## PROCEEDINGS

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**COMMISSIONER BROWN:** Good afternoon, everybody. We are going to begin.

I'd like to call this prehearing to order in Docket 150043-EI. The time is 1:30, and it is May 20th, 2015. And I would like staff to read the notice, please, Mr. Murphy.

MR. MURPHY: By notice published May 5th, 2015, this time and place is set for a Prehearing Conference in Docket 150043-EI. The purpose of the Prehearing Conference is set out in the notice.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you so much. And I will take appearances starting with my left, which we'll start with Mr. Wright.

MR. WRIGHT: Thank you. Robert Scheffel Wright and John T. LaVia III on behalf of Osprey Energy Center, LLC.

MR. BERNIER: Good afternoon, Commissioner.

Matt Bernier for Duke Energy. I'd also like to enter appearances for John Burnett and Dianne Triplett, as well as James Michael Walls and Blaise Gamba with Carlton, Fields, Jorden, Burke.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.

MR. KOPON: Owen Kopon on behalf of PCS

Phosphate. I'd like to enter an appearance for James

1	Brew and Laura Wynn also.
2	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
3	MS. PUTNAL: Hi. Karen Putnal for the Florida
4	Industrial Power Users Group. I'd like to enter an
5	appearance for Jon C. Moyle as well.
6	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
7	MR. REHWINKEL: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
8	Charles Rehwinkel on behalf of the Office of Public
9	Counsel.
10	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. And staff.
11	MR. MURPHY: Charles Murphy on behalf of the
12	Commission staff.
13	MS. HELTON: And Mary Anne Helton, advisor to
14	the Commission.
15	MR. BECK: Charlie Beck, General Counsel.
16	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you so much for
17	being here.
18	Mr. Murphy, preliminary matters. Do we need
19	to address any preliminary matters before we get into
20	the draft Prehearing Order today?
21	MR. MURPHY: There are none at this time.
22	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Anything from the
23	parties? Seeing none, I would like to expeditiously
24	walk through the draft Prehearing Order, and I'll as
25	usual, I'll identify the sections. Please speak up if

there are any corrections or changes that need to be
made, but I will go through it pretty swiftly at this
time, starting with Section I, the case background.

Seeing any changes from the parties? None.

We'll move to Section II, conduct of proceedings. Seeing any corrections? None.

Section III, jurisdiction. Changes? Seeing none.

Section IV, the procedure for handling confidential information. As you know, the prehearing — the requirements for dealing with confidential data, if you plan to use it for cross, you already have those available to you. If you have any questions about that or any procedural issues, please contact our legal staff who will be available to discuss those with you.

Section V, the prefiled testimony and exhibits as well as witnesses. And I would like to ask, Mr. Murphy, are there any witnesses that you know of that can be excused at this time?

MR. MURPHY: I'm not aware of any, but I believe Duke may have a request in that regard.

MR. BERNIER: Yes, we do. Thank you,

Commissioner. Mark Landseidel is going to be

unavailable due to medical issues.

**COMMISSIONER BROWN:** Due to what issue? 1 MR. BERNIER: Medical issues. 2 3 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Oh, I'm sorry. MR. BERNIER: Yes. So we will be filing a 4 notice of adoption of testimony to have his testimony 5 adopted by his supervisor, and then his supervisor would 6 7 be available at hearing should anybody need to question him. 8 9 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Any objection? Seeing 10 none. Do any of the parties have -- object to any of 11 the witnesses being excused? 12 MR. WRIGHT: We do not object to any of the 13 14 witnesses being excused. MR. BERNIER: Nor do we. 15 **COMMISSIONER BROWN:** PCS? 16 17 (No response.) 18 Okay. I'll go to Mr. Rehwinkel. MR. REHWINKEL: Is -- when you -- we have not 19 20 identified any witnesses other than Mr. Landseidel at 21 Duke's request being excused. If, if we do go to 22 hearing, we will have questions for the witnesses that 23 they have presented. 24 COMMISSIONER BROWN: All of the witnesses? 25 MR. REHWINKEL: At this time, yes,

2	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Thanks.
3	Staff, do you have anything to note regarding
4	the witnesses?
5	MR. MURPHY: One thing for clarification, did
6	we get an agreement that and I don't know how to
7	pronounce his name is he agreeable to be excused?
8	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Mr. Rehwinkel?
9	MR. REHWINKEL: Mr. Landseidel?
10	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Uh-huh.
11	MR. REHWINKEL: I think the Public Counsel and
12	PCS have agreed, but I don't think that FIPUG has been
13	able to confirm whether they could agree to excuse him
14	yet. Ms. Putnal can
15	MS. PUTNAL: Right. And I wasn't clear if a
16	witness would be made available for cross-examination or
17	if he's excused and it would just go in as his filed
18	testimony.
19	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Mr. Bernier.
20	MR. BERNIER: Yeah. What we would propose to
21	do is have his testimony, his direct testimony adopted
22	by his supervisor. It would be Mike Delowery, who's
23	testified here before.
24	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Uh-huh.

MR. REHWINKEL: And then we would make

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1	Mr. Delowery available for cross-examination, should
2	anybody have questions for him.
3	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Is that suitable?
4	MS. PUTNAL: That's, that's suitable. Thank
5	you.
6	MR. REHWINKEL: But to be clear, if there is
7	agreement by FIPUG, we agree to his testimony going in
8	without cross. I mean, that's, that's, that's what I
9	think we've agreed to.
10	COMMISSIONER BROWN: FIPUG, you're on deck?
11	MS. PUTNAL: With that, I'll need to touch
12	base with Mr. Moyle, but I should be able to get an
13	answer back by the end of the day tomorrow.
14	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. And Friday at the
15	latest.
16	MS. PUTNAL: Yes.
17	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Close of business.
18	And PCS?
19	MR. KOPON: We, we agree to that.
20	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. So and, Mr.
21	Wright, sorry, you're all the way down there.
22	MR. WRIGHT: We're completely amenable to
23	Mr. Landseidel's testimony being entered and exhibits
24	received. Thank you.
25	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you for putting

1 that

that on the record.

Is that okay?

MR. MURPHY: Yes. Thank you. And with that, staff recommends that each witness be given three minutes at hearing to summarize his or her testimony.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Or less.

MR. MURPHY: Or less.

**COMMISSIONER BROWN:** That's great. Okay.

MR. REHWINKEL: Madam Commissioner, may I ask a -- if we could revert to Section IV. The only confidential information that the Public Counsel would -- assuming that we, we do go to live hearing, the only confidential information the Public Counsel would propose to use in cross-examination would be an exhibit attached to -- I forget the witness's name, but it is the witness who sponsors the, the agreement, the APA.

**COMMISSIONER BROWN:** Three, witness Matthew Palasek.

MR. REHWINKEL: Palasek, yes. That's the only confidential information that we would propose to use. And what we have done in the past with this new regime is that we notify the staff and they make those copies available to the Commissioners through the normal process. Is that --

COMMISSIONER BROWN: That's amenable.

1	MR. REHWINKEL: Okay.
2	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Yes.
3	MR. REHWINKEL: Yeah. Thank you.
4	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. We are on Section
5	VI, the order of witnesses. Any changes other than as
6	proposed by Duke? All right.
7	So Section VII, basic positions. Any changes?
8	Seeing none.
9	Moving to Section VIII, are there any changes
10	or corrections to the issues or the party positions?
11	Mr. Rehwinkel.
12	MR. REHWINKEL: Yes, Commissioner. We have
13	yesterday we emailed a Word version of our position on
14	Issue 3.
15	COMMISSIONER BROWN: I'm in receipt of it.
16	Are the parties also in receipt of it?
17	MR. KOPON: Yes, Commissioner.
18	MR. REHWINKEL: So I don't think I need to
19	take, put that on the record.
20	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you.
21	MR. REHWINKEL: The staff has it and they can
22	insert it into the order.
23	COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Any other changes
24	to the parties?
25	Okay. Staff, do you have anything to add?

MR. MURPHY: No, ma'am.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Thank you so much.

Section IX, exhibit list. Are there any changes or corrections? None? Okay. Seeing none from the parties.

Staff, anything to note?

MR. MURPHY: Yes. Staff has prepared a Comprehensive Exhibit List which includes all prefiled exhibits and also includes those exhibits staff wishes to include in the record. Staff will check with the parties prior to hearing to determine if there are any objections to the Comprehensive Exhibit List or to any of staff's exhibits being entered into the record.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you so much, Mr. Murphy.

Section X, proposed stipulations. Staff.

MR. MURPHY: DEF and FIPUG have a stipulation regarding FIPUG's standings. There are no other stipulations at this time. Staff will continue to work with the parties to obtain stipulations. Any stipulations entered into by close of business on Friday will be listed at this part of the order. A list of any stipulations entered into after the Prehearing Order is issued will be provided to the Commissioners prior to the hearing.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. Any questions 1 2 on that? 3 All right. Moving to Section XI, pending It's my understanding that there are no 4 5 pending motions. MR. MURPHY: That's right. 6 7 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Parties? Seeing 8 none. 9 Section XII, pending confidentiality. The 10 same goes for that, Mr. Murphy? MR. MURPHY: Yes. 11 12 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Same here. 13 Section XIII, the post-hearing procedures. 14 Mr. Murphy. MR. MURPHY: Staff recommends post-hearing 15 16 briefs, if any, be no longer than 30 pages. 17 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. That's reasonable. 18 I will adopt that. 19 Section XIV, the rulings. It is my 20 understanding that the parties have agreed that the 21 opening statements shall be in accordance with the 22 following. Duke will -- Duke's opening statement will 23 not exceed ten minutes. Osprey, OPC, FIPUG, and PCS will not exceed five minutes each. Is that everyone 24

else's understanding?

MR. BERNSTEIN: Yes.

MR. WRIGHT: Yes.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Yes. Seeing a mutual yes among all of the parties, we will move to other matters.

I would like to let the parties know that pursuant to the Chairman's request, I will be presiding as the hearing officer of this docket in accordance with Section 350.01 of the *Florida Statutes*. And we have our General Counsel here, Mr. Charlie Beck, to be made available to answer any questions you may have regarding the process of this proceeding. Does anybody?

MR. REHWINKEL: Am I to understand that there will be a panel instead of all five Commissioners?

**COMMISSIONER BROWN:** It will be a panel of one.

MR. REHWINKEL: Oh, I see. Okay.

MR. BECK: So, Charles, this will change the post-hearing procedures a bit. Commissioner Brown will issue a recommended order. The parties will be given an opportunity prior to that to give proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law as well as a brief.

After Commissioner Brown issues the recommended order, there will be an opportunity to file written exceptions. And then the recommended order and the written exceptions then go to the full Commission

for -- I think it's the August Agenda Conference. 1 MR. REHWINKEL: Okay. Will what you just 2 described, will that be in the Prehearing Order or --3 MR. BECK: We will need to issue something. 4 It may be an amendatory order or --5 MR. REHWINKEL: Okay. 6 7 MR. BECK: Yes. There will be something. COMMISSIONER BROWN: We have discussed that 8 9 amongst staff, and we will have something that comes 10 out. It may not, it may not be in the prehearing order, but it will be subsequent, before the hearing. 11 MR. REHWINKEL: Okay. Thank you. That will 12 13 be helpful. Thank you. 14 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Any other questions by 15 any of the parties? Mr. Murphy, are there any other preliminary -- other matters? Pardon me. 16 17 MR. MURPHY: Yes. Any information that's 18 anticipated to be provided to staff by the parties as a 19 result of this prehearing should be provided to staff by close of business on Friday. 20 21 Duke, if you could get me your witnesses, the 22 spelling of their name, and if FIPUG could let me know 23 if they're agreeable to stipulate in the testimony, then 24 we wouldn't have to go there on the new witness.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Okay. Sounds amenable.

If there are no other issues right now, this concludes the Prehearing Conference. And I will see you all Wednesday, June 3rd, at 9:30. Thank you so much. (Prehearing Conference adjourned at 1:43 p.m.)
