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KW RESORT UTILITIES' CORP.  
SECOND STATUS REPORT

KW Resort Utilities ("KW" or "the Utility"), by and through undersigned counsel, hereby files this Status Report and in support thereof would state and allege as follows:

1. KW originally filed a Stipulated Motion for Continuance in the above-referenced case on January 7, 2008 because of their pending discussions for sale of the Utility to a government agency.

2. The Prehearing Officer's Order No. PSC-08-0032-PCO-SU issued January 8, 2008, required that KW apprise the Prehearing Officer, as well as staff and the Office of the Public Counsel, of the status of these matters no less than 30 days from the date of the Order.

3. On February 6, 2008 KW timely filed its Status Report as required by the above-referenced Order. In that Status Report the Utility noted that negotiations continued for the sale of the Utility to a governmental entity and requested a second continuance of 60 additional days.

4. The Prehearing Officer granted that additional continuance by Order No. PSC-08-129-PCO-SU, issued on February 28, 2008 and directed KW to apprise the Prehearing Officer, the staff, and OPC of the status of the matters addressed therein by filing a Status Report by April 7, 2008. In response to that requirement, KW hereby states the following:

a) KW continues to be in negotiation with the local governmental entity

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
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concerning the potential sale of the Utility. However, KW cannot, at the time of filing this report, represent that the sale is imminent. While the possibility of sale remains sufficiently real, and negotiations are continuing, it does not appear to be a likelihood that those negotiations will come to fruition in the very near future.

- b) KW does not believe that negotiations are far enough along or that resolution is sufficiently imminent to warrant a request for further continuance of this case at this time.

5. KW therefore proposes that the Prehearing Officer direct the Commission staff to coordinate with the parties to reestablish the hearing dates and other controlling dates sufficiently in the future to allow the Utility and other parties to complete the discovery and appropriate rebuttal testimony, both of which have been, and will continue to be, relatively extensive, and to confer in achieving that goal.


