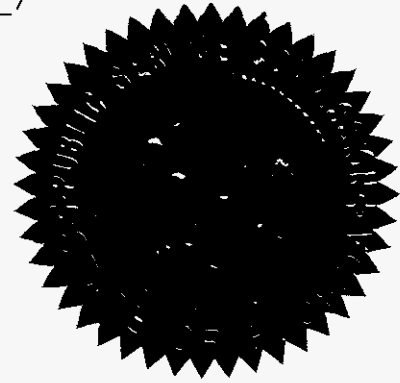

2 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** And we can move on
3 to Item 3.

4 **MR. CASEY:** Good morning, Commissioners.
5 Bob Casey on behalf of staff.

6 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Good morning, Bob.
7 (Off-the-record discussion.)

8 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Mr. Casey.

9 **MR. CASEY:** Thank you.

10 Item Number 3 addresses the CapTel
11 captioning telephone roaming policy for the state of
12 Florida. Staff is recommending that the Commission
13 discontinue roaming and guest options for Florida's
14 CapTel service. The roaming and guest options were
15 originally put in place when there were only a
16 handful of states using the CapTel service. Today
17 all 50 states and the District of Columbia now have
18 CapTel service.

19 Staff believes the roaming and guest
20 policies are outdated and should be changed. This
21 action would save the state over \$245,000 per year.
22 This issue was brought before the TASA Advisory
23 Committee in November, which unanimously supported
24 the discontinuance of CapTel roaming in Florida. If
25 approved by the Commission, staff, along with Sprint

1 and FTRI, will work together to notify each CapTel
2 user in Florida of the change in policy.

3 And staff is available for questions.

4 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Commissioners? FTRI
5 wanted to speak. I know we have an interpreter. I
6 don't know if that's the best vantage point for the
7 interpreter.

8 **MR. CASEY:** FTRI is here to answer
9 questions in case Commissioners have any questions
10 of FTRI.

11 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Okay. Any
12 questions, Commissioners? Okay.

13 Seeing none; anything else, Mr. Casey, you
14 want to add?

15 **MR. CASEY:** No, ma'am.

16 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Okay. Do we have a
17 motion?

18 **COMMISSIONER SKOP:** Thank you, Madam
19 Chair.

20 I would move to approve the staff
21 recommendation on Item 3 for Issues 1 and 2.

22 **COMMISSIONER KLEMENT:** Second.

23 **CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO:** Okay. All those in
24 favor of the motion say aye.


