## PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: The next item up is Item Number 12.

I see that Mr. Willis assumes that everybody knows his name. Thank you, Marshall.

Mr. Hinton.

MR. HINTON: Chairman, Commissioners, I'm Cayce Hinton with Commission Staff.

Item 12 is staff's recommendation in Docket Number 100009, the nuclear cost recovery proceeding.

This docket addresses petitions for cost recovery related to nuclear construction projects pursuant to Section 366.93, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code.

In this docket we've addressed petitions by both FPL and Progress Energy. FPL's petition included costs related to the uprate of existing nuclear plants, Turkey Point Units 3 and 4, and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2, as well as the proposed new generating plants, Turkey Point Units 6 and 7. However, as you recall, the parties to this docket stipulated all FPL-specific issues and the Commission approved that stipulation during the September 7th hearing.

Progress Energy's petition included costs

related to the uprate of the existing nuclear plant Crystal River 3, as well as the proposed new generating plants, Levy Units 1 and 2.

Other than one legal issue, the recommendation before you only addresses Progress-specific issues.

Issue 3A in the recommendation before you, I would note, has been deferred to next year's proceeding.

To aid you in discussing questions you may have, Keino Young directly to my left will address the recommendations on, the legal recommendation on Issue 2; Stephen Garl to my right will address the long-term feasibility issues, 6 and 8; and I will do my best to address all other issues. Staff is available to proceed with a review of the issues in order, if that is your preference, or otherwise answer any questions you may have.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Hinton. And thank you for reminding us that we have already deferred Issue 3A.

That being said, Commission board, do we have any questions or comments?

Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Yes. Just as a point of information with respect to Issue 3A, which would, disposition had been deferred, what was the

10	MR. YOUNG: The deferral slip, Commissioner,

13	COMMISSIONER SKOP: I'm sorry. I'm having
14	trouble hearing you.
15	MR. YOUNG: I'm sorry. The idea was to defer
16	until next year's proceeding. This is not a this
17	issue doesn't have a dollar impact as relates to the
18	other issues. Because we don't know when the 1st DCA
19	will rule on this case, we were being prudent in terms
20	of deferring it until next year.
21	COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Very well.
22	Thank you.
23	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Are there any other
24	questions? Commissioner Skop, and then I'm sorry.
25	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Oh, that's okay.

1 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Skop and then Commissioner Edgar. I didn't know if you were finished. 2 3 COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Thank you. With respect to Staff recommendation, let me 4 try and get to the right issue. I believe on Issue 9 5 with respect to the CR3 uprate costs, the amounts that 6 7 Staff is recommending approval, can Staff just briefly review those amounts, please? 8 9 MR. HINTON: The bottom line is, is a, a true-up for 2009 costs related to the CR3 uprate of a 10 negative 244,765. Did you want to go through the 11 different costs that are listed there that, that go into 12 13 that? 14 COMMISSIONER SKOP: No. I'm just looking for the bottom line. 15 16 MR. HINTON: Yeah. The bottom line is a 17 negative 244,765. COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. So that's a 18 19 credit? 20 MR. HINTON: Correct. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right. 21 with respect to Issue, Issue 12, the bottom line amount 22 with respect to the Levy 1, Levy 2 units. 23 MR. HINTON: The bottom line, Staff recommends 24

the Commission approve as prudent a final 2009 true-up

amount of 4,192,819 related to the 2009 Levy project. 1 2 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And within the 3 scope of the Staff recommendation Staff has determined that all the expenditures that Progress incurred were 4 prudently incurred and consistent with statute; is that 5 6 correct? With regards to the Levy project 7 MR. HINTON: in 2009, yes, we're recommending finding a prudence on 8 9 those costs. COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Very well. 10 11 Thank you. 12 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Commissioner 13 Skop. Commissioner Edgar. 14 15 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chair. And I want to come back and follow up on the procedural 16 17 point that Commissioner Skop asked about and that Mr. Young and Mr. Hinton responded to because I'm still 18 a little unclear. 19 I understand that it was the decision of the 20 21 Chair in response to other factors that we need to be 22 responsive to to defer Issue 3A, and I'm fine with that. But when you said that it would be deferred until the 23 24 2011 NCRC, that would be when?

MR. HINTON: During the normal course of next

year's nuclear cost recovery proceeding, which would go to hearing at some point presumably in August of next year.

this may be an overly picky technicality, and feel free to tell me if indeed that's the case, but I think what, what you have said that, to defer it until next year, until 2011 is basically adopting the Staff recommendation before us, and I would have thought that that would have required a vote. And I thought what we were trying to do was, was recognize that we are not in a position to vote. So I'm just -- and, and also I didn't see the form, so my understanding was that it was a deferral of this issue. But as Commissioner Skop had raised, that that would then have the opportunity potentially to come back to us prior to August of this [sic] year. And I just want to make sure I'm clear on what we're doing.

MS. HELTON: I have to confess that even though my signature is on the form, I evidently did not read it. I thought it had the same language that we had put down for the rest of them. It has the same -- oh, it has the same language? Oh, okay.

Okay. I think that may be -- looking at it again, it does have the same language as the other ones,

which I thought that it did. I'm not sure that you can infer from that actually that we are deferring it until next year. So I think after listening to the discussion today, I think that it probably is better to bring that back at the appropriate time once the Court has ruled to see what the will of everyone is with respect to when that issue will be taken up.

commissioner EDGAR: What I would suggest is just to keep it -- just a suggestion, Commissioners -- keep it so that, such that it is available to us to bring back at an earlier point, if indeed that is something that the Staff would recommend and that we want to consider.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Well, I don't think we deferred it to a date, to a date certain. We just deferred it. So we can bring it back at any time; is that correct?

MR. YOUNG: I'll yield to Mr. Devlin.

MR. DEVLIN: No. I was just saying you're correct, Chairman Graham and Commissioner Edgar. We have a date specific in there. We probably shouldn't have had a date specific in there. We probably should have just left that blank.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: If -- thank you. If I may, I think there's just a little bit of confusion, all

well intentioned, between the language in the Staff recommendation and then the additional procedural decision that we have made to defer FPL related items. And I think that, Commissioners, if you agree, that probably a way to handle that is just to take half a step back and, as we move forward, recognize that we have by rule of the Chair deferred Issue 3A and that it may come back to us at some time in the future as recommended by Staff.

MR. HINTON: Commissioner, I, I fully take the blame for any confusion this morning. I apparently completely misread the deferral slip when I looked at it this morning. So I, I thought I read that it was being deferred to next year. Apparently I was greatly mistaken.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Hinton, nobody goes under the bus. I just wanted to make sure that I was clear as to, as to what we were doing. And, Mr. Chair, I appreciate the opportunity to do that.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Commissioner Edgar.

So, legal, is there anything that we need to do as far as my deferral, or are we --

MS. HELTON: I think with the discussion on the record today that it's clear that no decision was

made by this, by this body to defer it until next year and that there will be an opportunity for you all to vote on that once the Court has lifted the stay or otherwise ruled and allowed you to vote on all FPL items.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Sounds good.

Anything else from the board? Seeing none, can I get a motion? Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

If, if there are no questions on any of the specific issues that are before us, I can move the Staff recommendation for this issue, recognizing that we have deferred decision on Issue 3A.

And before I relinquish the floor, I would like to make a more general comment. A couple years back when we as a Commission approved the need determination for this plant, we knew that it was a long-term, or for this proposal, we knew that it was a long-term commitment by the company, but also by the state as part of an energy policy for the state striving for energy independence, carbon reduction and fuel diversity.

I also note that it is a commitment by the customers who are basically paying forward for future benefits, and the intergenerational inequities continue

to be a concern. With that in mind, I continue, as we 1 2 have discussed at this bench before, to urge pursuit of 3 joint ownership. And I certainly also would express my own preference for joint ownership, if indeed that can 4 occur, to be a partnership within Florida so that the 5 6 benefits over the long-term accrue to Florida and Floridians. 7 And with that, again, Mr. Chair, I would move 8 Staff on all issues before us except for Issue 3A. 9 10 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Second. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and seconded 11 12 to move all issues, move Staff recommendation on all 13 issues on Item 12 except for Issue 3A that has already been deferred, and it's been seconded. Any further 14 discussion? 15 16 Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. 17 (Unanimous vote.)

Those opposed. By your action, you've approved Item 12, all issues except for 3A. Thank you, Staff.
