## PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Let's move to Item 8. Thank you, Staff.

Ms. Evans.

MS. EVANS: Good morning, Commissioners. 8 is Florida Cable Telecommunications Association's motion for clarification of a PAA order. The Commission rules do not entertain motions for reconsideration or clarification on PAA orders; therefore, we recommend that the Commission deny the motion.

The representatives from AT&T and Florida Cable Telecommunications Association are here to answer any questions you may have, and Staff is also available to answer any questions the Commissioners may have.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commission board, any questions?

Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you.

Just a quick question, I believe, to Mr. Hatch. I guess I want to commend AT&T for reaching a settlement agreement with CompSouth and also with the other party that I have here. I'm trying to -- STS, I believe; right?

Okay. I guess the question I have for Staff

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and Mr. Hatch, if you have any objection. It seemed at least that there was a lengthy recommendation written as to why the request should be denied and a, and a score of legal analysis done. But it seems to me, you know, would it not have been just simple enough to add a footnote to amendatory order and, you know, solve the whole situation without a detailed analysis? You know, I'd like to hear from Mr. Hatch because I respect AT&T's position. And I'm not saying that AT&T is not right. mean, it just -- if it's a matter of just, you know, putting a little footnote in, obscure footnote that, you know, FCTA's position is reiterated as they took no position or was not a party to the settlement. It seems like to me we're having much ado about nothing, but I'd like to hear from the parties and perhaps from Staff on that.

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MR. HATCH: In some respects — this is Tracy Hatch on behalf of AT&T Florida. In some respects I agree with you, Commissioner Skop. The problem is, is that the PAA process, the mechanical process is very precise and very specific and is used for very specific things. And if you alter or try to alter a PAA, then what you necessarily have to do is reissue the PAA because then — to give parties the 21-day notice to protest. So if you change it in any way, then you've

got to start the 21-day clock over again. Nobody wanted to do that. We agree with the substantive ultimate result. Just have a process where we're trying to protect the integrity of the process.

appreciate that, Mr. Hatch. As do I, I think it's very important to respect tradition and the process and precedent. I think that what I was getting at is I know that Staff, you know, if there's a scrivener's error, typically you might be able to incorporate it without being a modification or amendatory order. I mean, there's things that we have the power to, to amend on our motion to address. But, again, I thought it, you know, interesting reading across many pages as to how do we get to the decision. It seems to me the simple thing would have been that mutual consent by the parties to have Staff add a footnote and just reissue the order without, you know, being a formal protest or a reconsideration of the PAA process, so.

MR. KONUCH: And indeed, Commissioner Skop, that is what we were looking for.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Sir, I need you to give your name for the record.

MR. KONUCH: David Konuch from FCTA.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you.

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MR. KONUCH: But the recommendation, at least 1 it does make clear that we're not a party to the 2 agreement and we're not, we're not bound by it. So to 3 that extent we've accomplished our objective. But, you 4 5 know, we -- initially that really is what we wanted was 6 just that footnote. 7 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Well, I appreciate that. And like I say, that's the only questions I had. 8 9 10

that. And like I say, that's the only questions I had. I think it would have been, in retrospect it might have been easier just to put a footnote in, but apparently it got a little more detailed than that. So I appreciate the input from both the parties and Staff on that one. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any other questions or comments from the board? Seeing none, can I get a motion?

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Move Staff.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Second.
