PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Item Number 19.

MR. FLETCHER: Commissioners, Bart Fletcher with Commission Staff.

Item 19 is Staff's recommendation to suspend the final requested rates of C.F.A.T. H20, Inc., and to approve an interim rate increase subject to refund with interest. Staff has an oral modification which has been previously provided to the Commissioners and all parties.

Staff is prepared to answer any questions the Commission may have.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: I have a quick question. I know during, I know during my briefing of the oral modifications, and I was just wondering why such a big difference in the percentages?

MR. FLETCHER: The percentages, particularly for, on Issue 4, what Staff had reflected originally was the increase which is basically -- the percentage increase in revenues, which is the recommended revenue increase divided by the adjusted test year revenues. That definitely is incorrect. The most appropriate to put in escrow is to the revenue increase recommended divided by the total revenue requirement. So that

was -- to answer that question.

As far as the revenue increase just in general, the 97 percent percentage revenue increase, it has been 17 years since the Utility's last case. Plant has risen for water approximately almost a half million dollars, and then O&M expenses have increased just from 2000 to the test year by about 52 percent. So for interim purposes, given that 17-year period went from when the Commission last established rates, that's given rise to the level of interim increase in this case.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Thank you.

Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you. Just quick questions for Staff.

I guess on page 2 of the Staff recommendation, the last time the Utility had a water rate base established was in '94, and at that time I believe in the footnote an authorized return on equity is not established; is that correct?

MR. FLETCHER: That is correct. That was a transfer, and rate base is established and basically the rates from the previous owner were basically carried over.

1 to statute. 2 MR. FLETCHER: Yes. And in this case we have 3 used the current leverage formula pursuant to the interim statute. 5 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And then -- thank 6 you on that point. 7 On page 4 of the Staff recommendation in 8 terms of the requested interim revenue increase, the 9 increase as a percentage of revenue requirement is 10 about almost 100 percent; is that correct? The bill 11 is 97.06 percent increase. 12 MR. FLETCHER: That is correct. 13 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And so looking at 14 that as it pertains to monthly rates on a 5,000 gallon 15 usage on page 14 in the Staff recommendation for interim 16 rates, customers are going to see their bills almost 17 double, not so much in the interim. But if the Commission approves the final, effectively it's going 18 19 from \$18.12 to a Staff recommended \$35.71 for interim at 20 5,000 gallons; is that correct? 21 MR. FLETCHER: That's correct. 22 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right. 23 you. 24 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any further discussion? 25

COMMISSIONER SKOP: I do, I do have one more

point. Thank you.

Why, why is the -- I guess what, what drove the rate increase here seems to be the base facility charge, and that's the point that kind of alluded me in the, in the discussion in terms of the gallonage charge which is going up substantially. The base facility charge by meter size is going from \$9.97 to almost \$20 a month under interim rates and stands to go higher in final rates. Can Staff just briefly speak to that, why the, I guess the BFC percentage versus the, you know, rate structure issues there?

MR. FLETCHER: For interim purposes we just used the across-the-board increase. And for final we have to look further into the detail whether there was an allocation shift between BFC and gallonage for the Utility's final requested rates.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. But Staff will be taking a look at that during the formal -- final rates.

MR. FLETCHER: Yes, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Can I get a motion?

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Move Staff recommendation
on Issues 1 through 5.
