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CHAIRMAN BROWN: Moving on to Item 8. My understanding is -- I believe that Mr. Smallridge is, who's on this -- who's the utility, is traveling still and intended to be here. Is that correct, Mr. Futrell? Is he nearby?

MR. FUTRELL: I don't know that we have an ETA. Fifteen minutes.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Okay. We're going to go ahead with this item. Staff, can you proceed?

MR. LEWIS: Yes. Good morning. Docket 160144 is staff's recommendation concerning the transfer of water system of Orangeland Water Supply to Orange Land Utilities, LLC, located in Pasco County. The Commission granted the utility a water certificate in 1977, and there have not been any other certificate actions until this transfer request. The utility serves approximately 74 customers, and the current rates and charges were approved by the Commission in 2008.

At this time, OPC has not intervened and no protests have been made in opposition to the transfer. Staff is recommending approval of the transfer and is available to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, Mr. Lewis. I do have a question on this.

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Mr. Smallridge, I believe, is the owner of this, if we approve this docket, and he also is part of another docket on the -- on today's agenda.

If I recall, in one of our previous Commission Agenda Conferences, we urged Mr. Smallridge to -- or we asked -- he promised the Commission that he was not going to acquire any more systems during the Agenda Conference discussion. Does anybody recall that? No? Ms. Helton? I know she does.

MS. HELTON: I --

CHAIRMAN BROWN: I believe he made a statement.

MS. HELTON: I know there was discussion about that. I don't remember specifically whether he made a statement. But Mr. Maurey has come up; he might have a better memory than me.

MR. MAUREY: Good morning.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Good morning.

MR. MAUREY: There was a discussion on that point. It was a suggestion that he digest the systems he had acquired before acquiring new systems, but it was not ordered not to --

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Didn't he make the representation, though, that he was not going to acquire any up until a certain date?

MR. MAUREY: I can't recall that representation.

ask him that. This -- I know that this particular system has some costs and charges that we just recently approved that are a little bit higher than -- in this case than they were in maybe a sister company. Can you guys go into some of the detail, particularly on page 14, on the convenience charge? I mean, I think we just approved one of his sister utilities for -- that was \$3 last month, and now this is -- I know it's a nominal amount of an increase, but what type of justification, if you could?

MS. FRIEDRICH: Commission staff -- this is

Marissa with Commission staff. We've been in contact

with Mr. Smallridge about the consistency for his

charges, along with the miscellaneous service charges

and the meter tampering that he's also been requesting

with his other utilities. He is aware that we are

looking to be consistent for all of his utilities, but

the reason that this charge went up 43 cents was because

of the credit card machine increase.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Employee of the month?

MS. HUDSON: Marissa is correct with regards to why the charge has gone up, and actually that charge

was approved in January of 2016. So it's been a year 1 since the \$3 was approved for Charlie Creek. 2 3 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Uh-huh. MS. HUDSON: But he did indicate that the 4 charge was for the machine cost going up since that 5 time. 6 7 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Okay. All right. MS. HUDSON: But he is trying -- the 3.43, I 8 9 believe is what we're recommending, seems to be -- the 10 charge is going to be consistent with --11 CHAIRMAN BROWN: All the others. 12 MS. HUDSON: -- with all the others. 13 CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. Thanks. Thank 14 you, ladies. 15 Commissioners, any other questions? 16 Commissioner Brisé. COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: So when you say the 17 machine charge goes up, so that's the transaction -- per 18 transaction fee? 19 20 MS. HUDSON: That's been assessed to him, yes. COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you. 21 22 CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. Commissioners, if 23 there are no other questions, I'll take a motion. COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: I move staff 24 2.5 recommendation on all issues.
