PART I – AUF Defective Response

The undersigned hereby bring to your attention that the above cited response to Staff letter is vague and unresponsive as to the subject matter set forth as follows:

FPSC Staffs request (per H & K response letter, page 4):

Additional Information

7. Wastewater Revenue Requirements. Please describe in detail the basis used and/or documents relied upon for the annual wastewater growth projection through the year 2014.

July 5, 2011 from: Nicholson

RESPONSE:

The wastewater growth projections are based on data received from the current utility owner, who is also the developer for the service area. The current owner/developer indicated that there is additional territory inside the current development of 88 future homes for water/sewer service. For the projections, it was assumed that these 88 additional new homes (connections) would occur over the next seven years. The proposed initial rates were calculated at 80% buildout out in year six.

8. System Maps. Please provide water and wastewater system maps showing which lots have existing connections and which lots are vacant.

RESPONSE:

The requested system maps indicating the lots and existing connections are appended hereto as Composite Attachment "3".

PART II - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS REQUIRED

AUF response to FPSC Staff's request":

Request: "detail the basis used and/or documents relied upon for the annual wastewater growth projection through the year 2014".

Response: Is a recitation that "The wastewater growth projections are based on data received from the current utility owner, who is also the developer for the service area."

This adds no information and no elaboration that is responsive to FPSC Staff's request for additional information. The projection is predicated on economic conditions and data that is now several years old and needs to be updated to consider current economic conditions and Developer's minimum building activity for the past three years.

Examination of the "system maps" further demonstrates that the projection is flawed, in that it is highly improbable if not impossible "that these 88 additional new homes (connections) would occur over the next seven years". None of these "88" additional homes have occurred, and the projection is now into its third year.

Examination of the individual parcels brings to light the high improbability that these 88 additional homes will ever be added to the system.

Parcel identified on Lake County Property Appraiser map under Alternate Key 3388674: This parcel is partially paved for boater's vehicles using the adjacent boat ramp. The west side of this parcel is contiguous to the waste water ponds of the waste water utility, and on the east side by a marina and marsh land subject to environmental concerns.

Further this parcel is at a substantially lower elevation as to the treatment plant. Existing residential dwellings at this elevation are not connected to the treatment plant.

To conclude that residential development would be in high or any demand at this location is beyond unrealistic unbridled optimism.

Parcel identified on Lake County Property Appraiser map under Alternate Key 3388691: This parcel is a narrow strip of land which is a berm running at the rear of the houses on the westerly side of Bayview Ave., fronting and contiguous to Griffin View Road. There is not a remote possibility that this parcel could be developed for residential connections.

Parcel identified on Lake County Property Appraiser map under Alternate Key 3388682: This parcel is zoned as "non agricultural" and is platted as commercial. FPSC Staff is left to speculate as to the Utility's calculation of "residential units" pertaining to this parcel!

A question to be answered is: Has the Utility included in its projection an equivalent number of ERC's based on commercial connections?

If such a calculation is included in the projection, then it is contrary to Developer's opinion that this is not possible and not part of Developer's plans.

Developer has stated in sworn testimony in response to his attorney's questions as to this parcel:

reference: In the Circuit Court of the Fifth Judicial Circuit, in and for Lake County, Florida, Case No: 2010 CA 001095 (pages 110, 111 of transcript)

- "... By Mr. Smith:
- Q. Just to be clear, looking at the governing, the definition of commercial property you alluded to that earlier can you tell me, Mr. Rich, in Harbor Hills, is there any property at all out there that's intended and designed to accommodate retail commercial enterprises at this point? A. Definitely not.
- Q. Has there ever been, to your knowledge? A. Definitely not.
- Q. Now there is some property, 3.2 acres, that may be - that may be zoned commercial. If that ever is intended and designed to accommodate retail spaces, would it then fit the definition as you understand it?
- A. If it was designed. But I would have to leave the state if we did that because this would be commercial property right across the street from somebody's house and that would never be permitted.
- Q. Are there any is there electricity to accommodate retail commercial enterprises? A. No, sir. No, sir,
- Q. Is there water to - A. No, sir.
- Q. to accommodate -
- A. There's just the one water main that runs all along Harbor Hills Boulevard and it doesn't even have an any connections to go through it to the property."

The remaining parcels identified on in AUF response are fully developed and with the exception of one unimproved lot, there is no opportunity for additional residential connections.

PART III - CONSEQUENCES OF FLAWED PROJECTIONS

Absence of corrected and updated projections would deny the FPSC the opportunity to make the most informed and just decision for all parties concerned.

Projections that are flawed and unrealistic would cause the projected waste water costs to consumers to be grossly understated.

When actual residential connections are determined, AUF will seek extraordinary increases to accommodate the actual per customer costs.

PART IV - NECESSARY ACTION

The undersigned respectfully request and urge FPSC Staff to continue an aggressive pursuit of answers to the questions raised in their above cited deficiency notice.







- -The notice which was provided to us was inaccurate and unclear.





It is right to expect price increases however the 200%-300% increases some other Aqua purchased communities have experienced is simply excessive and not right.

The thing that bothers me and many of our residents is that while this transfer has been in the works for over two years, our developer did not relate this to us until this last January. He did have the courtesy to discuss this issue with us or give us the time to find an alternative purchaser or allow us the opportunity to put together a coop for the purpose of running this utility.

We need your help. One of the primary responsibilities of the Florida Public Service Commission is to protect us the consumers. While I can appreciate that it is hard to intercede with a private company transaction, I would suggest that this is what needs to happen here. Aqua needs to learn that it cannot run its business in such a shoddy fashion with such disregard for its existing clients and be successful in doing so. That is simply not the way it should work. The Commission needs to give them this message.



I am strongly opposed to the pending transfer of ownership of the Harbor Hills Utility to Aqua Utilities. The track record of this firm boarders on being criminal. Massive increases, poor service, questionable quality of the water are just a few items. It amazes me that rate increases are approved on a regular basis by the commission with no regard to the product and service delivered, I was under the impression that the commission was supposed to protect the consumer.

We have not even started with this firm and the initial correspondence with them seems to be lacking, either by design or ineptness. The initial letter, copy attached (attachment 1), was delivered in January 2011, it states that any objection must be filed within 30 days of the date identified in the letter. That date was January 7 2010. This of course made it impossible to respond in the allotted time frame. The next letter received on March 10 2011, copy attached (attachment 2), states that any objection must be filed with in 30 days of the date stated in the letter, that date is January 7 2011, once again it would be impossible to object in the time frame indicated as it has already passed prior to the receipt of the notice. Not withstanding all of the other problems associated with this transaction the application should be rejected until AUF presents it's notice to the consumers in a time frame that would allow objections to be made.

This community has suffered from lack of sales, this includes new homes as well as resale's. The developer started a new section just about 3 years ago, to date he has 3 homes sold and finished. Resale's have been just as bad if not worse. Our home values have dropped drastically

and if you need to sell you can expect a price that is in the range of 60% of the cost of your home. If this sale of the water system is approved, any possibility of selling your house will be severely compromised.

This is a retirement community and as such most residents are on a fixed income, if the anticipated increases in our water rates takes place it will be a burden on everyone. We have a large number of homes either in foreclosure or bank owned now, the result of this sale will only worsen this situation. The developer has stated that 100 or so homes are in arrears on payment of homeowners dues.

I am also concerned about the pending law suits between the Grove and Harbor Hills pertaining to the water that the developer cut off. Will this be settled prior to the sale?

If this sale is approved will the developer still be able to take water from lake Griffin for the golf course, and to sell to certain residential areas as he is doing now.?

I am also wondering what the status of the Harbor Hills Club House will be. It will be serviced by AUF, the anticipated price for that service will be rather high. I assume that we the consumer, would be advised, prior to the sale if an arrangement was made between Harbor Hills and AUF as it pertains to the developers charges for water and waste treatment? Are they required to divulge any type of arrangement?

In closing ,thank you for your attention to this mater. I hope that impact on the consumers involved in this matter is paramount in the decisions of your board. Aqua has a record that is counter productive to a community. I would hate to see this community go under due to the sale of this water utility.



As the owners of two homes in Harbor Hills, my husband and I wrote a letter to you on January 29, 2011 regarding the notice the Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, L.P. in Lake County Florida to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. and Amendment of AUF's Certificate No. 106W. Included in our initial letter were fourteen questions and concerns regarding AUF. Since that time most of our questions have been addressed and we are appalled at the record this company has, not only in Florida but in the other states where they provide water to the citizens. We understand the number of complaints about them that have been submitted to you totals more than all other complaints combined! Approval of the transfer certainly would not be in the public's interest.

We also would like you to consider that the initial proposed wastewater service documentation that was submitted by AUF was flawed and new documents had to be submitted. We question the accuracy of the information in the revised proposal and feel that the Notice that was provided to the Harbor Hills residents was inaccurate and unclear.

Although the planning for the sale took nearly two years, the residents were neither informed nor notified about it until January 2011. If we had been, we could have organized to make an offer to buy it ourselves. The Harbor Hills property owners had a meeting on March 22, 2011 regarding this issue. There were over 500 people in attendance to hear about AUF.

. We are requesting Commission members note our objections to the transfer of the certificate from a utility that has given the community good water and good service to a company that has a record of charging exorbitant rates for delivering poor quality water.

We ask the Public Service Commission to do a thorough investigation of the AUF's past and present operations in Florida before considering the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utility to them. We feel it will show that an approval will not be in the best interests of the public.

My husband and I own two houses in The Grove at Harbor Hills, and are concerned about the letter we received regarding the selling of Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua Utilities Florida.

On January 12, 2011 we received a letter from Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. stating that notice is given that an Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, L.P. in Lake County, Florida to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. and Amendment of AUF's Certificate No. 106W. This letter notes that any objections to the Application must be filed in writing with your office within 30 days of the notice. This is pursuant to Section 367.071, Florida Statutes. **The notice is dated January 7, 2010** We are very concerned that the letter was received a year after the date a reply is due.

We object not only to the lack of accurate detail in sending out such a notice, but to the lack of information from Harbor Hills Utility regarding this request.

We wonder if the fact that Harbor Hills Utilities is a Defendant in a counterclaim suit filed by The Grove at Harbor Hills will affect the proposed sale of the Utility?

The letter states "Aqua does not propose to change rates pursuant to this Application." Does this mean it cannot raise rates, and if that is the case, for what period of time?

Attached is an item that was on the local television station regarding the quality of water distributed by AUF and the ever increasing cost for providing it. We are concerned the same thing will occur in Harbor Hills. You can access the television news item by going to the website listed at the bottom of this attachment.

Our other concerns include:

- Does this transfer refer to potable as well as surface water from Lake Griffin,
- Is the transfer forcesidential services as well as commercial areas of Harbor Hills,

- What experience does AUF have with obtaining, distributing and charging for surface water from a lake
- What experience does AUF have with delivering, potable water to residences and businesses,
- Is AUF governed by the Public Service Commission, if so has it ruled on this transfer request,
- · How many complaints have been filed against AUF by its customers,
- How long has AUF been in business,
- What is the solvency status of AUF,
- What is the AUF's rating with the Better Business Bureaus of the areas it serves,
- How many cities and or towns do they serve,
- · How many golf communities do they serve,
- How many mobile home parks do they serve,
- Has Harbor Hills Utilities looked into alternate companies as potential purchasers,
- Has Harbor Hills looked into alternate solutions other than transferring its assets to another company

If AUF is so lackadaisical about making sure the first correspondence sent to potential customers is correct, by allowing it to be sent out with a date that is inaccurate by over one year, why should we trust it will be accurate and responsible about providing the water that is sent to our homes?



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

Dear Public Service Commission Commissioners:

My name is John Skoglund and I live at 6141 Landings Blvd., Lady Lake, in the Harbor Hills community in Lake County. I was informed by letter of the proposed transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. to Aqua Utilities Florida by the purchaser in January 2011 in a notice required by the Public Service Commission. I would become both a water and wastewater customer. I have spent numerous hours reading document filings, letters, the Annual Report of Aqua America, the parent company of Aqua Utilities of Florida, viewing the January 28th 2011 news report on WFLTV Channel 9, reading a position paper by Food & Water Watch about Aqua America, paying close attention to the section in the report about Aqua America's dealings in Florida, and the Public Service Commission's response to Aqua's requests. Lastly I have talked to people who have had loved ones who are customers and the dealings they have had with Aqua. After all the "data" collecting, I have come to the conclusion IT IS NOT IN THE PUBLIC'S BEST INTEREST TO TRANSFER THE PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES TO SUPPLY WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICES from Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. to Aqua Utilities Florida.

In reading Mr. May's supplied response to Public Service Commission statement, "....Staff identified certain deficiencies and requested additional information related to the water and wastewater applications in the referenced docket", I am concerned with some of the responses provided. What is troubling to me is that the sale of the Utility has purported to have been in negotiation on and off for approximately two years and yet the filing with the Public Service Commission for transfer of assets and operations seemed to be rushed and was incomplete.. When providing the requested additional information, Mr. May uses responses to some questions on deficiencies that something was "inadvertently" left in the agreement from a prior draft, something was "inadvertently" left out, or notices "inadvertently" contained a typographical error. Is this just another example of how the Purchaser's does business? I assume(maybe incorrectly) that Aqua Utilities Florida and Holland & Knight have either individually or together have submitted applications to the Public Service Commission before. I would have thought that a legal document such as this would not necessitate the number of additions an/or corrections that seem to be needed.

Secondly, I have read and reread with great interest the section on wastewater service and Mr. May's response. I believe the projections Mr. May offers are based on flawed data that leads to inaccurate

assumptions and ultimately inflated initial wastewater treatment rates requested. Assuming that the total of 55 wastewater customers is accurate, 54 are homeowners and one LARGE user is the Harbor Hill Country Club Clubhouse. If not that, then to use Mr. May's terminology, the Country Club Clubhouse was "inadvertently" left out as a significant discharge creator. Either way the Clubhouse is a large generator of wastewater. This is a facility that has two locker rooms complete with showers, toilets, whirlpools, etc. The clubhouse also has both a large food preparation area to serve large parties in two dining rooms on the main floor and also a smaller "grill" that serves various meal offerings twothree times a day on the lower floor along with the locker rooms and exterior bathrooms with showers for the swimming pool users. Restrooms are on both levels to be used by the general public and staff working in the Clubhouse. To my knowledge, neither the Clubhouse or any individual home has ever been metered to measure wastewater. If one wanted to arrive at a realistic figure to develop initial rates at the very minimum a meter should be placed on the Clubhouse for a prescribed period of time to develop realistic average monthly discharge amount. After arriving at that figure, it could be multiplied by 12 to arrive at the yearly amount that the Clubhouse contributed and then it should be subtracted from the total gallon figure that Mr. May refers to as totally homeowner usage(but really a combination of homeowner and clubhouse usage) to provide valid usage by the collective homeowners. It is THAT reduced, new homeowner figure, that then can be used in the rest of the calculations to establish "reached capacity" of the system and also provide the initial wastewater rate. It would also allow AUF to establish a reasonable rate for the Clubhouse based on its usage. Mr. May's existing proposal is flawed because it doesn't reflect the unequal discharge amounts between the average homeowner and the Clubhouse. The Sunrise II section which has the majority of the houses and condominiums, along with the ten condominium units originally built about the same time as the Clubhouse are located between the Clubhouse and the treatment facility. I believe the Sunrise II section(of which I'm a resident) was required to connect to the sewer system because a previous developer got a Federally backed loan to build this section. Our lots are smaller than the average lot in Harbor Hills and probably would not have the square footage to support a septic tank and drain field even with the smaller houses and condominiums that are present. Many of the houses and units in this section are occupied by seasonal residents and seasonal rental users who would not be generating the wastewater discharge in the amount projected by Mr. May's figures. This last additional information adds more credibility to the idea that the Clubhouse is a major contributor to that large discharge figure with which Mr. May begins his calculations. Using this "broad brush" calculation procedure would burden the homeowners with a higher per gallon charge of \$6.42 that is being proposed. Coupled with this projected overcharge, the biggest user, the Clubhouse owned and operated by the seller of the water utility, would benefit greatly(along with the purchaser, Aqua) with rates not proportionate to its greater usage. Even with these same rates for the Developer's Clubhouse as those of the homeowner, the Developer would still be paying less than he typically would on a "tiered" structure based on usage and the homeowners are "saddled" with inflated initial wastewater rates, subsidizing the Developer's business. It is also this inflated figure from which Aqua Utilities Florida would continue to request higher and higher rate increases in the future. Thirdly, I am unaware of any section in development or projected to be developed by 2014 close to the treatment facility or the general pattern of the existing piping infrastructure where a connection could be made that would support the new customer projections. There is a smaller section of vacant land at the north entrance to the Harbor Hills community that is contiguous to the existing wastewater piping system that could be used for future additions that Mr. May talks about. The reality is this parcel would not bring the Developer much profit because of the type of units he would build. He has much more desirable land in Harbor Hills available that would garner him more profit. It is my belief that this is one time where the provided "projections" are without merit and useless.

Commissioners, it is a well known fact by yourselves and the customers of Aqua Utilities Florida that

Aqua Utilities Florida has had numerous violations and complaints filed with the Commission. The Commission has in the past and continues to address the inadequate service being provided customers, and dealing with the poor, and many times totally unacceptable, water quality being provided by the Aqua Company. Many areas that Aqua Florida serve, people are trying to or have succeeded in severing their contract relationship with Aqua because of its inability to provide an acceptable product with reasonable service at an affordable cost. Unfortunately, far too many people were unaware of the practices Aqua engages in and now are unable to undo what has been done. This current request by Aqua is at a point where evidence clearly exists that the transfer of water and wastewater operating certificates to Aqua Utilities Florida from Harbor Hills Utilities L.P. SHOULD NOT TAKE PLACE. One more group of citizens should not be subjected to Aqua Utilities Florida and their business model. It is time to "close the door" on any further expansion of Aqua Utilities Florida in this State. Thank you in advance for your time and thoughtful consideration of my comments and concerns. I apologize for the length of this communication, but what I have shared needed to be said.



I am writing to you about an urgent matter concerning the citizens of Harbor Hills in Lady Lake, Subject Docket No.110019-WS - which involves the transfer sale of Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua Utilities Florida. We have not had the opportunity to challenge or have the option to negotiate with our current utilities to find a solution for new ownership with other area utilities. Aqua Utilities Florida has a history of rate increases with current customers throughout Florida and other parts of the country. Rate increases are two to three times higher and are detrimental to consumers some paying as much as \$400.00 a month for water and sewage, almost a third of a mortgage. 

As a resident of Harbor Hills, I am submitting my second objection to the Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, LP. to Aqua Utilities of Florida. I am very unclear as to what the enclosed document represents. It is undated. It is titled:

"Revised Notice of Application for Approval of Transfer and Application for Original Certificate for an Existing Wastewater System Requesting Initial Rates and Charges"

On the surface, one could interpret this document to cover both the water utility and the wastewater system. The rate schedule in the document appears to cover (in the first part) wastewater charges and (in the second part) potable water. The seller of Harbor Hills Utility, LP, Michael Rich, in an email to the community (copy enclosed) claims that Aqua has not "put in for a rate increase on Potable water". Either my reading of the document is wrong or Mr. Rich is wrong.

This needs immediate clarification because if my reading is correct Aqua intends to bill the users \$5.89 per thousand gallons of water. That amounts to an increase of \$4.66 per thousand gallons over our current rate of \$1.23 per thousand gallons. Using my water consumption from 2009 this rate increase would require me to pay \$1,574.99 for the same amount of water that I paid \$328.90 in 2009 – an increase of more than 370%!

The particulars of my objections are:

- 1. Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. has a horrible reputation in Florida and other states of buying small, well managed utilities and rapidly turning them into cash cows by increasing rates and reducing quality of service. The transfer of Harbor Hills Utilities water utility is clearly not in the public interest.
- 2. The Revised Notice is unclear as to what Aqua's intent is on potable water pricing.

The following comments are from my original objection to the transfer of Harbor Hills Utilities water certificate to Aqua Utilities Florida:

- The Original Notice said that Aqua doe not propose to change rates pursuant to the Application but it offered no comfort that Aqua will not make an application to raise rates immediately after the Application is approved. Research shows that Aqua rates in neighboring communities are 3 to 6 times as high as the current rates charged by Harbor Hills Utilities.
- The Grove at Harbor Hills has an account with Harbor Hills Utilities. The Grove has
 repeatedly asked Harbor Hills Utilities to send the invoice for consumption to its property
 manager to no avail. I want to be sure that Aqua Utilities has the capability to properly
 bill its consumers.
- 3. In May 2010 Harbor Hills Utilities trespassed on Grove property and destroyed irrigation lines, causing serious damage to landscape owned by The Grove. The Grove has filed a claim for damages to its landscape in the Lake County courts. Has HH Utilities disclosed this? Will Aqua assume responsibility for this damage! No responsibility is noted in the Application!
- 4. In a public meeting, Mr. Rich of Harbor Hills Utilities said that he will maintain control over surface water distribution within the Harbor Hills Community. Has there been any filing with the Commission to establish rates for this surface water from Lake Griffin? If not, that is the Commission's position on surface water rates?

Until answers are provided to the above issues, I believe the Commission would be derelict is approving the transfer of selected Harbor Hills Utilities operations to Aqua Utilities.

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

Ms. Cole:

As twelve-year residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, my wife and I recently received notification that the water (and wastewater) systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP are in the process of being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF).

We do not dispute the right of the developer to sell his property. However, we have sincere concerns about the great likelihood of this sale's negative impact on the quality of our water and current lifestyle. Therefore, we strongly oppose this transfer. We further understand that the consummation of this sale is contingent upon AUF receiving approval from the Florida Public Service Commission. Ms. Cole, it is often said, "past history is the best predictor of future behavior". With these words in mind, we offer a few of many, alleged allegations that have appeared within the public domain over the past few months:

- FlowFlorida.com reports that Aqua has been at the center of controversy in recent years over a series of rate increase requests. Residents have complained the rates are unjustified and unaffordable and have criticized Aqua's documented poor customer service record.
- March 21, 2011: U.S. Senator Bill Nelson, FL, jumped into the debate over Aqua Utilities' proposed rate increase for 117,000 Aqua Utilities customers that is pending before the Florida Public Service Commission. Nelson complained about the rate increase in a letter to PSC Chairman Art Graham. (Nelson's request is similar to a resolution approved last November by the Polk County Commission asking PSC members to delay or reduce the rate increase.)
- February 18, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "Dozens of Lake County residents are fighting
 to keep a controversial company out of their water supply. Aqua Utilities wants the state to
 approve its purchase of a company that served 700 people near Lady Lake."
- January 28, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "A troubled water company is causing more
 problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high,
 and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells."

- July 28, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, "This is one of the most unexplainable water bills WFTV has ever seen. A Mims woman uses so little water that her bills are usually only \$15 per month. Now, out of nowhere, her bill jumped to more than \$300, and she says she's not using any more water." [Customer], "says she can't drink the water from her faucet, she doesn't water her lawn, and she uses only paper plates."

 Aqua Utilities has faced problems in other areas, as well. WFTV covered numerous complaints about water quality in Chuluota in Seminole County. Last year, the state rated Chuluota's water system as unsatisfactory and, earlier this year, the state ordered Aqua Utilities to monitor water quality for the rest of the year at several other sites.
- August 2, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, CENTRAL FLORIDA -- Another customer told WFTV Monday that Aqua Utilities overcharged her hundreds of dollars. It's one of several complaints that have come in to WFTV. Except this time, her son-in-law installed a second water meter and now the two don't match up. WFTV confronted state regulators who are supposed to be tracking the accuracy of Aqua's meters. At 94 years old, [Customer] doesn't see too well, but the charges on her latest water bill from Aqua Utilities were hard to miss. "I thought it was a joke." She was charged \$560 for more than 30,000 gallons of water at her small duplex near Lake Placid. "Is there any way you used 30,000 gallons of water last month?" WFTV reporter Eric Rasmussen asked. "That would be impossible. I used the same amount as every month," she said.
- March 16, 2010, Tallahassee, Fla.—Kicking off a coordinated effort to improve water service for millions of Floridians, FLOW Florida, a coalition of community groups from 19 counties around the state, and the consumer advocacy group Food & Water Watch, spoke out against the private water provider Aqua Utilities Florida (Aqua). Standing before the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC), residents representing Aqua customers in Pasco, Polk, Seminole, Volusia and the other 15 counties where Aqua operates, spoke of the smelly, often undrinkable water, exorbitant rates, and unresolved customer issues suffered under the company's service.

Florida is not the only state showing alleged issues of concern:

According to reports, Aqua America, Aqua Utilities Florida's parent company, has also come under attack in recent years, with many of its other systems such as those in New York, Ohio, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Texas facing service problems similar to those in Florida. The city of Fort Wayne, Indiana—after experiencing yellow water and soaring bills, moved in 2009 to cancel its contract with Aqua America, and restore its water to public control.

August, 2010: United States Senator Charles E. Schume, called for the General
Accountability Office (GAO), the investigative arm of Congress, to examine Aqua America,
Inc.'s continued eligibility to receive federal funds, citing questionable business practices of
its New York subsidiary, Aqua New York, and a recent report by Food and Water Watch that
raised concerns about the company's aggressive strategy to raise consumer water rates.

Ms. Cole, as stated previously, we strongly oppose this transfer. The prior alleged critical issues along with others—demand that we, as concerned residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, not ignore this most important matter. Therefore, we request that the Florida Public Service Commission conduct a thorough investigation of the past and present operations of AUF in the State of Florida, prior to transferring the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP certificate to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc.

As the owners of two homes in Harbor Hills, my husband and I wrote a letter to you on January 29, 2011 regarding the notice the Application for Approval of Transfer of the Water System of Harbor Hills Utility, L.P. in Lake County Florida to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. and Amendment of AUF's Certificate No. 106W. Included in our initial letter were fourteen questions and concerns regarding AUF. Since that time most of our questions have been addressed and we are appalled at the record this company has, not only in Florida but in the other states where they provide water to the citizens. We understand the number of complaints about them that have been submitted to you totals more than all other complaints combined! Approval of the transfer certainly would not be in the public's interest.

We also would like you to consider that the initial proposed wastewater service documentation that was submitted by AUF was flawed and new documents had to be submitted. We question the accuracy of the information in the revised proposal and feel that the Notice that was provided to the Harbor Hills residents was inaccurate and unclear.

Although the planning for the sale took nearly two years, the residents were neither informed nor notified about it until January 2011. If we had been, we could have organized to make an offer to buy it ourselves. The Harbor Hills property owners had a meeting on March 22, 2011 regarding this issue. There were over 500 people in attendance to hear about AUF.

. We are requesting Commission members note our objections to the transfer of the certificate from a utility that has given the community good water and good service to a company that has a record of charging exorbitant rates for delivering poor quality water.

We ask the Public Service Commission to do a thorough investigation of the AUF's past and present operations in Florida before considering the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utility to them. We feel it will show that an approval will not be in the best interests of the public.



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

With regard to the above referenced docket, we, as customers of Harbor Hills Utilities (HHU) ask that Florida Public Services Commission take the following items into consideration prior to granting an approval of transfer of HHU to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc(AUFI):

- 1. Verifiable reports of the unsatisfactory reputation, performance and response to customers by AUFI bring into question their ability to operate a utility in a safe manner.
- 2. AUFI's practice of imposing a \$50 per month facility charge even when its customers don't use a drop of water is simply price gouging. Has anyone asked them to justify this charge? If its purpose is to make money to pay dividends, the Public Services Commission must protect the consumer, and ensure that the dividends are not being raised with the burden resting unreasonably on the back of the customers.
- 3. The Public Services Commission must take into consideration the fact that if the transfer of water certificate is approved, we become a captive consumer we have no choice. We can't simply go across town and buy from another vendor. We are trapped. Therefore we ask that the Public Services Commission carefully examine the qualifications and reputation of AUFI prior to approving this transfer.

At the very least, please consider a moratorium on the transfer of

the certificate until the quality of service, the investigation of the number and type of complaints, and the billing practices of AUFI have been fully researched.

You may question why these concerns are raised at such a late date. Although the sale has been in negotiations for about two years, we have just recently learned about them.

If the Florida Public Service Commission is correctly named, then it has an obligation to protect the Public. Transfer of this certificate to AUFI is a major act which will have major consequences for the Florida citizens of the Harbor Hills community. Please keep this foremost in your decision-making process.

I have been informed that the water and wastewater systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP are being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF). While these negotiations were underway for almost two years, many property owners in Harbor Hills were unaware of the proposed sale, and only learned of it recently through our Developer. AUF sent a letter to Harbor Hills property owners, which I received on March 11, summarizing the PSC notice. The letter itself was not dated nor was there any postmark on the mailing envelope, yet it stated that we had only 30 days from January 7, 2011 (date of notice) to provide our comments.

As one many property owner in Harbor Hills, I strongly object to this transfer for the following reasons:

- This transfer of the water systems to AUF is not in the public interest. We have a good water system and pay reasonable rates currently. Based on media reports that I have seen and read in the past month the reputation and business practices of AUF in other areas of Florida are highly questionable. Why would we want to have this entity take over our water system given these concerns over prospective rate increases and deterioration in quality service and product? The public interest will not be served if this transfer is approved.
- In the Harbor Hills Community, dozens of homes are currently on the market as a result of very slow sales, bank foreclosures, vacated properties, etc. Property values have plunged to around 50-60% of the original purchase prices of our homes due to the grave housing market which has hit Florida especially hard in recent years. The majority of homeowners in Harbor Hills are senior citizens and most of us will be faced with selling our homes in coming years due to increasing age, illness, loss of a spouse, etc. As difficult as it is to sell a home in Harbor Hills today, it will become much more difficult if owners have to deal with potentially exorbitant water rates and/or poor water services, which would certainly turn off prospective buyers.

I summary, from media information that I have seen in recent weeks, I believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable. Aqua has been singled out by Senator Schumer of New York for questionable business practices and most recently by our own Senator Nelson for Aqua's recently proposed rate increase. Additionally, as I understand it, AUF has been the subject of a significant number of customer complaints filed over the last several years. This in itself should bring

into question how they may intend to operate in Florida and should be a red flag to the PSC and other state agencies that would allow them to expand their operations and customer base in Florida.

I request that the Public Service Commission undertake a very thorough investigation on the past and present operations and business practices of AUF, prior to taking any action on the Certificate transfer from Harbor Hills Utilities to AUF. Again, I believe that such a transfer will not be in public interest and certainly not in the interest of the property owners in Harbor Hills.



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



While these negotiations were underway for the better part of nearly two years, Harbor Hills residents were unaware of this proposed sale, and only learned of it in recent weeks when other residents of Harbor Hills circulated a copy of the required PSC notice. Our Harbor Hills Homeowners Association, dominated by the Developer, did not inform us that Harbor Hills Utilities, LP was for sale OR provide any opportunity to the Harbor Hills residents to either purchase the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP or find alternative buyers.

Hills Utilities, LP are in the process of being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF).

Regardless of Florida's Sunshine Laws concerning matters of public interest, the plans and discussions to sell Harbor Hills Utilities, LP were conducted behind closed doors.

It is the right of every citizen of Lake County and Florida to be provided water that is uncontaminated by harmful chemicals, bacteria, virus, etc. according to Environmental Protection Agency standards at a reasonable cost that generally is on a nonprofit basis that includes the operation and maintenance of the water system and does NOT include inflated water rates of publically owned corporations to pay shareholder dividends and executive bonuses as rewards for inflated dividends and rising stock prices.

Water utilities are a unique public service provider. Unlike other utilities such as electric and telecommunications, we ingest water into our bodies. If water utility customer service is substandard, we, the customers, suffer poor health, illness, and perhaps even death. Water is

essential to survive and vital to our health. Water is essential to the quality of daily life in Harbor Hills. We oppose this transfer for the following specific reasons:

- The transfer of the water system to AUF is not in the public interest. We are aware of business interviews with AUF's parent company executives in which the takeover of water utilities in the southeast, including Florida, is defined as a lucrative "goldmine" business because of frequent drought conditions and the ease of influencing PSC's to allow significant water rate increases that ignore poor customer service records and far exceed the costs of providing uncontaminated water.
- Conservation of water is not a priority of public water utilities because of the shareholder demands to constantly increase revenues and lower costs. Lower costs equates to poor to nonexistent customer service (evidence is the record number of customer complaints). When customers conserve and reduce their water usage, increased revenues is achieved by raising rates. Conservation thus is punitive by raising water rates. Increased water rates and minimal customer service equates to increased profits to boost corporate financial performance, shareholder dividends and executive bonuses. Thus customers, babies and children included, drink inferior, dangerous water and pay outrageous water rates. This is not in the public interest.
- We question whether the proposed wastewater service documentation is accurate. In Harbor Hills only about 60 residents and the country club clubhouse are connected to the wastewater system. ALL other Harbor Hills residents have septic systems and are NOT connected to the wastewater system. It is essential that conditions defined in the certificates of the wastewater facility and the potable water utility specifically and clearly state that potable water rates will NOT subsidize the wastewater facility.
- The Notice which was provided to the residents was untimely, inaccurate and unclear. The Harbor Hills residents have NOT been given any opportunity to find alternative ways to acquire Harbor Hills Utilities, LP from the Developer.
- We believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable based on the facts of experience in Florida. We request that the Public Service Commission do a thorough investigation on past and present operations in the State of Florida, prior to transferring the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP certificate to them.
- We believe that the Public Service Commission should provide an opportunity for Harbor Hills residents to make alternative proposals to acquire the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP.

We are writing to urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to deny AQUA Utilities Florida, Inc.'s application for a transfer of the waste-water certificate from Harbor Hills Utilities pursuant to Docket No. 110019-WS, as it is not in the best interest of the public and, in particular, your constituents. Despite AQUA's assertions in its application, "The proposed acquisition would place the water and wastewater operations of the Harbor Hills water and wastewater system in the hands of an experienced company and industry leader whose sole focus in the provision of high quality water and wastewater service at reasonable prices." AQUA's track record is contrary to this. The horror stories of ever-increasing, excessive rates, billing nightmares, poor water quality, and inadequate service, abound throughout AQUA's service areas to include Florida. Chuluota, Seminole County is experiencing, on average, 3 times the cost for water and sewage that nearby Oviedo is paying. Seminole County is working to purchase back the system from AQUA, but has not agreed to a valuation as yet. AQUA is saying that the value is about 4 times the valuation specified by Seminole County. The residents of Harbor Hills do not want to be faced with this situation. Additionally, AQUA is responsible for the great majority of complaints to the PSC by consumers, and they have also been fined for their billing problems. The undersigned received an undated "Revised Notice..." yesterday and as an aggrieved future customer objects with particularity to the following matters relating to this notice and application:

- I. The proposed wastewater rates set forth do substantially exceed those charged currently by Harbor Hills Utilities and are without a rational basis, and are supported by neither clear and convincing evidence nor a preponderance of evidence, whichever is applicable.
- II. The proposed wastewater rates on their face totally ignore, and fail to advise the Commission, that the largest and dominant user of the wastewater system is a forprofit, commercial enterprise, viz., 1. clubhouse, 2. swimming pool complex, 3. locker rooms and spas, 4. restaurants, 5. golf operations, and 6. tennis facilities owned by Harbor Hills Country Club. The application should be tabled and deferred until and unless the applicant makes clear and details its proposed commercial wastewater rates and the methodology and justification for computing them, and the methodology for measuring usage by this dominant commercial customer at each of its aforementioned sites and facilities.
- III. To apply the same wastewater base rate and also the proposed gallonage cap of 6,000 gallons to the Harbor Hills Country Club commercial enterprise as would be applied to a single residential home is arbitrary, capricious, irrational, unfair, and contrary to law and the public interest.

- IV. The Revised Notice does not indicate if the proposed water rates are monthly or bi-monthly as is currently the case with Harbor Hills Utilities.
- V. The "General Service" section appears to relate to water rates but does not say so. Assuming that it does, the proposed rates are subject to the same objections set out in I. above.
- VI. The application relating to water rates should be tabled and deferred until and unless the applicant makes clear and details its proposed commercial water rates and the methodology and justification for computing them, and the methodology for measuring usage by Harbor Hills Country Club at each of its aforementioned commercial sites and facilities.





Dear Florida Public Service Commission.

We have been advised that the water (and wastewater) systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP is being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF). While these negotiations were underway for the better part of nearly two years, we were unaware of this proposed sale, and only learned of it in January 2011 through a required PSC notice. This caused considerable confusion within our community with respect to what was happening, and what the effects may be. Because water is vital to our health and vital to our quality of life here in Harbor Hills, we oppose this transfer of our current water system to AUF and believe that the transfer is not in the public's best interest based on the following:

- 1) Current and historical information provided to our community highlighted numerous complaints filed annually, as well as over a number of years, regarding AUF services.
- 2) Numerous locally aired TV news reports have highlighted customers complaining about AUF and of their poor water quality, poor customer service, extremely high costs and rate increases.
- 3) If the transfer to AUF occurs, we believe there is a high potential of a negative effect on home sales and it will impact the numerous fixed income households within our community which is already experiencing foreclosures and delinquent association dues during this struggling economy.
- 4) Calculations reflect my personal water bill will increase by a (minimum) factor of 4 (four) through AUF, as compared to our current rates.
- 5) We believe the reputation and performance record of AUF is highly questionable not only in Florida, but in other States, such as Ohio.
- 6) We believe the notice which was provided to the residents was unclear.

Prior to the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP to AUF, we request that the Public Service Commission do a thorough investigation of AUF's past and present operations in the State of Florida with respect to water quality, customer complaints, water and wastewater rates, and whether corrective action(s) have taken place (or a lack of action) by AUF to correct those issues. If the results of the investigation support our concerns, we ask that the PSC please act on behalf of our community's best interests and deny the transfer of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP certificate(s) to AUF.



The undersigned objects with particularity and submits the following issues relating to the above noted application and requests that the following issues, and the issues the undersigned has previously filed with the Commission, be set for a contested evidentiary hearing before an administrative law judge or appropriate hearing officer or other procedure provided by Florida administrative laws and/or the procedures applying to the Commission, and venued in Lake County, Florida where the bulk of witnesses reside, where the utility in question is located, and where the applicant and both transferor and transferee do business.

The current proposal to change the water and wastewater scheme from an underlying nonprofit ownership structure to a direct profit -maximizing ownership structure is not in the public interest of the community of Harbor Hills or the State of Florida.

On information and belief, the 100% owner of the entire ownership interest in Harbor Hills Utility, is a non-profit corporation, and probably a 501 [c] [3] corporation, namely Yale University of New Haven, Connecticut.

It is not in the public interest to permit the transfer of this utitlity certificate to Aqua which is a profit corporation and has different purposes.

The differences are similar, or identical, to the public benefits and policy reasons arising from and attending to the salient example of the non-profit ownership of the St. Petersburg Times newspaper as set forth in the article "The History and Importance of Nonprofit Ownership", [see w.w.w. Poynter.org], which is enclosed herewith and incorporated in this objection in its entirety. For the reasons both identical and similar to those set forth in this article, it is not in the public interest and not in the interest of homeowners of Harbor Hills to permit the transfer of the utility certificate of the underlying current non-profit ownership of the utility in Yale University to the future profit-seeking ownership of the proposed transferee, Aqua.

The History and Importance of Nonprofit Ownership

News media executives search for new economic models for media success. Normally that means building audiences for broadcast, print, and online news, but the search also takes another path. It also means ensuring survival of independent news organizations. In this case, the answers for future success might be found in models from the past. There are unusual ownership arrangements, experiments that failed, family efforts that faltered, and some ventures that survive.

In search of strong news media, owners created schools, developed community foundations, set up employee ownerships, and devised trusts as means of keeping news organizations independent and locally focused. These non-traditional approaches are found in various geographical regions, in a range of organization sizes, and among ideological opposites. Some are recent efforts that aren't fully formed. Others have lasted for decades.

The best arrangements value community responsibility, commitment to local ownership, and a passion for quality journalism. Several names emerge as leaders in preserving non-profit ownerships. Newspaper leaders include Theodore Bodenwein of the New London (Conn.) Day, Nelson Poynter of the St. Petersburg (Fla.) Times; William and Nackey Loeb of the Manchester (N.H.) Union Leader, and more recently, Brandy Ayers of the Anniston (Ala.) Star, and George McLean of the Tupelo Northeast Mississippi Daily Journal.

This study addresses the first of five proposals set forth by the Breaux Symposium at Louisiana State University. The proposal is: More media outlets should be operated by nonprofits and public policies should encourage and support this type of media ownership. The study looks at the organizations named and others that model non-profit ownership. It examines the individual organization's history, form of ownership, the intent of the owner, and challenges to the form of ownership. Using this analysis, the study also addresses four sets of questions raised: Is the method feasible, operable, desirable, and measurable? ...

In this excerpt, we will look at only one model, the case of the St. Petersburg Times.

The St. Petersburg Times

In 1938, in St. Petersburg, Fla., Nelson Poynter became general manager of his father's newspaper, the *St. Petersburg Times*. Poynter took the role after his father, mother, and sister agreed that Nelson would have the right to buy all of his father's stock.

The Poynters were from Indiana and the father, Paul Poynter, bought 10 newspapers during his life. 1 He bought the *Times* in 1912.

Nelson was a graduate of Indiana University, where he edited the student newspaper when Ernie Pyle was one of the writers. Poynter earned an economics degree from Yale University at age 23, and then went to Florida to help his father, who was in financial trouble with the *Times*. Nelson dealt with the problems and moved to buy his father's stock in the newspaper, over time, for \$100 per share.

In 1939, Poynter became editor of the newspaper. In 1947, he bought most of the stock, and became owner of the newspaper.

At that point he issued his "Standards of Ownership," that became the significant document for the owner and his newspaper. In it he valued community service, modern equipment, an above-average staff, and steps to eliminate debt and reward employees. The first provision in the standards is the one most associated with him. He wrote:

Ownership or participation in ownership of a publication or broadcast property is a sacred trust and a great privilege.2

During three decades of ownership of the *Times*, Poynter led the nation in using color graphics and photos; in strengthening the news report and winning journalism awards, including the Pulitzer Prize; in raising a strong voice in the community, although his was generally more liberal than the community's.

In 1945, he and his second wife, Henrietta, founded Congressional Quarterly, and Poynter made trips to Washington. He became better known nationally and raised the reputation of the St. Petersburg Times.

In 1978, he died of a cerebral hemorrhage shortly after taking part in the groundbreaking for the new campus of the University of South Florida, St. Petersburg. He had fought to bring the campus to his city. Upon his death, *The Times of London* described him as a man who had built "a remarkable newspaper in an unremarkable city." 3

During his whole tenure of leadership at the *Times*, Nelson Poynter was at odds with his sister over ownership of the newspaper. Eleanor Poynter Jamison ran the family's newspaper in Sullivan, Indiana, but she felt her brother was depriving her of her inheritance at the *Times*.

Two months after purchasing the newspaper, to pacify his mother, Nelson Poynter sold his sister's 40 percent of the *Times* common voting stock. The sale included a provision for him to buy back the stock at a "fair price." 4 It was a small move that had huge consequences during his life and after Poynter's death.

Poynter was adamant about not sharing ownership with family or leaving the newspaper as a family inheritance. According to his biographer, Poynter told his lawyer, "I've never met my great-grandchildren, and I might not like them."

He sought to leave his newspaper to one successor as chief executive rather than a group. By the 1950s, he considered leaving the company to a foundation. In 1969, the political climate turned against foundations and limited the percent a foundation could own of a profit-making enterprise.5

Poynter settled on creating a school. It would improve the state of journalism and preserve the independence of the *St. Petersburg Times*. He named the school the Modern Media Institute. In 1984, Trustees changed the name to The Poynter Institute.

Nelson had tried to buy back the stock he had sold to Eleanor. His successor, Gene Patterson, made the return of the stock a top priority, but didn't come to terms with Eleanor or with her daughters after her death in 1987.

In 1988, two weeks before Patterson turned over leadership of the *Times* to <u>Andrew Barnes</u>, a Texas entrepreneur called to let the *Times* leaders know that he had bought the stock of the late Eleanor Poynter Jameson from her two daughters.

There followed a two-year battle in which leaders of the *Times* and The Poynter Institute took on Robert Bass and his group, called Poynter-Jamison Ventures Limited.

By this time, the *Times* was a circulation leader in Florida, it was in a growing market, and was often regarded as one of the top newspapers in the nation. It was a prime target for purchase or corporate take-over. The Poynter Institute had developed a reputation for outstanding mid-career development programs for journalists. The battle over stock drew national attention. It focused attention on Nelson Poynter's arrangement that left a well-regarded, but small, journalism school as owner of a prosperous newspaper. When a settlement was reached, the Institute still owned the *Times*.

Andy Barnes wrote a column in December 1999 explaining the situation to readers. Here are excerpts:

As I wound up the year's work a few days ago, I signed a very big check, \$22.5 million. It was profit this newspaper publishing company has earned and set aside over the past few years, and it went to our owner, The Poynter Institute.

• It was a pleasure to send the check off. A debt created nearly 10 years ago is paid. I've never burned a mortgage, but it must feel the same. Ownership is secure. It's time to turn to new challenges.

But we also savor the moment, and mark the importance of this newspaper's highly unusual ownership.

Nelson Poynter, a Hoosier who came to love St. Petersburg, owned the majority of the *St. Petersburg Times*, having bought it from his father, Paul Poynter. He created The Poynter Institute, which is a school for journalists now located on Third Street South in St. Petersburg.

The Institute had two purposes: to teach journalists, young and old, and to keep his newspaper independent and free to serve its communities. Newspaper publishing, he wrote, is a sacred trust and must always be carried out in the public's interest. Ownership by a distant corporation would make that impossible.

The problem was, he didn't own all of the stock. His sister, Eleanor Poynter Jamison, owned 200 shares. Poynter tried repeatedly to buy the shares. His successor, Eugene Patterson, tried to buy the shares from Mrs. Jamison, and after her death, from her daughters. They failed to do so.

Just as I came into this job in late 1988, we learned the stock was in the hands of a Texas financier named Robert M. Bass. He wanted somehow to parlay his stake into ownership of the whole paper and have us send him more money in the meantime.

Those of us running the paper fought back. Our loyalty was to the newspaper and its communities, and to the school, not to a financier's greater wealth. After two of the most challenging years of my life, a deal was struck that included the debt to Poynter, which was \$30-million until we paid \$7.5-million earlier this year. Now the debt is paid. The Poynter Institute owns all the stock. That stage is done.

The setup boils down to this: a profit-making, tax-paying publishing company owns the St. Petersburg Times and several magazines: Florida Trend, Congressional Quarterly, and Governing. The company's earnings after taxes go to build the business and support The Poynter Institute.

That's not how it works at most newspapers. Corporate owners in distant cities all too often lack familiarity with local people and issues. They may not even know newspapers very well. As a result, the only thing that counts to the owners is dollars, and readers suffer.

Some of the differences:

If our owner demanded profits be twice as high as they are, it would inevitably cut into our ability to hire enough people and buy enough newsprint to really tell you what is going on in our communities. We run a nicely profitable business so we can be an excellent newspaper; all too many companies print newspapers so they can make a lot of money.

The price of our paper is low. We keep it that way so all citizens can be

informed, not just the well-to-do. We believe our democracy depends on informed citizens.

Having a publishing company owned by a school raises questions of who's in charge. Poynter set it up so one person would have the command, not a committee, because he believed a committee might not make the necessary tough decisions. As CEO, I also vote the stock on behalf of The Poynter Institute. I was picked by Patterson, my predecessor, and in turn have named Paul Tash as my deputy and successor when the time comes.

I believe he would have smiled to see that the check with which we paid the \$22.5-million debt was imprinted "Barnett Bank," though the funds will actually come from the successor NationsBank, which is actually now Bank of America.

Banks have come and gone. His newspaper, and the school he created to own it, remain. Our commitment to serving the readers of Tampa Bay's communities remains undimmed.



We know that the PSC is a diligent group who work hard for the citizens of Florida. We trust that you will take notice of the information below.

The undersigned officers and directors of the Property Owners of Harbor Hills, representing over 500 residents, object to the Certificate of Transfer from Harbor Hills Utilities to Aqua Florida for the following reasons.

- 1. We do not believe that Harbor Hills Utilities and its owner Yale University Foundation (owner of all entities in the community of Harbor Hills and a non-profit organization) can soundly and in the best interests of the public sell a portion of their total structure to a direct profit maximizing ownership.
- 2. The transfer indeed is certainly not in the best of public interest.
- 3. There have never been charges for wastewater in the sections of Harbor Hills that are connected to the sewerage system as per the home purchase agreements. Charging for this will suddenly ensure a hardship on many households and perhaps be illegal.
- 4. The proposed waste water rates seem to totally ignore, and fail to advise the Commission, that the largest and dominant user of the wastewater system is a for-profit, commercial enterprise owned by Harbor Hills Country Club. The application should be tabled and deferred until the applicant details its

proposed commercial wastewater rates and the methodology and justification for computing them.

- 5. Aqua Florida has a substantially poor track record throughout the state and nation because of inadequate service and perpetually increasing rates. Just note their complaint record, which should be in your files.
- 6. Aqua Florida has a history of seeking and getting unsubstantiated rate increases purportedly to expand and enhance their product and service without doing it.
- 7. Aqua Florida has a record of not providing excellent water quality to their clients. This can become a major health issue, thus our concern.

We hereby request the PSC to do a thorough investigation on past and present operations of Aqua Florida in the State of Florida prior to transferring the Harbor Hills Utilities certificate to them.



We are writing to urge the Public Service Commission (PSC) to deny AQUA Utilities Florida, Inc.'s application for a transfer of the waste-water certificate from Harbor Hills Utilities pursuant to Docket No. 110019-WS, as it is not in the best interest of the public and, in particular, your constituents. Despite AQUA's assertions in its application, "The proposed acquisition would place the water and wastewater operations of the Harbor Hills water and wastewater system in the hands of an experienced company and industry leader whose sole focus in the provision of high quality water and wastewater service at reasonable prices." AQUA's track record is contrary to this. The horror stories of ever-increasing, excessive rates, billing nightmares, poor water quality, and inadequate service, abound throughout AQUA's service areas to include Florida. Chuluota, Seminole County is experiencing, on average, 3 times the cost for water and sewage that nearby Oviedo is paying. Seminole County is working to purchase back the system from AQUA, but has not agreed to a valuation as yet. AQUA is saying that the value is about 4 times the valuation specified by Seminole County. The residents of Harbor Hills do not want to be faced with this situation. Additionally, AQUA is responsible for the great majority of complaints to the PSC by consumers, and they have also been fined for their billing problems. I am an interested party. Contrary to public statement made by Aqua Utilities that water charges will not increase, docket submissions by Aqua Utilities show that water charges will increase. Details and docket citations follow:

Harbor Hills Utilities bills bi-monthly. My last water bill from Harbor Hills Utilities was \$36.74 (water base \$17.17 plus water usage \$19.57). That bill shows that the water base rate for the two month period is \$17.17.

Page 78 of document 00205-11.pdf in docket 110018 is an Aqua Utilities document showing:

"RATE SCHEDULE: HARBOR HILLS RESIDENTIAL SERVICE (RS)

BILLING PERIOD: Monthly

RATE: Base Facility Charge \$17.17"

Simple math (\$17.17 times six versus \$17.17 times twelve) means that the moment Aqua Utilities takes over my yearly cost of water will increase by \$103.02.

This is a direct contradiction of the Aqua Utilities statement:

"Aqua does not propose to change rates pursuant to this application". Please refer to Page 14 of document 00514-11.pdf for the source of this quote.





Ms. Cole:

As residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, my wife and I recently received notification that the water (and wastewater) systems of the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP are in the process of being sold to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc (AUF).

We do not dispute the right of the developer to sell his property. However, we have sincere concerns about the great likelihood of this sale's negative impact on the quality of our water and current lifestyle. Therefore, we strongly oppose this transfer. We further understand that the consummation of this sale is contingent upon AUF receiving approval from the Florida Public Service Commission. Ms. Cole, it is often said, "past history is the best predictor of future behavior". With this in mind, we offer a few of many, alleged allegations that have appeared within the public domain over the past few months:

- X FlowFlorida.com reports that Aqua has been at the center of controversy in recent years over a series of rate increase requests. Residents have complained the rates are unjustified and unaffordable and have criticized Aqua's documented poor customer service record.
- X March 21, 2011: U.S. Senator Bill Nelson, FL, jumped into the debate over Aqua Utilities' proposed rate increase for 117,000 Aqua Utilities customers that is pending before the Florida Public Service Commission. Nelson complained about the rate increase in a letter to PSC Chairman Art Graham. (Nelson's request is similar to a resolution approved last November by the Polk County Commission asking PSC members to delay or reduce the rate increase.)
- X February 18, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "Dozens of Lake County residents are fighting to keep a controversial company out of their water supply. Aqua Utilities wants the state to approve its purchase of a company that served 700 people near Lady Lake."

- X January 28, 2011: WFTV (CH 9) reported, "A troubled water company is causing more problems Friday. Some homeowners in Lake County told WFTV that their bills are so high, and their water is so dirty, that they're digging their own wells."
- X July 28, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, "This is one of the most unexplainable water bills WFTV has ever seen. A Mims woman uses so little water that her bills are usually only \$15 per month. Now, out of nowhere, her bill jumped to more than \$300, and she says she's not using any more water." [Customer], "says she can't drink the water from her faucet, she doesn't water her lawn, and she uses only paper plates."

 Aqua Utilities has faced problems in other areas, as well. WFTV covered numerous complaints about water quality in Chuluota in Seminole County. Last year, the state rated Chuluota's water system as unsatisfactory and, earlier this year, the state ordered Aqua Utilities to monitor water quality for the rest of the year at several other sites.
- X August 2, 2010, WFTV (CH 9) reported, CENTRAL FLORIDA -- Another customer told WFTV Monday that Aqua Utilities overcharged her hundreds of dollars. It's one of several complaints that have come in to WFTV. Except this time, her son-in-law installed a second water meter and now the two don't match up. WFTV confronted state regulators who are supposed to be tracking the accuracy of Aqua's meters. At 94 years old, [Customer] doesn't see too well, but the charges on her latest water bill from Aqua Utilities were hard to miss.

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- X March 16, 2010, Tallahassee, Fla.—Kicking off a coordinated effort to improve water service for millions of Floridians, FLOW Florida, a coalition of community groups from 19 counties around the state, and the consumer advocacy group Food & Water Watch, spoke out against the private water provider Aqua Utilities Florida (Aqua). Standing before the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC), residents representing Aqua customers in Pasco, Polk, Seminole, Volusia and the other 15 counties where Aqua operates, spoke of the smelly, often undrinkable water, exorbitant rates, and unresolved customer issues suffered under the company's service.

Florida is not the only state showing alleged issues of concern:

According to reports, Aqua America, Aqua Utilities Florida's parent company, has also come under attack in recent years, with many of its other systems such as those in New York, Ohio, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Texas facing service problems similar to those in Florida. The city of Fort Wayne, Indiana—after experiencing yellow

water and soaring bills, moved in 2009 to cancel its contract with Aqua America, and restore its water to public control.

X August, 2010: United States Senator Charles E. Schume, called for the General Accountability Office (GAO), the investigative arm of Congress, to examine Aqua America, Inc.'s continued eligibility to receive federal funds, citing questionable business practices of its New York subsidiary, Aqua New York, and a recent report by Food and Water Watch that raised concerns about the company's aggressive strategy to raise consumer water rates.

Ms. Cole, as stated previously, we strongly oppose this transfer. The prior alleged critical issues along with others—demand that we, as concerned residents of Harbor Hills, Lake County, not ignore this most important matter. Therefore, we request that the Florida Public Service Commission conduct a thorough investigation of the past and present operations of AUF in the State of Florida, prior to transferring the Harbor Hills Utilities, LP certificate to Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc.





- 3. Objection is made to the failure to identify which specific legal entity will supply irrigation water to Bella Vista, Phase 6 and Phase 7.
- 4. Objection is made to the retention of a partial Certificate in Harbor Hills Utility entity without a tariff for Bella Vista surface water for irrigation. Query whether it will provide lake water under its retained golf course CUP or through CUP #729. In either even, if the plan contemplated by the Agua Applications is to provide free irrigation water to Bella Vista, but not all Harbor Hills residents, objection is made to that. Currently "the Blue Tops" get lake water for irrigation but are charged for it. The proposal for Phase 6 and Phase 7 appears to provide lake water for irrigation free, thereby presumably enhancing the developer's sale of lots. The Grove neighborhood of 99 homes gets lake water for irrigation free. Meanwhile the Harbor Hills Homeowner's Association common areas and Phases 1-5 (500 homes approximately), pay potable water rates for irrigation at considerable cash cost to them for water and significant negative impact on their market value compared to Bella Vista; and the developer's golf course and perhaps its other owned areas get free lake water for irrigation. What the plans are for the developer's undeveloped hundreds of acres is not detailed in the Applications and permits. The applicant should be required to provide historical irrigation volume and rate data and projected irrigation volume and rate data for all of these locations classified by source and quality of water proposed.
- 5. Objection is made to failure to establish that the proposed water scheme will comply with the water scheme originally approved in the Harbor Hills Planned Unit Development ordinance, which contemplated one single, unified system with equality of service and rates for all.
- 6. Objection is made to the failure to provide system maps relating to each and every location here involved, including current home sites, future home sites, current commercial sites, future commercial sites, current recreational sites, future recreational sites, and all other lands owned by all of the Harbor Hills entities of each and every legal form, as the case may be, developer showing the ownership of each site and location, and outlining the types of water to be provided, by whom, at what charge, so that more specific objections may be made. Request is made to keep the time for objections open until 30 days following notice of filing of such maps.
- 7. Objection is made to the failure to supply the water conservation rate structure which was due 3/31/2011.
- 8. Objection is made to the failure to indicate the extent to which reclaimed water is available to Phase 6 and Phase 7.
- 9. Objection is made to the failure to provide the annual tabulated water usage data for 2009.

- 10. Objection is made to the failure of Permit 279 to state with clarity which functions it is proposed Harbor Hills Utility will perform and which functions Aqua Utility will perform under the proposal.
- 11. Objection is made that the proposal, the permits, the contract between the parties, and the Applications do not provide for a single, unified system of irrigation water service and rates for the entire Harbor Hills development, now and in the future.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

II. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE PROPOSED CUSTOMER DEPOSIT TARIFF- ATTACHMENT 3.

- 1. Objection is made that the proposed tariff fails to distinguish between credit worthy versus the not credit worthy.
- 2. Objection is made that the proposed tariff fails to state who bears the costs for homes in foreclosure.
- 3. Objection is made that the proposed tariff fails to state the details of late fees, interest payments, notice of cut offs, cut-off procedures, and other aspects relating to delinquent accounts.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

III. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE PROPOSED BILLING CYCLE AND FACILITY CHARGE- COUNSEL'S LETTER AT PARA. 7, P. 4.

1. Objection is made to the proposal to charge a facility charge each month. The current facility charge is billed bi-monthly. To make the this a monthly fee unlawfully raises potable water rates to all Harbor Hills residents without a rate application and a rate hearing.

For the foregoing reason approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

IV. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE SECOND NOTICE

RECEIVED BY THIS PARTY ON MARCH 11, 2011-ATTACHMENT 6.

- 1. Objection is made to the lack of clarity of this notice relative to rates and charges. Are there 2 charges, 3 charges, or 4 charges, viz., Base Facility Charge, Gallonage Charge, General Service Charge, second Gallonage Charge. As a result of this lack of clarity, the entire matter should be re-noticed one more time before any additional action or procedure is taken in this matter.
- 2. Objection is made to a Base Facility Charge and a General Service Charge on a monthly basis, if these refer to potable water, as appearing to be unlawful rate increases as noted above.
- 3. Objection is made in its entirety to this notice if it relates in any form to potable water.
- 4. Objection is made to the failure to state commercial rates.
- 5. Objection is made to the failure to require commercial users to pay the entire cost relating to the difference between average minimum demand and average maximum demand, since the need to have and maintain a wastewater facility to accommodate the difference is due solely to the varying needs and volatility of demand of the commercial users, not the residential users.
- 6. Objection is made to the failure to calculate maximum commercial demand, the facilities related to service it, and the proper allocation of rates to accommodate same...

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

V. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND COUNSEL'S RESPONSE TO STAFF-NOTED DEFICIENCY #10.

1. Objection is made to the recital that all wastewater customers will be residential. See my letter of 3/12/2011.

For the foregoing reason approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

VI. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND COUNSEL'S RESPONSE TO STAFF-NOTED DEFICIENCY #11.

1. Objection is made to the apparent omission of all of the Harbor Hills commercial

entities from the calculations of customers, gallons, proposed wastewater rates, averages, projections, ERCs, build-outs, gallonage charges, and all other calculations.

- 2. Objection is made to the failure to state volumes of historical potable water usage at each of the commercial sites generally and separately.
- 3. Objection is made to the failure to state historical wastewater volumes of usage at each of the commercial sites generally and separately.
- 4. Objection is made to projections which omit the commercial entities now and into the future generally and separately.
- 5. Objection is made to the ERC calculation and assumptions and data underlying the calculations, to the extent counsel's response has overlooked them in his response and to the extent they are embodied in the Applications.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

VII. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND CUSTOMER DEPOSITS-ATTACHMENT 7.

1. See Section II above which objections are incorporated here.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

VIII. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION PERMIT- ATTACHMENT 8.

- 1. Objection is made to failure to file a copy of an application to renew this permit, said application having been due 3-2-2011, 180 days prior to the expiration of the permit.
- 2. Objection is made for failure to file an updated capacity analysis required as a part of the renewal application.
- 3. Objection is made for failure to file a detailed operation and maintenance performance report required as a part of the renewal application.
- 4. Counsel has referred to Harbor Hills Utility "currently installing additional required

water plant to the existing plant". In this connection objection is made for failure to file its application for revision of the permit as required at Para. 16 of the permit which would establish the facts of the need and the condition of the plant.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

IX. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND COUNSEL'S RESPONSE TO STAFF-NOTED DEFICIENCY #15.

- 1. Objection is made for failure to provide the maps for water and wastewater and irrigation water called for on a timely basis enabling review and objections as required or indicated.
- 2. Objection is made for failure to disclose and include system maps for water and wastewater and irrigation water for the many hundreds of developable acres owned by the Harbor Hills entities for development to the north of Lake Griffin Rd.
- 3. Objection is made for failure to disclose and include system maps for water and wastewater and irrigation water for the yet to be platted acres between the shores of Lake Griffin and Lake Griffin Rd.
- 4. Objection is made to the failure to disclose and include system maps for all irrigation lines and indicating which are using potable water and which are using surface water and which are using reclaimed water from Lake Griffin, to all Harbor Hills areas currently and into the future, including but not limited to the areas around the commercial entities, the golf course areas, the tennis court areas, the driving range areas, the recreational areas, the Blue Top recreational area, the commercial area, boulevard areas, hardscape areas at Village entries, the 3 entry gate areas, the Bella Vista entry gate area, the club house park area, the swimming pool area, the marina area.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

X. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE CONTRACT BETWEEN AQUA AND HARBOR HILLS

- 1. Objection is made to the proposal as set forth at Para. 1.2 (b) of the contract which provides that Harbor Hills retains an insufficient part of the Consumptive Use Permit relating to the golf course and does not retain any of the Utility Usage Permit [Permit 279], see part II above, thereby failing to create a uniform system for irrigation water service and rate structure for the entire Harbor Hills development.
- 2. Objection is made to the assumptions and accounting conventions that lead to the

conclusion at Para. 1.3 that the water service asset is worth in excess of \$500,000 as compared with the values placed upon the other assets being purchased.

- 3. Objection is made to the failure of Para. 1.4 to provide that Harbor Hills is bound by, and Aqua assumes in their entirety the provisions of Lake County ordinance 44-90 including, but not limited to, failing to recite the requirements of Para. V., 2, E. of said ordinance.
- 4. Objection is made to the provisions of Para. 7.1 and to the proposal generally since they fail to provide clarity, detail, and fairness concerning the future plans and expectations for potable water, irrigation water, and wastewater service and rate structure for the entire Harbor Hills development. For example, the fact that Harbor Hills Utility charges a certain residential area in Harbor Hills called "the Blue Tops" for irrigation water from the lake, and at its option, may or may not charge Phase 6 and Phase 7 of Bella Vista, and charges most other residents for potable water for irrigation, and at its option may or may not charge the golf course, common areas and lands owned by the developer for irrigation water (whether potable, surface or reclaimed) is a balkanized system with an uncertain future to the detriment of homeowners. These ambiguities must be corrected and a single system of potable and irrigation water and single rate structure equal for everyone for the entire development must be required.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications are not in the public interest.

XI. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE PRINCIPLES ENUNCIATED IN COHN V. THE GRAND CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION.

1. Approval of the proposals here would amount to an unlawful amendment of the contractual arrangement governing Harbor Hills contained in the declarations of Harbor Hills and the Harbor Hills Planned Unit Development ordinance concerning the economic structure and water utility framework of Harbor Hills. As such it would violate the legal and constitutional standards of the recent Florida Supreme Court case of Cohn v. The Grand Condominium Association. See Cohn v. The Grand Condominium Association, (Florida Sup. Ct. 3/31/2011). Specifically the contractual arrangement set out in the declarations and the Planned Unit Development (PUD)ordinance for Harbor Hills that authorized its creation, specifies expressly one unified system of service and rates for the entirety of Harbor Hills homeowners for potable water, and irrigation water.

The Commission, at the behest of the Applicant and in collaboration with the conditional agreement it has with Harbor Hill Utility, is being asked to approve a <u>"checker board"</u> quilt of services and rates, for irrigation water depending on a homeowner's location

within Harbor Hills. This outcome violates Article II, A. 1. Of the Harbor Hills PUD authorization, Lake County ordinance 44-90, which provides in pertinent part as follows: "A central water treatment plant shall be provided to serve the entire development." [emphasis supplied].

It must also be highlighted that from the beginning of Harbor Hills, in Phase 1, all the way through to phase 5, all homeowners were in these 5 phases of the development, (with the exception of the "Blue Tops" that are charged a fee for surface water) and still are to this day, required by the design and construction of Harbor Hills to use expensive potable water from the water treatment facilities for irrigation of their lawns. And they are trapped and estopped by the declarations from drilling their own wells.

Under the proposal before the Commission the homeowners of Bella Vista Phases 6 and 7 which are in the very early stages of build-out, having just 4 of 140 planned homes presently, as well as the developer's commercial areas or at least some, apparently will get free surface water for irrigation, the residents of the "Blue Tops" will get surface water but pay for it, and the remaining current residents, 450 or so, will bet expensive potable water to irrigate with. This outcome amounts to a radical and unlawful violation of the Harbor Hills scheme of uniformity required by its declarations and the PUD ordinance which is according to its terms "...shall constitute a covenant running with the land... and shall be binding upon the present owner and any successor, and shall be subject to each and every condition herein set out. Ordinance 44-90, art. V, 2. C (emphasis supplied). This violates the principles set forth in Cohn.

- 2. Objection is also made bases upon the fact that the proposal before the commission, or related proposals, affecting all Aqua water customers, appears also to throw the Harbor Hills rate structure now, or in the near future, into a pool of water utilities owned by Aqua throughout Florida or throughout central Florida that will impose socialized high rates on Harbor Hills. Harbor Hills is a Planned Unit Development with a contractual, legal and water framework of its own. To attempt to spread rates across disparate water systems that has no conceivable relationship the Harbor Hills PUD and has every conceivable relationship to the business interests of Aqua. This, too, outcome would violate the legal principles and requirements in Cohn.
- 3. Without waiving the foregoing legal claims for complete application of Cohn principles, objection is also made that the Applications make no attempt whatsoever to provide a development-wide system of irrigation water, as required under the declarations, the PUD, and the reasoning of Cohn.
- 4. Without waiving the foregoing legal claims for complete application of the Cohn principles, at a minimum the Commission should require Aqua and the developer to create a an "entire development-wide" scheme for the sharing of irrigation water costs

with equalized water rates by volume for all irrigation water users in the "entire development" regardless of water source and quality assessable against all homes and future homes in Harbor Hills. Anything less would do violence to the homeowners rights based upon the promise of equal protection of law, and, in this case, contract and constitutional due process considerations, and, frankly public interest considerations as well.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

XII. MISCELLANEOUS OBJECTIONS TO THE PROPOSALS

- 1. Objection is made to proposals based upon the fact that the developer retains present and future unilateral control to amend the declarations of Harbor Hills in any manner, including matters involving potable water, surface water, irrigation water, and including such future changes as might economically benefit the developer and harm homeowners. The variety of such changes that the developer might contemplate is presently unknowable. But the existence of the developer's power to amend declarations, to apply for creative permit conditions, and to pursue its economic advantages is clear and present. It must also be remembered that the Harbor Hills Homeowners' Association remains developer-controlled.
- 2. Objection is made based upon the homeowners' economic disadvantage created in the Harbor Hills declarations by the provision prohibiting homeowners from drilling their own water wells, although on information and belief, Lake County would approve the same, absent the declarations.
- 3. Objection is made to the proposals based upon the reality or future risk of inclusion of Harbor Hills' homeowner' water rates in a statewide or region wide Aqua rate scheme designed to spread or average costs from high cost systems among the water utilities it owns to lower cost systems, because Harbor Hills has a low cost system and Harbor Hills residents should enjoy the benefit of the bargain they entered into when the purchased their homes in Harbor Hills, said purchases benefiting from the declarations and contractual obligations then existing at the time of purchase and the express and implied promises relating thereto. The practice of averaging capital, operating, and maintenance costs, rates of return, and rate structures across multiple water systems will unfairly raise water rates to Harbor Hills residents and have a negative effect on the resale value of Harbor Hills homes.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.

XIII. OBJECTIONS INVOLVING THE PROPOSALS AND THE AQUA HISTORY OF SERVICE COMPLAINTS: AND REQUEST TO TAKE JUDICIAL NOTICE.

1. Objection is made to the proposals herein on the basis of all facts and information admissible under the administrative rules of evidence, contained in the files and records and data heretofore filed in all dockets and proceedings in the possession of the Florida Public Service Commission relating in any manner to customer complaints from Florida consumers about Aqua Utilities Florida, its history of service, its rates, and its business model. Request is made that the Commission take judicial/administrative notice of all of said facts and information in its consideration of this matter.

For the foregoing reasons approval of the Aqua Applications is not in the public interest.
