**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S MOTION FOR
TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER FOR CERTAIN CONFIDENTIAL
INFORMATION PROVIDED IN ITS SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSE
TO PUBLIC COUNSEL'S SECOND SET OF INTERROGATORIES (No. 43)**

Pursuant to section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL"), hereby moves the Florida Public Service Commission (the "Commission"), through the Prehearing Officer, for a temporary protective order to exempt from section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, certain confidential information included in FPL's Supplemental Response to the Office of Public Counsel's ("OPC") Second Set of Interrogatories (No. 43), and in support states:

1. OPC has requested that it be permitted to inspect or take possession of FPL's confidential, proprietary information included in FPL's Supplemental Response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (No. 43).

2. Subsection (6)(c) of Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, provides in relevant part as follows with respect to a utility allowing OPC to take possession of utility information:

[T]he utility may request a temporary protective order exempting the information from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. If the information is to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then the utility must file a specific request for a protective order under paragraph (a) above. If the information is not to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, then Public Counsel shall return the information to the utility in accordance with the record retention requirements of the Department of State.

3. The confidential information includes, but is not limited to, information related to competitive interests, the disclosure of which could harm the competitive business of the

provider of the information (exempt from the Public Records Act pursuant to section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes).

4. FPL respectfully requests that the Commission enter a temporary protective order affording FPL the protection that is needed to provide OPC the confidential information included in FPL's Supplemental Response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (No. 43).

5. FPL has been authorized by counsel for OPC to represent that OPC does not object to the granting of this motion but reserves the right to contest confidentiality of the subject documents.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, FPL respectfully requests that the Commission enter a temporary protective order protecting against public disclosure the confidential information contained in FPL's Supplemental Response to OPC's Second Set of Interrogatories (No. 43).
