**PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA INC.'S NOTICE OF
INTENT TO REQUEST CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION**

Progress Energy Florida, Inc., ("PEF" or "Company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), submits this Notice of Intent to Request for Confidential Classification of confidential portions of PEF's Supplemental Response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 4-8). Specifically, portions of Attachment A responsive to Interrogatory #5 contains confidential business information relating to PEF's barge contracts. Therefore, the disclosure of that information to the public would adversely impact PEF's competitive business interests. Disclosure of that information to the public would also adversely impact the competitive business interests of PEF's potential barge providers.

Attached as Exhibit A is a copy of OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (Nos. 4-8) to which this notice relates.

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a)(1), PEF will file its Request for Confidential Classification for the confidential information contained herein within twenty-one (21) days of filing this request.

**CITIZENS' FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES
TO PROGRESS ENERGY FLORIDA, INC. (NOS. 4-8)**

Pursuant to § 350.0611(1), F.S., Fla. Admin. Code R. 28-106.206, and Fla. R. Civ. P. 1.340, Florida's Citizens (Citizens or OPC) propound the following interrogatories to Progress Energy Florida, Inc. (PEF) to be answered on or before 30 days from the date of service, or at such other time and place as may be mutually agreed upon by counsel.

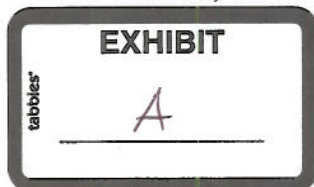
DEFINITIONS

As used herein, the following words shall have the meanings indicated:

- (i) "PEF" or "the company" means Progress Energy Florida, Inc.

INSTRUCTIONS

- A. Documents or reports to be identified shall include all documents in your possession, custody and control and all other documents of which you have knowledge.
- B. To the extent an interrogatory calls for information which cannot now be precisely and completely furnished, such information as can be furnished should be included in the answer, together with a statement that further information cannot be furnished, and a statement as to the reasons therefore.



If you expect to obtain further information between the time answers are served and the time of hearing, you are requested to state this fact in each answer. If the information which cannot now be furnished is believed to be available to another person, identify such other person and the reasons for believing such person has the described information.

- C. In the event any Interrogatory herein calls for information or for the identification of a document which you deem to be privileged, in whole or in part, the information should be given or the document identified to the fullest extent possible consistent with such claim of privilege and specify the grounds relied upon for the claim of privilege.
- D. Separate answers shall be furnished for each interrogatory, although where the context permits, an interrogatory may be answered by reference to the answer furnished to another interrogatory.
- E. For each interrogatory, identify the name, address, telephone number and position of the person responsible for providing the answer.

INTERROGATORIES

- 4. For the calendar years 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007, please provide by month the total quantity of coal that was delivered to Crystal River by barge, stated separately for CR 4&5 and for CR 1&2.

5. Beginning with the contractual arrangements in effect on January 1, 2005, describe the contractual arrangements, including any amendments, replacements, or changes thereto, that Progress Energy Florida, Inc. has established for the delivery of coal by barge across the Gulf of Mexico to Crystal River. To the extent applicable, include in your answer a description of the equipment committed contractually to serving Progress Energy's needs, and terms addressing number and capacity of barges to be made available pursuant to the contract(s), frequency of deliveries, and/or tons to be delivered.

6. Please describe any changes to, or increases in, the number of barges employed in the transportation of coal across the Gulf of Mexico to Crystal River; the size or

capacity of such barges; the frequency of deliveries; and/or the total quantity of coal to be transported since January 1, 2005.

7. Referring to Progress Energy Exhibit SAW-15, page 12 of 26, in Docket No. 060658-EI please provide answers to the following:
 - a. Please state all assumptions that were used in the calculation of an estimated \$15.5 million 2007 savings as stated on PEF's exhibit, based on the burn of 20% Powder River Coal at CR 4&5.

b. Please provide all underlying calculations that were used to produce the amount of savings anticipated in 2007 resulting from a 20% PRB burn at CR 4&5.

c. Please provide the actual number and the data source for each of the numbers used to develop the savings estimate, separately for PRB coal and CAPP coal, for mine price per ton, \$mmbtu, total annual mmbtu burned, total annual tons delivered, mine to river transport costs, river transport costs, cross gulf transport costs, terminal blending and transfer costs, and any other relevant cost components not identified in this interrogatory, but included in the calculations.

d. Please state the date that the SAW-15, page 12 document was first prepared, and the names and titles of the persons who prepared this document and the names and the titles of all persons who received this document.

8. Referring to Progress Energy Exhibit No. SAW-13, Page 7, of Docket No. 060658-EI, please provide answers to the following:

a. Please state all assumptions million that were used in the calculation of approximately \$31 of 2007 savings for "Option 2" as shown on the exhibit based on the use of a 20% PRB blend w/River CAPP coal at CR 4&5.

b. Please provide all underlying calculations that were used to produce the amount of savings anticipated in 2007 resulting from a 20% PRB burn at CR 4&5.

c. Please provide the actual number and the data source for each of the numbers used to develop the savings estimate, separately for PRB coal and CAPP coal, for mine price per ton, \$mmbtu, total annual mmbtu burned, total annual tons delivered, mine to river transport costs, river transport costs, cross gulf transport costs, terminal blending and transfer costs, and any other relevant cost components not identified in this interrogatory, but included in the calculation.

d. Please state the date that the SAW-13 page 7 document was first prepared, and the names and titles of the persons who prepared this document and the names and the titles of all persons who received this document

e. Please provide information corresponding to (a), (b), (c), and (d), above for “Option 3” of Exhibit SAW-13.
