REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENT ON
AMERICAN DIAL TONE'S REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF

If the Commission decides that the Request for Emergency Relief, filed in this docket on even date herewith by American Dial Tone, Inc. ("ADT"), should be considered by a panel of Commissioners at an Agenda Conference or by one or more Commissioners at a hearing,¹ ADT requests oral argument pursuant to Rule 25-22.058, Florida Administrative Code. In support of this conditional request, ADT states as follows:

1. Oral argument would aid the Commission in comprehending and evaluating the issues presented in the Request for Emergency Relief. This matter involves somewhat unique circumstances where AT&T claims the right to take unilateral action to disrupt the service of ADT based on a dispute AT&T had raised with ADT but had never brought to the Commission as required by the interconnection agreement. At the core of the Request are questions involving the orderly administration of cases before the Commission, the Commission's authority over disputes and interconnection agreements, and the Commission's duty to protect the public interest, including ADT's customers.

2. If oral argument is permitted, ADT submits 15 minutes per party is sufficient time for argument.

WHEREFORE, ADT requests oral argument on its Request for Emergency Relief, if a hearing is deemed necessary, as stated above.
