**TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S  
REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION  
AND MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER**

Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "the company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby request confidential classification of the yellow highlighted information contained in the following described document(s) ("the Document(s)") stamped "CONFIDENTIAL" and all information that is or may be printed on yellow paper stock stamped "CONFIDENTIAL" within the Document(s), all of said confidential information being hereinafter referred to as "Confidential Information."

**Description of Document(s)**

Bates stamp pages 1953-3838; 7054-7340; and 9407-9826 in response to WCF Hospital Utility Alliance's ("HUA's") Second Request for Production of Documents filed on a confidential basis in the above matter. In support of this request, the company states:

1. Subsection 366.093(1), Florida Statutes, provides that any records "found by the Commission to be propriety confidential business information shall be kept confidential and shall be exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes [requiring disclosure under the Public Records Act]." Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to "[i]nformation concerning . . . contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms."

Subsection 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. Proprietary confidential business information also includes “[i]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.” Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes. The Confidential Information that is the subject of this request and motion falls within the statutory categories and, thus, constitutes propriety confidential business information entitled to protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.

2. Attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is a justification for confidential treatment of the Confidential Information contained in the Document(s).

3. Attached hereto as Exhibit "B" are two public versions of the Document(s) with the Confidential Information redacted, unless previously filed as indicated.

4. The Confidential Information contained in the Document(s) is intended to be and is treated by Tampa Electric as private and has not been publicly disclosed.

5. For the same reasons set forth herein in support of its request for confidential classification, Tampa Electric also moves the Commission for entry of a temporary protective order pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, protecting the Confidential Information from public disclosure.

**Requested Duration of Confidential Classification**


6. Tampa Electric requests that the Confidential Information be treated by the Commission as confidential proprietary business information for at least the 18 month period prescribed in Rule 25-22.006(9)(a), Florida Administrative Code. If, and to the extent that the company is in need of confidential classification of the Confidential Information beyond the 18

month period set forth in the Commission rule, the justification and grounds for such extended confidential treatment are set forth in Exhibit "C" to this request and motion.

WHEREFORE, Tampa Electric Company respectfully requests that the Confidential Information that is the subject of this request and motion be accorded confidential classification for the reasons set forth herein and for a minimum period of 18 months, subject to any request for a longer period of confidential classification as may be set forth in Exhibit "C" to this request and motion. The company further moves for the entry of a temporary protective order pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, protecting the Confidential Information from public disclosure.

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- (1) The information contained on the listed Bates stamped pages contains the private and proprietary work product of Tampa Electric related to the design and construction of its transmission and distribution system. Some of the information would be considered Critical Energy Infrastructure Information (CEII) as defined by FERC at 18 CFR § 388.113 (2007). It is also in the nature of information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair Tampa Electric's ability to contract for goods and services at favorable terms. The information also contains sensitive security information that if made publicly available could adversely impact Tampa Electric's ability to protect its systems. The disclosure of this information would therefore, be harmful to the company's competitive interests and as such, the information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093 (3)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.
  - (2) The information contained on the listed Bates stamped pages contains the private and proprietary work product of Tampa Electric, CRSI Consulting and Dyonx consulting. This information is in the nature of a trade secret owned by both CRSI Consulting and Dyonx consulting. It is also in the nature of information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair CRSI and Dyonx Consulting's competitive business interests by diminishing the demand for their proprietary work product. The information also contains sensitive security information that if made publicly available could adversely impact Tampa Electric's ability to protect its systems. The disclosure of this information would therefore, be harmful to the company's and consultant's competitive interests and as such, the information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093 (3)(a)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.
  - (3) The information contained on the listed pages contains bid information provided in response to RFP's from Energy providers. Disclosing bid information included the company's confidential proposals would provide competitors access to the terms and conditions under which we could provide services. This information, would allow a competitor to undercut Tampa Electric's proposals to prospective bidders. As such public disclosure of the information contained on these pages would adversely affect the competitive interests of Tampa Electric to contract for goods and services on favorable

terms. The disclosure of this information would therefore be harmful to competitive interests, and as such, the information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.

- (4) The information contained on the listed pages includes Tampa Electric's bid evaluation analysis and system information that reveals existing and planned operations and performance data of the company's generating units. Disclosing detailed system performance information would provide competitors access to the operating profile of our system and enable them offer energy or capacity during times where the utility has the greatest need. As such public disclosure of the information contained on these pages would adversely affect the competitive interests of Tampa Electric and its ability to contract for goods and services on favorable terms. The disclosure of this information would therefore be harmful to competitive interests, and as such, the information is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093(d) and (e), Florida Statutes.
- (5) The information contained on the listed pages contains the proprietary work product of Tampa Electric's Wholesale Fuels and Marketing Group. The disclosure of this information would allow competitors access to strategic information regarding the company's plans and efforts to secure energy and capacity as well as its methods of analysis and evaluation. This information is in the nature of a trade secret owned by Tampa Electric. It is also in the nature of information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair Tampa Electric's competitive business interests by providing competitors access to the strategic process used to analyze and evaluate potential energy or capacity sales. As such, the information in question is entitled to confidential treatment pursuant to Section 366.093 (3)(a) and (e), Florida Statutes.
