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## PROCEEDINGS

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COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And if I look at the last item that we went through, that item had 46 pages. This item has 267 -- 297 pages. So by how we're working today, I think we might be here until midnight or so.

But before my fellow Commissioners leave, I want to recognize Bob Casey. This is his last agenda. So we want to express our gratitude to you for your hard work and service to our state and, dare I say, our nation, particularly in your work with Lifeline and the Task Force and all of those things. And, you know, when we walk around NARUC circles and telecom circles, you're like a demigod in that space. So thank you for your hard work and your service.

MR. CASEY: Thank you, Commissioners. Thank you.

(Applause.)

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: All right. Item No. 8, Ms. Salak.

MS. SALAK: Yes, sir. Good afternoon, Commissioners. I am Beth Salak with Commission staff. Item 8 is a post-hearing recommendation dealing with an arbitration between Communications Authority and Florida AT&T. This recommendation addresses a variety of issues

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brought to the Commission by the parties. These are issues that the parties could not agree upon for their interconnection agreement.

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On October 19th we did -- staff did file four modifications to the recommendation, and your office should have received those. Staff is ready to proceed as you desire.

**COMMISSIONER BRISÉ:** Thank you very much. So we have 67 issues, Commissioners. We can do this any way you want. If there are issues that you want to pull out and have those addressed in particular. If not, the Chair is willing to entertain a motion for the blocks of issues that you are comfortable with at this time.

Commissioner Brown.

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Mr. Chairman, believe it or not, I read every single page that was put into this, and I have to tell you the time and energy and resources that not only our staff but the parties have spent are just -- it's astronomical. I wish that this could have been resolved at the negotiation table rather through an evidentiary arbitration, but I think the overall end result, looking at each issue by issue, I think it's balanced, I think it's fair, and I think there's a positive result at the end of the day that benefits both of the parties. And I think that they can have -- you

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know, I'm prepared to make a motion on all issues, but I'd be interested in hearing your perspective. I wish that the parties would have a very long, non-adversarial relationship over the life of the contract that has been extended pursuant to staff's recommendation in here. But, you know, the man-hours that were put in here -our staff put in so much time analyzing past decisions that over -- you know, we haven't had an arbitration in nearly a decade, and they really spent a lot of time and energy in the thorough analysis of each issue, and it's indicative. I mean, this is an exemplary piece of work, and I commend them for their hard work on it. I don't even have a single change to any of the recommendations, and I support the full staff recommendation. COMMISSIONER PATRONIS: Second. COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. So it's been moved

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and seconded. Any further comments? Seeing none, all in favor, say aye.

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(Vote taken.)

Thank you very much. I too want to agree with Commissioner Brown and appreciate -- express my appreciation to staff for your hard work on this. To all the parties that have participated in this process, I too read the -- a lot of the case file because I was the Prehearing Officer on this. So I think the give and

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take with the issues that were resolved between the parties and then the recommendations that came through from our team really took into account the totality of everything that's involved. And ultimately what matters most is the ability of consumers to be able to access their telecom services, and ultimately this is what this is about, and I think that this agreement ensures that that happens in a seamless way.
