## EXPEDITED MOTION OF AT&T FLORIDA TO STAY EFFECTIVENESS OF COMMISSION VOTE

BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida ("AT&T") hereby respectfully requests that the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") expeditiously stay the effectiveness of the Commission's September 4, 2008 vote on the Commission Staff's Recommendations in Docket Nos. 070368-TP and 070369-TP ("Expedited Motion to Stay"). As is established below, unless expeditiously stayed, the Commission's approval of the Staff Recommendation on Issue 4, could effectively render AT&T's affirmative right to reconsideration, pursuant to Rule 25-22.060, null and void and thereby violate AT&T's due process rights. In support of this Motion AT&T states the following:

- 1. During the Commission's Agenda Meeting held on September 4, 2008, the Commission voted on Staff Recommendations in Dockets Nos. 070368-TP and 070369-TP.
- 2. Staff Recommendations in these Dockets included the following Recommendation on <u>Issue 4</u>: Should this docket be closed?

Recommendation: If the Commission approves Nextel's adoption of the Sprint ICA in Issue 1 or Issue 2B, Docket Nos. 070368-TP and 070369-TP should remain open pending the *filing of the signed adoption between the parties, which should occur no later than 7 days following the Commission's vote*. These dockets should be closed administratively upon issuance of a memo by staff acknowledging the Adoption of the Sprint – AT&T Interconnection Agreement.

If the Commission denies Nextel's adoption of the Sprint ICA in Issue 1 and Issue 2B, Docket Nos. 070368-TP and 070369-TP should be closed upon issuance of the Final Order. (Emphasis added).

- 3. The Commission approved Nextel's adoption of the Sprint ICA and approved Staff's Recommendation on Issue 4--thereby requiring the parties to submit signed adoption documents "no later than 7 days following the Commission's [September 4, 2008] vote." See Staff Recommendation on Issue 4 above; emphasis added.
- 4. Compliance with the language contained in the approved Issue 4 Recommendation, would require filing signed adoption documents with the Commission on or before September 11, 2008.
  - 5. To date, the Commission has not entered a written Order in these Dockets.
- 6. Commission Rule 25-22.060(3) provides in pertinent part: "A motion for reconsideration of a final order shall be filed within 15 days after issuance of the order." Thus, AT&T cannot seek reconsideration until such time as the Commission issues a written order.
- 7. The salient issue in these Dockets is whether, and under what circumstances, AT&T must allow Nextel to adopt the Sprint AT&T interconnection agreement.
- 8. Any reconsideration that AT&T might desire to seek on a final order in these Dockets would effectively be prematurely and improperly mooted by operation of the

Commission's approval of the Staff Recommendation on Issue 4. That is so because, to comply with the Commission approval of Staff's Recommendation on Issue 4, AT&T would be forced to execute and file with the Commission the adoption documents prior to ever having been allowed to exercise its affirmative statutory right to seek reconsideration on issues involving the underlying adoptions.

- 9. Requiring that AT&T execute and file the adoption documents prior to the expiration of the 15-day time period (subsequent to a final written order) that it would otherwise have to seek reconsideration, would effectively render that statutory right null and void, and thereby improperly deny AT&T its clearly-established due process right.
- 10. Expeditiously granting this Motion is necessary to ensure that there is no violation of AT&T's due process rights.
- 11. Staying operation of Commission approval of Staff's Recommendation on Issue 4 does not harm Nextel. Expeditiously granting AT&T's Motion would serve the public interest by preserving AT&T's due process rights while maintaining the status quo until such time as a Final Order is issued, AT&T's statutory right to reconsideration has expired, or a timely-filed Motion for Reconsideration has been resolved.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, AT&T requests that the Commission grant its Expedited Motion to Stay.
