PROCEEDINGS

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COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Welcome, everyone. will go ahead and get started. So I call this Prehearing Conference to order. I left my glasses at home, so I am going to be squinting at all of you. apologize for that. You look very blurry today to me.

I recognize that we are in a somewhat different procedural posture, so we will walk our way through that. But let's go ahead and get started, and I will ask our staff to please read the notice.

MS. BROWNLESS: Yes, ma'am.

Pursuant to notice, the Florida Public Service Commission announces the Prehearing Conference in Docket Number 130140-EI, petition for rate increase by Gulf Power Company. The purpose of this Prehearing Conference is to simplify the issues; identify the positions of the parties on the issues; consider the possibility of obtaining admissions of facts and of documents, which will avoid unnecessary proof; identify exhibits; establish an order of witnesses; and consider such other matters as may aid in the disposition of this action.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. And for the record, let's go ahead and take appearances beginning at my left.

Thank you, Commissioner Edgar. MR. STONE: 1 name is Jeffery A. Stone of the law firm Beggs & Lane. 2 3 And I will be entering an appearance also for my partners Russell A. Badders, Steven R. Griffin, and 4 5 Russell F. Van Sickle. Also entering an appearance on behalf of Gulf Power Company for Charles A. Guyton and 6 7 Richard D. Melson, attorneys who are not affiliated with Beggs & Lane but who have been actively participants --8 9 active participants in representing Gulf in this 10 proceeding. 11 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. 12 MR. STONE: And -- thank you. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Is there more? I didn't 13 14 mean to cut you off. 15 MR. STONE: No. I'm sorry. That was it. 16 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Thank you. 17 MR. MOYLE: Jon Moyle with the Moyle Law Firm 18 appearing on behalf of the Florida Industrial Power 19 Users Group, commonly known as FIPUG. MR. WRIGHT: Robert Scheffel Wright and John 2.0 21 T. LaVia, III, of the Gardner, Bist, Wiener Law Firm 22 representing Wal-Mart Stores and Sam's East, 23 Incorporated. 24 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

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MAJOR THOMPSON: Major Chris Thompson

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representing the FEA, Federal Executive Agencies. 1 2 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Major. MR. REHWINKEL: Charles Rehwinkel, Joe 3 McGlothlin, and J. R. Kelly on behalf of the citizens of 4 Florida. 5 6 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. 7 And our staff. MS. BROWNLESS: Suzanne Brownless, Martha 8 9 Barrera, and Kelley Corbari on behalf of the Commission staff. 10 11 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. 12 MS. HELTON: And Mary Anne Helton, advisor to 13 the Commission. 14 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you very much. Okay. Let me first start off by 15 congratulating all of the parties on your negotiation 16 17 efforts. And then let me kind of walk us through 18 where -- or my understanding of where we are in this 19 docket, and then I'll look to staff and look to each of 20 the parties. 21 Okay. It is my understanding that on 22 November 15th the parties jointly notified the 23 Commission that a settlement had been reached between 24 the parties. On November 18th the parties filed a joint 25 motion to hold discovery in abeyance, among other

things.

On November 22nd, approximately 8:00 a.m., which was Friday, parties filed a joint motion for approval of stipulation and settlement agreement, and the proposed agreement was signed by all parties.

As you all are aware, this Prehearing

Conference had previously been noticed in anticipation

of the evidentiary hearing that had been scheduled to

begin on December 9th, two weeks from today.

Okay. So procedurally where we are, on Tuesday, November 20th, working with our legal staff, I gave an oral ruling to abate discovery. Orders that are addressing all pending requests for confidential classification and temporary protective orders have been signed and should be issued today, if they have not been already.

And earlier today, pursuant to Section 120.525, notice was issued that our Chairman has added consideration of the proposed settlement and stipulation to the agenda for the full Commission agenda meeting conference on December 3rd.

So now let me look to our legal staff. Have I missed anything that we need to point out, or is there anything that I misstated?

MS. BROWNLESS: No, ma'am. That's, I think,

procedurally where we are.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. So with that, the Commission will consider the proposed settlement and stipulation on December 3rd. So that is where we stand as of now.

Let me look to the parties and see if there's anything else that you want to bring to my attention, and then we could walk through sort of future steps after that.

Gulf.

MR. STONE: Nothing on behalf of Gulf,
Commissioner, nothing in addition to what you've stated.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Moyle.

MR. MOYLE: You're probably going to get to this as you walk through, but I assume that we have some remarks generally about the settlement that the Agenda Conference would be the appropriate time to make those, I would assume.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Let me come back to you for that.

MR. WRIGHT: We have nothing to add, Commissioner. Thank you very much.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay.

MAJOR THOMPSON: Nothing from FEA.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay.

MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner, the only thing 1 the Public Counsel asks is -- I believe you mentioned in 2 your recitation of the status that you had issued an 3 oral order on discovery. 4 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Yes, sir. 5 MR. REHWINKEL: Does that cover both written 6 7 and deposition discovery? We have -- there's some discovery pending, and we were just -- we think it's all 8 9 been abated, but we're not, we're not certain. 10 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: It covers all discovery. 11 MR. REHWINKEL: Okay. 12 **COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Which is in abeyance 13 until December 4th. 14 MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you. **COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Does that work? 15 16 MR. REHWINKEL: Yes. 17 **COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Okay. Good. 18 Staff, anything further on that? 19 MS. BROWNLESS: No, ma'am. No. 2.0 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Then again walking through where, where we are, I understand that our staff 21 22 will be available after this Prehearing Conference, 23 we're not done yet, but after this Prehearing 2.4 Conference, and that they may have some questions that

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they would like to discuss with the parties just to go

over some off the technical, legal, et cetera. I would ask that all parties please meet with our staff when we are concluded here. That will be, I think, an efficient way to answer the questions that they have so that our staff can continue to do what they need to do to help the Commission members be ready for consideration of this matter on December 3rd. When we are done here, this Prehearing Conference will be continued until December 4th, if needed.

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So if the settlement agreement is not approved on December 3rd, then we will meet back here, Prehearing Conference to be continued to take up all matters to be ready to go into hearing during the time period of the dates that have already been set and noticed for hearing December 9th through 13th.

MS. BROWNLESS: Yes. May I?

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Yes. Please, ma'am.

MS. BROWNLESS: I would just add to that that if the Prehearing Conference is continued until

December 3rd -- December 4th, it would commence at 1:30 on the 4th if we have to have --

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Who decided that?

MS. BROWNLESS: I believe the Chairman.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: He already set a time for the Prehearing Conference?

MS. BROWNLESS: I believe so, but --

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COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Well, that's news I thought we had talked about 30 minutes after So that is a new piece of information for me. So apparently I am out of date. What I would ask that y'all do is check the notice, and we will have it, if needed, whenever it is scheduled to be had. But it will be on December 4th. Does that work?

MS. BROWNLESS: Yes, ma'am.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Thank you.

Okay. Let me just make sure. All right. I'll go back over my notes, see if there's anything else that we haven't covered. But this would be an appropriate time for some general comments from the parties about where we stand and about the document that the Commission will be considering. So let me start to my left.

MR. STONE: Commissioner, the -- as you pointed out, we were able to reach a definitive written agreement that was filed of record with the Commission approximately 8:00 a.m. on Friday, and we stand ready to discuss the contents of that document. We, at this point we don't have anything to speak about here on the record, but we certainly would be available to answer any questions.

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appreciate you making you and your team available to our staff after this, and for whatever information they need again to do their work to help us be prepared. So thank

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. And I

you for that.

MR. MOYLE: And I would refrain from providing comments today, with the anticipation that as previous settlements as we've done when we've presented it to the Commission, we'll have the opportunity to address the full Commission when we have the meeting, I guess, on the 3rd; is that right?

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: That would, of course, be up to the presiding officer at the time, our Chairman. However, that would be my expectation.

MR. MOYLE: Okay. Well, out of an abundance of caution I would like on the record to say it's a fair deal and FIPUG supports it 100%, if I don't get the opportunity to make more extensive comments in a week or so. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

MR. WRIGHT: Thank you, Commissioner. We support the settlement, and we look forward to participating in answering any questions from the Commissioners on December 3. Thanks again.

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COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

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MAJOR THOMPSON: FEA is in agreement with the other Intervenors.

MR. REHWINKEL: We have nothing further to add. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. This almost seems too smooth, not that I'm complaining. Please know that.

So let me again ask my staff, is there anything that we have not covered that it would be helpful to cover while we are all gathered here together?

MS. BROWNLESS: No, ma'am. I think that's sufficient.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Well, then, again, thank you all on behalf of my office for the negotiations and the discussions that you had. I look forward to looking into the details more over the next few days and to the discussion that we will have at the noticed Commission meeting on December 3rd. Please work with our staff. I know you will. And everybody have a wonderful afternoon. This hearing is concluded for today.
