**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S FIRST REQUEST
FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF
MATERIALS PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AUDIT NO. 13-004-4-3**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes ("Section 366.093"), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby submits its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of Information Provided Pursuant to Audit No. 13-004-4-3 ("Confidential Information"). In support of this request, FPL states as follows:

1. On August 1, 2013 FPL filed a Request for Confidential Classification of the Confidential Information, which included Exhibits A, B, C and D ("August 1, 2013 Request"). By Order No. PSC-13-0480-CFO-EG, dated October 15, 2013 ("Order 0480"), the Commission granted FPL's August 1, 2013 Request. FPL adopts and incorporates by reference the August 1, 2013 Request and Order 0480.

2. The period of confidential treatment granted by Order 0480 will soon expire. The Confidential Information that was the subject of FPL's August 1, 2013 Request and Order 0480 warrants continued treatment as proprietary and confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3). Accordingly, FPL hereby submits its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

3. All of the information designated in Exhibits A, B and C to the August 1, 2013 Request remains confidential. Accordingly, those exhibits will not be reproduced or reattached here.

4. Included herewith is First Revised Exhibit D, which is comprised of the affidavits of Antonio Maceo and Anita Sharma in support of this request.

5. The Confidential Information is intended to be and has been treated by FPL as private, its confidentiality has been maintained, and its disclosure would cause harm to FPL and its customers. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

6. As the affidavits included in First Revised Exhibit D indicate, some documents contain or constitute internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors or information relating to internal auditing reports. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(b), Fla. Stat.

7. Also, certain documents contain information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of FPL or its vendors to contract for goods and services on favorable terms. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(d), Fla. Stat.

8. Additionally, some documents contain information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of FPL or those of its vendors. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), Fla. Stat.

9. Certain documents contain customer-specific account information, which if disclosed would impair FPL's competitive interests or those of its vendors. It is FPL's corporate policy not to disclose customer-specific information. This policy includes, but is not limited to: customer names, addresses, telephone numbers, account numbers, rates, billing determinants (kW and kWh usage), conservation savings in kW, kWh and bills. FPL treats such information as confidential and does not disclose it, except as required by law, to entities or persons other

than the customer absent the customer's consent. Such information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e), Fla Stat.

10. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information remains proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least an additional eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.

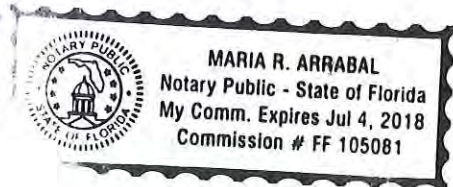
