2 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Item 4. And I believe
3 the Office of Public Counsel is here and is
4 available to speak on this item after staff

introduces it.

MR. ROME: Good morning. Don Rome with Commission staff.

Item 4 is a petition filed by Florida Public Utilities Company to amend its gas transportation service agreement with the City of Lake Worth. The current agreement prohibits the City from selling any of the gas transported by FPUC to the City. The City is now developing a compressed natural gas, CNG, station and will require delivery of additional quantities of gas. The amended agreement would allow resale by the City only to customers of a CNG station. Under the current agreement, the City is paying FPUC for the transport of up to 4,070 thousand cubic feet per hour. With the proposed amendment, FPUC estimates that it would be transporting approximately 155 thousand cubic feet per hour. Thus, the City is paying for a significant amount of unused capacity.

Also, the \$30,000 cost to FPUC of additional facilities to serve the CNG station

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represents only about 1 percent of the remaining net 1 plant value of the Lake Worth lateral facilities. 2 3 Based on staff's review, the proposed amendment appears to be reasonable. Staff is not 4 aware of any customer complaints or correspondence 5 regarding this docket, and staff recommends 6 7 approval. The Office of Public Counsel is here today 8 9 and would like to offer some remarks regarding this 10 item. CHAIRMAN BROWN: And before we get that, 11 Ms. Keating, would you like the opportunity to speak 12 in favor? 13 14 MS. KEATING: Good morning, Madam Chairman, Commissioners. Beth Keating with the 15 Gunster Law Firm here today for FPUC. 16 17 We're here to support staff's 18 recommendation and answer any questions you may 19 have. 20 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. 21 Office of Public Counsel. 22 MS. ROTH: Good morning, Commissioners. 23 Danielle Roth with the Office of Public Counsel. I 24 do just have very quick remarks. 25 The Office of Public Counsel understands

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that the approval of the proposed amendment and the \$30,000 cost of adding the additional facilities to serve the CNG station will have a de minimis impact on the cost of service in this particular case, and, thus, we do not have an objection to staff's recommendation. However, we do want to make sure that this case does not become precedent for future cases that do not meet the specific factors of this case and could cause the general body of ratepayers to bear the weight of disproportionate costs that might not be otherwise properly allocated to them.

And Mr. Rome did say a lot of this already. In this present case, the agreement calls for the City to pay FPUC for the transport of 4,070 MCF per hour. With the additional volume for the CNG station, FPUC will only be transporting a total of approximately 155 MCF per hour.

In addition, the depreciated value of the lateral serving the City is roughly 2.4 million, which makes the \$30,000 additional facility cost approximately 1 percent of the remaining net planned value and sufficiently covered by the revenues received from the City.

Based on the very specific facts of this particular case and the de minimis impact of the

2	adverse impact to the general body of FPUC
3	ratepayers. Thank you.
4	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, Ms. Roth. And
5	I appreciate your comments and definitely take them
6	into consideration in the future.

9	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Move staff
10	recommendation.
