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2           **CHAIRMAN BROWN:** Moving on to Item 11.

3           **MS. OLLILA:** Good morning, Commissioners. Sue  
4 Ollila for staff.

5           Item 11 is Florida Power & Light's petition  
6 for approval of revisions to its residential and  
7 commercial underground differential tariffs. The  
8 residential differential tariffs are filed pursuant to  
9 Rule 25-6.078, *Florida Administrative Code*. They apply  
10 to new developments and represent the additional costs  
11 FPL incurs to provide underground distribution service  
12 in place of overhead service.

13           Rule 25-6.078 requires current labor and  
14 material costs be used and that the company file  
15 supporting data and analyses, which FPL has done. The  
16 residential differentials have either decreased or  
17 remained at zero dollars under the proposed rates. The  
18 primary reason for the decrease are larger increases in  
19 overhead labor and material costs than in underground  
20 labor and material costs. There have been no customer  
21 contacts, and staff recommends approval of the  
22 residential and commercial distribution tariffs.

23           **CHAIRMAN BROWN:** Thank you. And this looks  
24 like a very exciting endeavor. It actually shows that  
25 underground -- undergrounding is more cost-effective.

1           **MS. OLLILA:** In terms of the differentials,  
2           yes.

3           **CHAIRMAN BROWN:** Yes. That's a great, great  
4           thing for customers.

5           Commissioners, any questions or comments?
