CHAIRMAN BROWN: The next item is a panel which will be led by Commissioner Edgar. It's a panel comprised of Commissioner Edgar, Commissioner Brisé, and Commissioner Patronis. And I'll turn it over to her.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Madam Chair.

MS. BRUCE: Good morning, Commissioners.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Good morning.

MS. BRUCE: I'm Sonica Bruce on behalf of Commission staff. Item No. 6 addresses the Office of Public Counsel and Sandalhaven's joint motion requesting Commission approval of a stipulation and settlement agreement.

On January 6th, 2016, the Commission issued a PAA order granting the utility a rate increase. On January 27th, OPC filed a petition -- a request for hearing. Sandalhaven filed a cross-petition for a formal administrative hearing on February 4. Sandalhaven placed the PAA rates into effect, subject to refund, with the exception of Allowance for Funds Prudently Invested charges. The utility maintained the AFPI charges that were in effect prior to the PAA order.

In the joint motion, which was filed on March 21, the parties agreed to the PAA order and its overall revenue requirement with the exception of the AFPI charges. They agree that the utility should continue to collect the AFPI charges that were in effect when the Commission obtained jurisdiction from Charlotte County.

Further, the parties agree that the protested issues of the PAA order should have no precedential effect or value and can be raised in any future rate case. Staff believes that the parties' settlement agreement is a reasonable resolution because it addresses all protested issues.

Since the issuance of the order, two customers filed comments regarding the rate increase. OPC are present. Staff is prepared to answer any questions that you may have at this time.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Ms. Bruce.

As mentioned, this is a panel comprised of myself, Commissioner Brisé, and Commissioner Patronis. Commissioners, are there questions for staff?
