ORDER ACKNOWLEDGING TRANSFER TO GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY
AND CANCELLING WATER AND WASTEWATER CERTIFICATES

BY THE COMMISSION:

Aqua Utilities Florida, Inc. (Aqua or Utility) is a Class A water and wastewater utility providing water and wastewater service in Alachua, Hardee, Lake, Lee, Marion, Orange, Pasco, Polk, Putnam, Seminole and Volusia counties. Water and wastewater rates were last established for this Utility in its 2010 rate case.¹

On February 20, 2013, Aqua filed an application for transfer of certain water and wastewater facilities to the Florida Governmental Utility Authority (FGUA) and cancellation of those certificates. Pursuant to Section 367.071(4), Florida Statutes (F.S.), the sale of facilities to a governmental authority shall be approved as a matter of right. As such, no notice of the transfer is required and no filing fees apply.

The application included an Agreement for Purchase and Sale of Water and Wastewater Assets between Aqua and FGUA, which closed March 22, 2013, the effective date of the transfer. Pursuant to Section 367.071(4)(a), F.S., and Rule 25-30.037(4)(e), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), the Utility included a statement that FGUA obtained the most recent income statements, the most recent balance sheet, statement of rate base for regulatory purposes, and contributions-in-aid-of-construction. In accordance with Rule 25-30-037(4)(g), F.A.C., the Utility specified that it applied deposits to any customer account with a past due balance. For the remaining deposits, Aqua applied the interest to the customers' accounts and the remaining balance has been transferred to FGUA. On April 23, 2013, Aqua filed its 2012 annual report pursuant to Rule 25-30.110, F.A.C. The Utility will pay all outstanding regulatory assessment fees by July 31, 2013. The Utility will not be under our jurisdiction on December 31, 2013; therefore, no annual report needs to be filed for 2013.

We have jurisdiction pursuant to Section 367.071, F.S. Based on the above, we find that the application is in compliance with Section 367.071(4)(a), F.S., and Rule 25-30.037(4), F.A.C. The transfer of the water and wastewater systems to FGUA and cancellation of the certificates listed below are acknowledged as a matter of right effective March 22, 2013, pursuant to Section 367.071(4)(a), F.S.

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NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Any party adversely affected by the Commission's final action in this matter may request:

- 1) reconsideration of the decision by filing a motion for reconsideration with the Office of Commission Clerk, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, within fifteen (15) days of the issuance of this order in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.060, Florida Administrative Code; or
- 2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility or the First District Court of Appeal in the case of a water and/or wastewater utility by filing a notice of appeal with the Office of Commission Clerk, and filing a copy of the notice of appeal and the filing fee with the appropriate court. This filing must be completed within thirty (30) days after the issuance of this order, pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. The notice of appeal must be in the form specified in Rule 9.900(a), Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
