PRELIMINARY LIST OF ISSUES AND POSITIONS¹**

Gulf Power Company, (“Gulf Power”, “Gulf”, or “the Company”), by and through its undersigned attorneys, files this Preliminary List of Issues and Positions, saying:

Generic Energy Conservation Cost Recovery Issues

ISSUE 1: What are the final conservation cost recovery true-up amounts for the period January 2014 through December 2014?

GULF: Over recovery of \$560,637. (Floyd)

ISSUE 2: What are the total conservation cost recovery amounts to be collected during the period January 2016 through December 2016?

GULF: Recovery of \$7,021,249 (including prior true-up amounts and revenue taxes). (Floyd)

ISSUE 3: What are the conservation cost recovery factors for the period January 2016 through December 2016?

GULF: The Company's proposed conservation cost recovery factors by customer class for the period January 2016 through December 2016 are as follows: (Floyd)



ISSUE 4: What should be the effective date of the new conservation cost recovery factors for billing purposes?

GULF: The new conservation cost recovery factors should be effective beginning with the first billing cycle for January 2016 and thereafter through the last billing cycle for December 2016. The first billing cycle may start before January 1, 2016, and the last cycle may be read after December 31, 2016, so that each customer is billed for twelve months regardless of when the adjustment factor became effective. (Floyd)
