Subject: Indian River Shores -- Please Grant Our Town's Request for Change in Territorial Boundaries

To All Public Service Commissioners,

For many years, Vero Beach has subjected customers residing in Indian River Shores to monopoly abuses. As residents of Indian River Shores, we want to be allowed to change our electric service provider to Florida Power and Light once our Franchise Agreement with Vero Beach expires in November.

It is our understanding that Article VIII, Section 2 (c) of Florida's Constitution forbids Vero Beach from unilaterally exercising unregulated monopoly powers within Indian River Shores' municipal boundaries after the franchise agreement expires in November. We support Indian River Shores Town Council in asking the PSC to view this as a "changed legal circumstance" and grant our town's request for a change in territorial boundaries.

We are writing to urge you to vote in favor of this request.
