service traffic between the respective End User Customers of the Parties pursuant to the Act. The Parties will only exchange traffic for NPA-NXXs within each respective LATA. Traffic originated from or terminated to any other LATA will be prohibited under this Agreement unless modified in writing by both Parties.
- 2. Section 2.1 of the Interconnection Attachment shall be replaced in its entirety by the following language:
  - 2.1 The Parties agree to exchange IntraLATA Traffic originated by an End User Customer of one Party that terminates to an End User Customer of the other Party over dedicated facilities between their networks. The Parties agree to physically connect their respective networks so as to exchange such IntraLATA Traffic, with one Point of Interconnection (POI) designated at Florala End Office (FLRLALXADS0) for the exchange of traffic in LATA 448 and one Point of Interconnection (POI) designated at the Port St. Joe Tandem Office

(PTSJFLXA03T) for the exchange of traffic in LATA 450. Each Party shall be responsible for the cost of dedicated facilities on its side of each POI.

- 3. New Sections 1.6, 1.7, and 1.8 are added to Section 1, 911/E-911 Arrangements, of the Ancillary Services Attachment as follows:
  - 1.6 ILEC serves multiple counties and the Tyndall Air force Base all of which have 911 services. Each Party is responsible for insuring customers served on their network receive 911/E-911 service in the appropriate jurisdiction. Franklin, Calhoun, and Gulf counties and Tyndall Air Force Base provides 911/E-911 and owns their respective 911/E-911 systems. MCIm shall be responsible for securing 911 services from the counties and Tyndall Air Force base directly.
  - 1.7 Notwithstanding the foregoing, Franklin, Calhoun, and Gulf Counties have contracted with ILEC to operate and maintain the county-owned 911/E-911 selective router(s) and database(s). If directed by the county, ILEC shall provide MCIm with the appropriate CLLI codes, procedures for database updates and specifications of the selective router in accordance with applicable state law.
  - 1.8 Rates. If MCIm purchases facilities and trunks from ILEC for 911/E-911, MCIm shall pay ILEC the applicable charges for facilities and trunking arrangements. Rates for such facilities and trunking arrangements are as set forth in the Pricing Attachment to this Agreement.
- 4. In Section 26, Notices, in the General Terms & Conditions, replace contact information for John La Penta with contact information for Robin Tuttle as follows:
