**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S EIGHTH REQUEST
FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION
OF INFORMATION PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AUDIT NO. 01-073-4-1**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes ("Section 366.093"), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby submits its Eighth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of Information Provided Pursuant to Audit No. 01-073-4-1 ("Confidential Information"). In support of this request, FPL states as follows:

1. On October 29, 2001 FPL filed a Request for Confidential Classification of the Confidential Information, which included Exhibits A, B, C, and D ("October 29, 2001 Request"). By Order No. PSC-01-2339-CFO-EI, dated December 5, 2001 ("Order 2339"), the Commission granted FPL's October 29, 2001 Request. FPL adopts and incorporates by reference the October 29, 2001 Request and Order 2339.
2. By Order No. PSC-03-0892-CFO-EI, dated August 4, 2003, the Commission granted FPL's First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.
3. By Order No. PSC-05-0332-CFO-EI, dated March 23, 2005, the Commission granted FPL's Second Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.
4. By Order No. PSC-06-0980-CFO-EI, dated November 28, 2006, the Commission granted FPL's Third Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.
5. By Order No. PSC-08-0776-CFO-EI, dated November 24, 2008, the Commission granted FPL's Amended Fourth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

6. By Order No. PSC-10-0669-CFO-EI, dated November 3, 2010, the Commission granted FPL's Fifth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

7. By Order No. PSC-12-0313-CFO-EI, dated June 19, 2012, the Commission granted FPL's Sixth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

8. On December 12, 2013 FPL filed its Seventh Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of the Confidential Information ("December 12, 2013 Request"). By Order No. PSC-14-0035-CFO-EI, dated January 14, 2014 ("Order 0035"), the Commission granted FPL's December 12, 2013 Request. FPL adopts and incorporates by reference the December 12, 2013 Request and Order 0035.

9. The Confidential Information that was the subject of FPL's December 12, 2013 Request and Order 0035 warrants continued treatment as proprietary and confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3).

10. All of the information designated as confidential in the December 12, 2013 Request remains confidential. Accordingly, Exhibits A, B and C will not be reproduced or reattached here.

11. Included herewith and made a part hereof is Eighth Revised Exhibit D, which is the affidavit of Antonio Maceo in support of this request.

12. The Confidential Information is intended to be and has been treated by FPL as private, its confidentiality has been maintained, and its disclosure would cause harm to FPL and its customers. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

13. As the affidavit included in Exhibit D indicates, certain documents contain information regarding internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors. This information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(b), Fla. Stat.

14. Upon a finding by the Commission that the Confidential Information remains proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least an additional eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Eighth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.

AFFIDAVIT OF ANTONIO MACEO

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Antonio Maceo who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. My name is Antonio Maceo. I am currently employed by Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") as Manager, Internal Auditing. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated in this affidavit.

2. I have reviewed the documents referenced and incorporated in FPL's Eighth Request for Extension of Confidential Classification of Information Obtained in Connection with Audit No. 01-073-4-1 for which I am identified as the affiant. The documents or materials contain or constitute competitively sensitive information, the disclosure of which could impair the competitive business of the provider of the information. Specifically, some of the information contain or constitute internal auditing controls, reports or notes of internal auditors, or information relating to internal auditing reports issued in 2000. FPL treats such information as confidential and does not disclose it, except as required by law to entities or persons other than the customer absent the customer's consent. To the best of my knowledge, FPL has maintained the confidentiality of these documents and materials.

3. Nothing has occurred since the issuance of Order No. PSC-14-0035-CFO-EI render the information stale or public, such that continued confidential treatment would not be appropriate. Therefore, the information should remain confidential for a period of at least an additional eighteen (18) months. These materials should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business so that FPL can continue to maintain the confidentiality of these documents.
