



Steve Reilly asked that I email to you the customer's agreement to abate the anion settlement agreement. The following was reviewed by the meeting attendees and there is general agreement to move forward with 120 day abatement because it has become obvious that the PSC directed settlement is not being enforced nor followed by the utility. It appears that a sale is now the only reasonable solution to the 14 year old Aloha problem.

Statement from BWN Committee

On Friday March the 7th, the Better Water Now (BWN) committee met at the Morton Plant Mease Out Patient Center.

At this meeting we concurred that it is important to support the efforts of FGUA in purchasing Aloha Utilities. We also noted that the anion implementation is currently over 15 months behind schedule and environmental problems have surfaced.

It appears that anion may no longer be appropriate. It also appears that the PSC refuses to enforce the settlement agreement. Therefore, the BWN committee supports the requested 120 day abatement from the anion settlement and the suspension of further expenditures by Aloha.
