### REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

GULF POWER COMPANY ["Gulf Power", "Gulf", or the "Company"], by and through its undersigned attorneys and pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby requests that the Florida Public Service Commission enter an order protecting from public disclosure Gulf Power's 2010 Transmission Plan. As grounds for this request, the Company states:

- 1. During the course of the evidentiary hearing in the above-styled proceeding, Gulf Power provided the Commission with a copy of its 2010 Transmission Plan ("the Transmission Plan" or "the Plan"). The Transmission Plan was entered into the evidentiary record on December 15, 2011 as Late Filed Exhibit 187 titled "2010 Transmission Planning Study." [Hearing Transcript p. 2544-46] As discussed below, the Transmission Plan constitutes proprietary confidential business information as defined in section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. Consequently, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006(8)(b), Florida Administrative Code, and Order No. PSC-11-0564-PHO-EI, the Company must file a request for confidential classification within 21 days of the conclusion of the hearing. The hearing was adjourned on December 15, 2011 at 11:50 a.m. [Hearing Transcript p. 2548]
- 2. The Transmission Plan is updated annually and provides an in-depth study and assessment of the Company's transmission system over a ten year planning horizon. The primary purpose of the Transmission Plan is to ensure that the Company's transmission system is planned such that it could be operated to supply projected customer demands and transmission services under a variety of contingency conditions set forth by the North American Reliability Council ("NERC"). Spanning 122 pages in total, the Plan provides an in-depth review of: (a)

non-public components of Gulf's existing transmission system (including risk assessments relating to the same); (b) internal, proprietary planning guidelines and procedures developed by Gulf and the Southern Company; and (c) detailed recommendations for system upgrades, replacements and additions over the planning horizon along with specific budget recommendations for each project. The information contained in the Plan is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes, for a variety of reasons.

First, the document identifies each transmission project planned over the planning horizon and detailed cost projections for those projects. Disclosure of this information could negatively impact Gulf Power's ability to negotiate favorable pricing terms with equipment vendors and landowners (where real property must be acquired). See § 366.093(3)(e), Fla. Stat.

Second, the document reflects Gulf Power's and the Southern Company's internal procedures and guidelines for transmission planning. The development of these proprietary procedures and guidelines required the expenditure of significant expertise, time and internal resources. This non-public information is of value to the companies' competitors and disclosure of this information publicly would put the companies at a competitive disadvantage. Public disclosure of this information will provide market competitors with access to the companies' internal procedures and facility specifications. Gulf's and the Southern Company's competitors could use this information to optimize their own practices at Gulf Power's expense. See § 366.093(3)(a) and (e), Fla. Stat. Similar Gulf Power procedures were granted confidential classification in Order No. PSC-06-0427-CFO-EI and Order No. PSC-08-0048-CFO-EI.

Third, the document contains internal risk assessments of Gulf's existing transmission system. Public disclosure of this data could negatively impact the Company's ability to engage in wholesale transactions and/or asset sales. See § 366.093(3)(b) and (e), Fla. Stat.

Finally, public disclosure of the document could expose potential vulnerabilities in critical components of the Company's transmission system to potential wrongdoers, thus implicating regional if not national security concerns. <u>See</u> § 366.093(3)(c), <u>Fla. Stat.</u>

- 3. The information filed pursuant to this request is intended to be, and is treated as, confidential by Gulf Power and, to this attorney's knowledge, has not been otherwise publicly disclosed.
- 4. Submitted as Exhibit "A" is one un-redacted copy of Transmission Plan for which confidential classification is requested. Exhibit "A" should be treated as confidential pending a ruling on this request. Attached as Exhibit "B" are two (2) edited versions of the Plan which may be made available for public review and inspection. Attached as Exhibit "C" to this request is a line-by-line/field-by-field justification for the request for confidential classification.

WHEREFORE, Gulf Power Company respectfully requests that the Commission enter an order protecting the Company's Transmission Plan from public disclosure as proprietary confidential business information.




