Ms. Gordon,

This is in regards to Sunny Shores request for a late payment charge. In the cost justification to support the late payment charge, Sunny Shores listed a salary of \$30 which was a best guess estimation taking into account everything that has to occur when a payment is late. Included in the estimation of a \$30 salary was preparing and sending a disconnect notice, preparing and delivering a second disconnect notice to the customer's door, and the cost of transportation and gas for delivering the disconnect notices. These listed work activities are not involved in a late payment charge which is simply the cost of preparing and sending out a late payment notice. Since there are two functions contained within the estimated \$30 salary, is it appropriate to assume the salary for the late payment function would be \$15 an hour?
