CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Moving on to Item Number 3, Docket Number 130166-GU.

MS. KING: Good morning, Commissioners. Laura King with Commission staff.

Item 3 is a joint petition for approval of a territorial agreement in Orange County by Peoples Gas in the Lake Apopka Natural Gas District. In the '90s the companies entered into transfer agreements which specified that Peoples would provide natural gas service to certain customers in Orange County and that Lake Apopka would have the option to purchase the facilities when it was ready to provide such service.

The companies have now entered into an agreement which provides for the transfer of the facilities as well as the customer accounts. Customers have been notified of the possible transfer. And since the notices have been sent, one residential customer has contacted Peoples opposing the transfer.

Staff believes that the proposed agreement eliminates the potential uneconomic duplication of facilities, will not cause a decrease in the reliability of gas service, and will not cause a

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detriment to the public interest. 1 2 Staff recommends the petition be approved 3 and is here to answer any questions, and company representatives are here to answer any questions you 4 5 may have. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Thank you very much. 6 7 Commissioners, any questions on this item? Commissioner Brown. 8 9 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. I have a question for Peoples Gas. Our staff said that 10 Peoples only received one customer complaint in this 11 12 process. Is that accurate? MR. WATSON: Yes, Commissioner, that is 13 14 accurate. COMMISSIONER BROWN: Of the 144 customers, 15 how many accounts are technically active? 16 17 MR. WATSON: Just under 140. COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. That's all I 18 19 have. Thank you. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Commissioner 20 21 Balbis. 22 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. 23 Chairman. 24 I have a question for staff. In the 25 recommendation you indicate that Lake Apopka is FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

going to maintain the same rates through September 30th, 2014, and that there was some concern about the difference in rates between Peoples Gas and Lake Apopka. What is the difference between those rates, and what's going to happen on -- after September 30th, 2014?

MS. KING: That's correct, Commissioner. Lake Apopka has agreed to keep the same rates in place until the September 2014 date. The rate structure is a little bit different between the two companies, and as best as we could compare some of the rates the cost per therm for Lake Apopka in some cases is more than double that that Peoples currently charges.

I can't speak to what will happen after September of 2014. The Commission doesn't have jurisdiction over Lake Apopka's rates, and we generally don't look at rates as a consideration in approving or disapproving these agreements. It's generally just a detriment to the public interest. The rates could change between now and then, and Peoples' rates perhaps could be higher at that time.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: And are the customers, are they within that special district, the Lake Apopka Special District, so after

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1	September 30th then they will have the ability
2	through that process, whether it's electing board
3	members, et cetera, to, to have their concerns
4	addressed?
5	MS. KING: Yes, sir, that's my
6	understanding.
7	COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you.
8	That's all I had.
9	CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Thank you.
10	Any further questions, Commissioners? All
11	right.
12	Commissioner Balbis.
13	COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Mr. Chairman, I move
