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AT&T plans to discontinue this service on or after June 29, 2012, subject to Commission approval of this application.

Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

OC-24 SMARTRing service will be discontinued in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

Brief Description of Type of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

OC-24 SMARTRing service is a dedicated, high capacity, network service that is deployed in a self-healing ring architecture between multiple customer designated locations and AT&T central offices. The OC-24 SMARTRing service provides the customer with the bandwidth equivalent of twenty-four (24) DS3 capacity.

AT&T is discontinuing this service due to low market demand. AT&T will continue to offer SMARTRing service at a variety of other bandwidth capacities, such as OC-3, OC-12, OC-48 and OC-192. Therefore, the public convenience and necessity is not impaired by the discontinuance of this service because AT&T offers a variety of service alternatives.

Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers (47 C.F.R. §63.71(b)(3)):

AT&T has no customers that subscribe to this service.
