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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 3 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Let's move over to Item 4 Number 8. This is a panel with just myself and Commissioner Edgar. 5 MR. JAEGER: Commissioners, Ralph Jaeger, 6 7 legal staff. Item Number 8 is Staff's recommendation on 8 9 OPC's motion for reconsideration and/or clarification 10 of the final order issued in Docket Number 100104-WU. That's WMSI's rate case. Staff is recommending that 11 12 the Commission deny reconsideration but grant clarification. 13 14 OPC did not request oral argument and Staff does not believe it would assist the 15 16 Commission in making its decision. Staff is available for any questions. 17 18 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Staff. 19 Commissioner Edgar. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I wasn't sure which 20 button to go for. 21 (Laughter.) 22 23 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 24

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Recognizing that this is posthearing, I, I often appreciate oral argument, but on this instance FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

for me, and not to speak for you, of course, as my fellow member of this particular panel, I don't want to speak for you, but for me I did not feel that oral argument was, was necessary.

We, of course, spent a number of days in hearing and going through the record on this item. My understanding is that OPC is asking for, that we reconsider the treatment of the 1.2 million level of advances to associated companies that we dealt with in the final order, and that they're asking that we find the advances to be inappropriate and imprudent, and that their rationale for that is the assertion that the Commission failed to consider the utility's burden of proof and certain portions of the record.

Going back through the motion for reconsideration and also relevant portions of the final order and of the record from the case, my feeling is to deny that motion for reconsideration and to approve the Staff recommendation. I, I do not see anything that the Commission failed to consider on point to this issue, and therefore I don't believe that the standard to approve a motion for reconsideration is met on Issue 1.

As to Issue 2, the request to clarify regarding the use of imputation as a tool, I note

that in the Staff recommendation there is discussion on Page 10 in the analysis, and I do believe that if we reference that analysis on Page 10, that that meets the concerns and requests of the party, and so I am comfortable with that.

And as to the second point on Issue 2, the request to clarify the scope of the audit, Mr.

Chairman and fellow panel member, that does give me some pause. I am not an auditor, nor do I claim to be, nor do I want to be. But my sense is that the direction in the final order does give appropriate parameters for the analysis of the cash flow. And for us to go any further than that at this point before we receive that audit analysis could possibly presuppose a result or direct a conclusion and that would give me some concern.

So with that, Mr. Chairman, I look forward to your comments and thoughts. But I am comfortable with the Staff recommendation, noting the discussion on Page 10.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Was that in the form of a motion?

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I would approve the Staff recommendation.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: I've got a question for,

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I guess it's a legal question. And not that I'm going this path, but if we were to disagree on this issue and me being Chair, who comes in as tie break?

MR. JAEGER: Chairman Graham, I think right now pursuant to 350.01(5) only the people who voted on the original final orders, it's our interpretation that only you and Ms. Edgar, Commissioner Edgar can vote on this issue. And if it is a split vote, then I think the motion would fail, being that it was a split vote between you two.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: And then what happens?

Another motion will come up and then you have to continue going until you get something that passes?

MS. HELTON: No, sir. The motion would just die and we would move on and the final order would become the final order.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Well, I was just curious. I'm seconding her motion. I was just -- my mind was going through as she was saying, I mean, because I, I was just curious where we went from there. But thank you.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: In case I said something really objectionable?

(Laughter.)

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: All right. So it's been moved and seconded. All in favor, say aye. (Vote taken.) Those opposed? By our action we have approved the Staff recommendation on Item Number 8. And that's all I have. If there's anything else to come before us. If not, we're adjourned. (Commission Conference Agenda adjourned.)
