3	MR. MURPHY: Commissioners, Item 5 is staff's
4	recommendation in the complaint of FLATEL, Inc., against
5	AT&T Florida.

7	dismiss FLATEL's amended petition with prejudice for
8	failure to comply with applicable filing rules for a

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Commissioners, any questions of staff or Mr. Hatch?

Okay. Can I get a motion?

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Move staff.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and seconded, staff recommendation on Item Number 5.

Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: I just want a clarification on, on the motion. Staff's recommendation is that we dismiss the amended petition with prejudice. And I just want to confirm that that's what the motion states, because there is discussion in the analysis on

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an option of dismissing without prejudice.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: With prejudice.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Mr. Chairman, can I ask staff a question on what the consequence of that would be?

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Sure.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: That does not prohibit a new complaint regarding promotional credits that could come forward. And the only -- the dismissal with prejudice just means they cannot amend this complaint and submit it again.

MR. MURPHY: I think the complaint would be dismissed with prejudice with respect to the factual basis for this complaint. They could not bring a new complaint on these same issues.

Subsequent alleged violation by AT&T of these, of this nature they could complain. But with respect to the ones that are -- to the extent that they are identified, they would be precluded from subsequent complaints.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Because staff's recommendation of dismissal is because the complaint does not follow the format and the requirements of a complaint; correct?

MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir.

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COMMISSIONER BALBIS: But it does not dive into the factual issues that are alleged in the complaint?

MR. MURPHY: You don't reach the merits of, of the factual basis of the complaint by doing this action.

commissioner Balbis: Okay. And that's my only concern in that we haven't really, and staff has not gotten into the factual issues associated as to whether or not there, whether or not there are any valid arguments as to the promotional credits. And if we dismiss with prejudice, then they're precluded from filing any complaint associated with that, which we have not addressed. So I would not support a dismissal with prejudice just based on that.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Commissioner Brown.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. And,

Commission Balbis, I wrestled with this a little bit too
in, in a briefing with staff. We have given -- we have
often given utilities and companies an opportunity to
come back and file if they don't meet the requirements,
the pleading requirements of a complaint. However, the
reason why I was supporting staff recommendation on
this -- and I still do support it -- is because the rule
or statute is not clear. And I asked staff is there -based on the facts here, do you believe that they could

plead a complaint based on the facts and the rules as 1 they stand today and the statutes as they exist today, 2 3 not the ones that have been repealed? And staff's answer was no. 4 5 So based on, on the current factual situation and the complaint as amended -- we've already given them 6 7 leave to amend prior -- I can't see, foresee a complaint based on what they've presented to us. So I still 8 9 support staff's recommendation. CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. We have a motion and 10 11 a second on the floor of staff recommendation on Item 12 Number 5. Seeing no further discussion, all in favor, 13 say aye. 14 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Aye.
