Clective Telecom Florida, LLC is in receipt of the further letters and filings by AT&T in the above referenced matter. AT&T apparently cannot grasp the concept that people can work for more than one company at a time in order to provide for their family. While Clective would like to continue battling AT&T over the issue of Mr. Noack, Clective cannot afford to continue to delay its market entry over this issue.¹ Therefore, Clective states the following to the Commission to finally put this matter to rest.

Since the date of March 22, 2009, Mr. Noack has performed no work for Clective. Further, prior to that date, Mr. Noack was assisting Clective in their market entry in return for no compensation because of his friendship with Clective. Mr. Noack never benefited financially or otherwise from Clective. To be clear, Clective has terminated its business relationship with Mr. Noack and Mr. Noack no longer has any involvement in Clective.

Once again, Clective is only interested in resolving this docket and moving on with its business.
