FPL's current DSM Plan consists of DSM programs approved in 2004 and additional or modified programs approved in 2006. FPL's current Residential Air Conditioning program will be significantly affected in March 2012, when building code changes will subsume one of the included measures, thus reducing FPL's achievable DSM savings in that program.

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The values for 2011 represent current year-end projections. The values for 2012-2014 consist of the projected savings as filed for FPL's 2004 DSM Plan (Docket No. 040029-EG, Order No. PSC-05-0162-PAA-EG), plus the projected savings as filed for the revisions approved in 2006 (Docket No.060286-EG, Order No. 06-0535-PAA-EG and Docket No. 060408-EI, Order No. PSC-06-0740-TRF-EI), less the impact to the Residential sector for the years 2012 and beyond as a result of the building code change discussed above.

FPL's currently approved DSM Plan only contains projections through 2014. Accordingly, as a proxy and for purposes of responding to this request only, FPL has assumed it will continue to achieve its projected incremental level of 2014 savings for the years 2015-2019. Future DSM goal-setting proceedings will determine the appropriate DSM projections for the years following 2014.
