2 **CHAIRMAN BRISÉ:** Good morning. If you would
3 join us for the invocation and pledge, which will be led
4 by Commissioner Graham.

5 (Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance
6 observed.)

7 Thank you, Commissioner Graham. And we're
8 going to go ahead and call this meeting to order.

9 Mr. Executive Director.

10 **MR. BAEZ:** Mr. Chairman, thank you.

11 Commissioners, if we can depart from, go off
12 script for, for a moment, I had a point of personal
13 privilege and wanted to remind you all that today is the
14 last agenda for the Commission's gray eminence, Chuck
15 Hill. I wanted to put that all on your radar. This is
16 the last time we're going to see him here. It took a
17 lot to get him here. And I won't say much more at this
18 point because the record is rolling. I just wanted to
19 let you know.

20 **CHAIRMAN BRISÉ:** All right. Thank you. And I
21 think some of us may have a couple of things that we may
22 want to say.

23 Just I want to thank you for your service --
24 it's about as long as I've been alive -- to this
25 Commission. (Laughter.) So, so the state is indebted

1 to you and this Commission is truly indebted to you.

2 But in all, all seriousness, I have definitely
3 appreciated your service as, as one who came in a few
4 years ago. You have always served with distinction and
5 provided clear guidance when, when sought, and, you
6 know, even though we may have disagreed a few times here
7 and there. But your demeanor has always been
8 appropriate and, and, and you are genuinely a gentleman,
9 and we certainly appreciate that.

10 **MR. HILL:** Thank you.

11 **CHAIRMAN BRISÉ:** Commissioner Brown.

12 **COMMISSIONER BROWN:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
13 And those are excellent words for Chuck.

14 And I also want to thank you for your many,
15 many, many years of service to the agency and for your
16 institutional knowledge, which is going to be greatly
17 missed here. You are one of those indispensable
18 employees here.

19 And also on a personal note, I want to thank
20 you when you welcomed me right away to the agency and
21 really you were willing to do pretty much anything I
22 asked, which isn't that much, but, but you -- I really

24 one of those employees that really helped me get
25 adjusted to the agency. So thank you. I'll miss you a

1 lot.

2 **MR. HILL:** Thank you.

3 **CHAIRMAN BRISÉ:** Commissioner Balbis.

4 **COMMISSIONER BALBIS:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

5 I too want to thank Chuck for his service. I
6 know when I first came to this agency there was a lot of
7 drinking from a fire hose, as I like to call it, and it
8 seemed that every question that I had from staff, et
9 cetera, that you were instrumental in getting that
10 information to me. And I felt that the old saying, pay
11 attention -- "Don't pay attention to the man behind the
12 curtain," I realize that you were the man behind the
13 curtain making sure that everything ran well. So I
14 appreciate your dedication and your service to the
15 state, and I wish you the best of luck in your future
16 endeavors.

17 **COMMISSIONER GRAHAM:** Commissioner Graham.

18 **CHAIRMAN GRAHAM:** Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

19 Chuck, we're going to miss you. I tell you,
20 coming here three and a half years ago when the Chairman
21 and I first got here, it was a lot to take in at one
22 time. There was a lot of, lot of things going on at one
23 time. And then for me to get thrown into the Chairman's
24 position right away was a lot to deal with, and you were
25 the go-to guy for me. You, you were the stabilization

1 that I needed to continue moving forward. And you and I
2 have had this conversation before; I appreciate you and
3 we're definitely going to miss you.

11 but now we'll give you the opportunity to say what you
12 like.

13 **MR. HILL:** Thank you. And, no, I don't like
14 to talk much.

15 Thank you for the kind words. I appreciate
16 it. And please know that I could not be as responsive
17 as I was without staff. Thank you all very much.

18 **CHAIRMAN BRISÉ:** All right. Thank you.

19 Okay. Now we're going to go ahead and begin
20 our agenda for the day.

22 11 will be taken out of order, and we're going to go
23 ahead and move to Item Number 1, which is our consent
