## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. Moving on to Item 4. Good morning.

MS. GALLOWAY: Good afternoon, Commissioners. CHAIRMAN BROWN: Oh, yeah.

**MS. GALLOWAY:** Just barely. Cissy Galloway with Commission staff.

Item No. 4 addresses the compliance of Cedar Acres with the PAA order that was issued in this docket pertaining to the utility's staff-assisted rate case. The utility was ordered to submit 6- and 12-month compliance reports. The utility found -- the Commission, excuse me, found the utility to be in substantial compliance with the PAA order when staff brought the 6-month compliance report to you in August of last year. Item 4 is in regard to the 12-month compliance report.

Staff is recommending that the utility, again, is in substantial compliance with the PAA order. Staff continues to monitor the meter replacement program and believes the utility continues to make good progress with those efforts.

We are also recommending that an additional billing analysis be submitted by the utility by July 31st of this year in order to more fully evaluate

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000003 the customer demand and better determine the utility's 1 2 revenue stream. 3 Cedar Acres' President, Mr. David Simmons, is 4 here to answer any questions that you may have, and staff is also available for questions. 5 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. 6 7 Good to see you, Mr. Simmons. MR. SIMMONS: Thank you, Commissioners. 8 9 CHAIRMAN BROWN: And welcome. I appreciate 10 that. 11 Commissioners, questions? 12 Commissioner Polmann. 13 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Madam 14 Chairman. 15 I do have a question. And within Item 4, I'm looking at Issue No. 2 within this item. And I 16 understand in the -- in the discussion, in the text that 17 18 staff encourages the utility to reach out to the Florida 19 Rural Water Association, which I support that concept, working with that association. However, in reviewing 20 21 this item, I'm very concerned about the large disparity 22 between the gallons pumped and the gallons sold. And 23 you note that concern as well; staff identified that. 24 So I believe it may be warranted to require rather than 25 encourage, to actually require of the utility another

000004 step beyond what is in Issue 2 as an additional billing 1 analysis. And if I may ask a couple of questions. 2 3 Thank you. 4 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Please. COMMISSIONER POLMANN: First, with regard to 5 the Florida Rural Water Association, can you confirm, do 6 7 we know that the utility is a member of that association? 8 9 MS. GALLOWAY: Mr. Simmons can also answer 10 that, but --11 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, sir, we are a member of the 12 Florida Rural Water Association. 13 THE COURT REPORTER: He needs to turn his 14 microphone on. 15 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, I can confirm that we are a member of the Florida Rural Water Association. In fact, 16 17 I spoke with the executive director, Gary Williams, 18 about two weeks ago. 19 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay. Thank you. It's 20 my understanding, and I'll simply ask for general 21 confirmation, that that association can typically 22 provide literature, educational materials, maybe some 23 instruction. They have standards of practice, operating 24 procedures, maybe some guidance on preventative and 25 corrective maintenance, those types of things, and can FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

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be very helpful to the utility.

So under these circumstances, I would like to suggest, Madam Chairman, that we could include in Issue 2, in addition to the billing analysis, that the utility seek information and assistance that may be available from the Florida Rural Water Association or other organizations or sources, and then actually report back to the Commission staff within, let's say, six months or some other appropriate time that the staff and the utility may agree upon and provide back to us a specific plan of action --

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Uh-huh.

COMMISSIONER POLMANN: -- that could address this disparity. Because I think it's quite a large number. So I'm looking for a specific plan of action back to staff, and that plan -- and, again, it's a plan of action, not necessarily a specific action to be undertaken, but a plan for us to review and then to communicate back with the utility. And that plan should include something in addition to the meter replacement that's already underway. So I'm asking for some discussion, and perhaps my colleagues here would agree that that addition may be appropriate. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, Commissioner Polmann. I appreciate you taking an interest in this.

000006 I also had similar concerns about the huge disparity, 1 and I'd be curious to hear from Mr. Simmons. Is that 2 3 the way to pronounce your name, Mr. Simmons? 4 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, ma'am. CHAIRMAN BROWN: What do you think is the 5 issue? I mean, there's --6 7 MR. SIMMONS: Well, we had a leak. We know what the issue was. We had a leak. It got bigger. 8 Ιt 9 has since been repaired as of approximately a month ago. 10 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Do you think that this is 11 going to continue to occur with the -- between the gallons pumped and those that are gallons sold? 12 13 MR. SIMMONS: Well, there will be some 14 disparity based upon the meter replacement. We've got 15 our old meters. And as per the Commission, any meters 16 that are broken that have not yet been replaced, we can 17 only charge the base rate. So there will be water 18 that's come out. The Commission has a plan that has 19 been set up and we have been following as far as meter 20 replacement. So that's part of it. And the other part, 21 we're a small utility, so when it starts leaking, it 22 gets to be big numbers. 23 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Uh-huh. 24 MR. SIMMONS: So -- but that has been 25 corrected.

000007 CHAIRMAN BROWN: I can appreciate that. And 1 it sounds like the utility has been making strides, 2 3 you've been engaged with staff, and I commend you for all of that. You're a member of the Florida Rural Water 4 Association, Gary Williams? 5 MR. SIMMONS: Yes, ma'am. 6 7 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Have you talked to him about coming out there and investigating the system or --8 9 MR. SIMMONS: That I have not done. 10 CHAIRMAN BROWN: They are a very good 11 resource. And I absolutely agree with Commissioner 12 Polmann, it would be advantageous to you and your 13 customers to have them look at the system and evaluate 14 whether there's a leak detection or see what type of assistance that they could provide. 15 Commissioners, any other questions or 16 17 comments? Yeah, sure. Commissioner Graham. 18 19 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: I guess the question is to Commissioner Polmann. Are you looking to mandate 20 21 that they reach out to the Florida Water Association, 22 because -- or are you just going to go with what staff 23 already has in the recommendation saying staff 24 encourages them to reach out to them? 25 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Well, my suggestion

000008 and -- my suggestion was broad wording, either that association or others that may be appropriate. But my desire was to see an action plan provided back to us with specific steps. So my interest is in the plan of action. And what I've just heard here was that they have a plan of action. And if that's the case, then allow staff to receive that and review it and have specific discussions. I appreciate the meter That's critical. But if there are other replacement. things -- hearing of the leak and the repair of the leak, this is important information that I was not aware of. If there are other things that are ongoing, we'd like that submitted and discussed with staff. And I think an important aspect of that would be to receive a report of a plan of action and steps taken or anticipated and some time frame associated with that. And I understand it's a small utility. I appreciate that very much. CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you.

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**COMMISSIONER POLMANN:** But I was just looking for a plan in writing.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, Commissioner Polmann.

Staff, Ms. Corbari, I know with the meter replacement program, even though the 12-month compliance

report has concluded, my understanding is that you're going to continue to receive updates on the progress of the meter replacement. And, in addition, staff is -- in this order is asking for a billing analysis as well. Commissioner Polmann's concerns or, I guess, direction, would that encompass that too?

MS. CORBARI: Staff just found out about the leak this morning, Commissioners. We believe the billing analysis concluded in October. The utility bills every two months. With them fixing the leak last month, in the next billing analysis, receiving by July 31st, could possibly show, in addition to the meter replacements, that number come down. But certainly if the Commission wanted to have the utility reach out to the Florida Rural Water Association and request a leak survey, it's certainly within the Commission's discretion.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you.

Commissioner Polmann, if you'd like to make a motion, we're ripe for it at this time.

COMMISSIONER POLMANN: I would make a motion to move staff. I think the discussion that we've had provides sufficient direction. I think the utility understands what we're asking for. I don't think it's necessary that we change the recommendation to require a

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report, but I would encourage the utility to work cooperatively with the staff. If you have a plan of action or are preparing, that you provide that and work with us. We encourage you to deal with the association, as discussed. But beyond that, you've heard us, and I would move staff recommendation. COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Second. CHAIRMAN BROWN: Any further discussion? Seeing none, all those in favor, say aye. (Vote taken.) The motion passes. Thank you. COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you. CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thanks for coming up here. Appreciate it. (Agenda item concluded.) FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION
