Dear Ms. Dortch:

AT&T Inc. (AT&T), on behalf of its incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs), accepts the 2013 Connect America Fund (CAF) Phase I incremental support (incremental support) allocated to it for the purpose of deploying facilities capable of offering broadband service at speeds of at least 4 Mbps downstream/1 Mbps upstream to unserved locations. In addition, AT&T conditionally accepts additional support up to a combined total of \$100,000,000. If the full amount of requested incremental support is made available, AT&T expects to offer, within the next several years, broadband service to approximately 129,000 locations that have no access to broadband today.

In its Round 2 Order, the Commission clarified several key aspects of this program and, in so doing, confirmed its commitment to the essential concept of linking high-cost support to the voluntary acceptance of clear and time-limited obligations that apply only in areas where the electing provider receives high-cost support. AT&T thus accepts incremental support conditioned on its understanding that all incremental support obligations terminate upon the submission of the final report on the use of incremental support for broadband deployment. It is also AT&T's understanding that it may file this final report prior to the annual report due after three years after the date of this letter (i.e., July 1, 2017) if AT&T completes its build-out in less time than required under the Commission's rules. For example, if AT&T completes deployment of the specified broadband infrastructure to all required locations in 2015 (i.e., within two years of this notification), the annual report AT&T files in 2016 (i.e., the report due after two years after filing such notice of acceptance), would be its final report. If the Commission disagrees with AT&T's understanding, AT&T asks that the Commission notify it no later than 30 days after the date of today's letter so that it may withdraw its acceptance in a timely manner.

In submitting this notification of our acceptance of the 2013 round of incremental support, I hereby certify on behalf of AT&T that:

- The locations to be served to satisfy the deployment obligation are not shown as served by fixed broadband at the speed specified in section 54.312(c)(2) (data for June 2012);
- To the best of the AT&T's knowledge, the locations are, in fact, unserved by fixed Internet access with speeds of 768 kbps downstream and 200 kbps upstream;
- AT&T's current capital improvement plan does not include plans to complete broadband deployment within the next three years to the locations to be counted to satisfy the deployment obligation;
- incremental support will not be used to satisfy any merger commitment or similar regulatory obligation; and,
- AT&T has undertaken due diligence, within the available time, to determine that the
  locations in question are not within the area of a BTOP or BIP project that will provide
  Internet access with speeds of at least 3 Mbps downstream and 768 kbps upstream. We
  will continue to investigate whether any of the identified locations are within the area of
  such a project.

Pursuant to section 54.312(c)(4), AT&T is attaching an initial list of identified locations, by wire center and census block, to which the company will deploy broadband to meet its service obligations in the event that it receives the total amount of support it is willing to accept. This list represents a good faith statement of our initial intentions to deploy broadband-capable infrastructure. If our deployment plans change, for whatever reason, we will submit notification as required in section 54.312(b)(3). A copy of this notice and associated list of initial locations is being submitted to the Universal Service Administrative Company and relevant state public service commissions.<sup>4</sup>
