## ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF

## BY THE COMMISSION:

West Lakeland Wastewater, Inc. (West Lakeland or Utility) is a Class C wastewater utility serving approximately 315 wastewater customers in Polk County. This area is located in the Southwest Florida Water Management District. Water service is provided by the City of Lakeland. The Utility's 2011 annual report indicates total gross revenue of \$91,830 and net operating loss of \$14,465.

On November 13, 2012, the Utility filed an application for approval of a tariff amendment to charge customers who opt to pay their water bill by debit or credit card. West Lakeland filed the tariff sheet for this request on November 28, 2012. This Order addresses the suspension of West Lakeland's proposed tariff sheet. We have jurisdiction pursuant to Section 367.091(6), Florida Statutes (F.S.).

Pursuant to Section 367.091(6), F.S., we may withhold consent to operation of any or all portions of new rate schedules by a vote to that effect within 60 days, giving a reason or statement of good cause for withholding its consent. We find that the tariff shall be suspended to allow sufficient time to review the application and gather all pertinent information necessary to reach an informed decision concerning the proposed tariff. This reason constitutes good cause to suspend the tariff consistent with the requirements of Section 367.091(6), F.S.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that West Lakeland Wastewater, Inc.'s proposed tariff to establish a charge for customers who opt to pay their water bill by debit or credit card shall be suspended. It is further

## NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Office of Commission Clerk, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
