On January 30, 2012, Sanlando Utilities Corporation (Sanlando or Utility) filed its request for confidential classification for Document No. 00477-12. The document includes information related to the Utility's salary adjustment submitted in response to Staff's First Data Request. Sanlando claims that the information produced consists of employees' name and title, base salary, overtime, raises, taxes, pension information and total compensation. The Utility claims the information is intended to be and is treated as private and confidential and has not been disclosed externally. Staff has reviewed the documents and concurs with the Utility that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Section 367.156, Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would harm Sanlando's competitive business interests and would impair the ability of the Utility to contract for employees on favorable terms. Therefore, staff recommends that Sanlando's request for confidential classification of Document No. 00477-12 be approved.
