2	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Moving on to Item 8.
3	Good afternoon.
4	MR. COSTON: Good afternoon. Tripp Coston
5	with Commission staff. I would like to take this
6	opportunity to introduce Nate Whitchurch. This is
7	Nate's first time before the Commission. And he

16	of Alachua and Duke Energy Florida, LLC, requesting
17	approval of an amended territorial agreement in
18	Alachua County.
19	The proposed agreement does not change the
20	territorial boundaries; however, one commercial
21	customer and one residential customer will be
22	transferred from Duke to Alachua. These two
23	customers were found to be inadvertently served by
24	Duke. And the customers have been notified, and a
25	description of the billing differences between

1	Duke's and Alachua's rates have been provided to
2	them.
3	No feedback has been received from the two
4	affected customers. And staff recommends approval
5	of this petition. Staff and representatives from
6	Duke are available to answer any question the
7	Commission may have. Thank you.
8	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. Good job. There
9	are a few questions for you.
10	Commissioner Edgar.
11	MR. HETRICK: Madam Chair, excuse me
12	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Oh, yes, Mr
13	MR. HETRICK: If I

15	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. Thank you.
16	Commissioner Patronis.
17	COMMISSIONER PATRONIS: Thank you, Madam
18	Chairman.
