

AT&T FLORIDA'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and other applicable law, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida ("AT&T Florida") herewith files its Request for Confidential Classification and states as follows.

- 1. In September 2008, the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission ("Staff") commenced an audit into AT&T Florida's April OSS software release ("April Release"). See Commission Order No. PSC-08-0618-PAA-TP, dated September 23, 2008 (accepting the parties' agreement regarding the scope of an April Release audit conducted by Staff). On December 18, 2008, following Staff's issuance to AT&T Florida of an initial draft audit report, Staff provided AT&T Florida with a revised report entitled "A Review AT&T's OSS April 2008 Release Analysis and Resolutions" ("Audit Report").
- 2. The Audit Report contains proprietary confidential business information. Such information: (i) is treated as proprietary by AT&T Florida; (ii) is not generally disclosed; and (iii) the disclosure of such information could harm the business operations of AT&T Florida. On January 9, 2009, in accordance with applicable rules and regulation, AT&T Florida filed a Request for Confidential Classification for the specific portions of the Audit Report which AT&T Florida believes contain proprietary confidential business information, along with the justification offered in support of such classification.

- 3. Additionally, on January 9, 2009, AT&T Florida filed its comments regarding the Audit Report ("Comments"). The Comments address, among other things, the proprietary confidential business information portions of the Audit Report. Accordingly, on January 9, 2009, AT&T Florida filed a Notice of Intent to Request Confidential Classification of the portions of the Comments that in AT&T Florida's view contain and/or address proprietary confidential business information.
- 4. The specific portions of AT&T Florida's Comments which contain proprietary confidential business information, along with the justification offered in support of such classification, are identified in Attachment A to this Request for Confidential Classification.
- 5. Attachment B to this Request for Confidential Classification contains redacted versions of the Comments wherein the portions of the Comments which AT&T considers proprietary confidential business information are blocked out.
- 6. Attachment C to this Request for Confidential Classification is proprietary version of the Comments wherein the portions of the Comments which AT&T Florida considers proprietary confidential business information are highlighted.

For the reasons set forth herein, AT&T Florida respectfully requests an Order declaring the portions of the Comments that AT&T Florida has identified as proprietary confidential business information to be considered and treated as such pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes and other applicable law.
