COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. If staff could take up, I believe, Item 9 and introduce it, please.

MS. HUDSON: Good morning, Commissioners.

Shannon Hudson on behalf of Commission staff.

Item Number 9 is an application for increase in water rates in Franklin County by Water Management Services. This recommendation addresses the suspension of rates and the utility's request for interim rates.

The Office of Public Counsel and the utility's counsel are available for questioning; however, participation is at the discretion of the Commission. Staff is prepared to answer any questions you may have at this time.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. To the bench, any comments?

Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. I did have just a couple of questions for staff.

Recognizing that this is a recommendation to approve an increase in rates on an interim basis, what discretion does the Commission have regarding interim rates in this instance, if any?

MR. JAEGER: Commissioner Edgar, 367.082

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governs interim rates. And although (1) says, it says, "The Commission may during a proceeding authorize interim rates," Section (2)(a) says, "In a proceeding for an interim increase in rates, the Commission shall authorize within 60 days of the filing for such relief the collection of rates sufficient to earn the minimum of the range of rate of return calculated in accordance with subparagraph (5)(b)(2)."

And I think the way we've interpreted that in the past is meaning once they've submitted a prima facie case, then the "shall" kicks in. It's your job to decide whether they have submitted a prima facie case. I believe that is the way we've interpreted that in the past.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. And so the staff recommendation is based upon your finding, decision, analysis that that prima facie case has been established.

MR. FLETCHER: That's correct, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. That was not completely clear to me from the recommendation and that's why I wanted to clarify that. And my understanding is, from reading the information, I

agree with that. So I am fine with the staff recommendation. Commissioners, I did just want to for the record establish that that prima facie requirement is met.

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COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you,

Commissioner. Any other questions from the bench?

Okay. To staff, just one followup

question. In terms of interim rates, essentially

it's driven strictly by statute and the Commission

shall approve those interim rates when the case has

been made on a --

MR. JAEGER: That's correct, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Great.

Thank you.

commissioner edgar: One additional then just again to follow that line of reasoning through. The customers are protected in that there would be reimbursement, if indeed the Commission ultimately determined a finding that was of a lesser amount.

MR. JAEGER: Yes. The interim rates would not be approved until we get a court, you know, a protection, either bond letter of credit or escrow account, and it's always subject to refund with interest.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you,

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Commissioner.

And just to Mr. Jaeger, I guess one of the quirks with interim rates, since they're derived on a statutory basis, is sometimes interim rates are set higher than the final Commission approved rates, but they are subject to refund; is that correct?

MR. JAEGER: That's definitely happened in the past. We've made refunds of interim rates.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right.

Thank you. Any other questions from the bench? Do
we have a motion?

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I move the staff recommendation on Item 9.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Is there a second?

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Second.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. We have a motion, properly seconded. Any discussion?
