2	CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. We will move to
3	Item 3. Good morning.
4	MS. DEAS: Good morning, Commissioners.
5	Sakina Deas on behalf of the Office of
6	Telecommunications.
7	Item 3 is AT&T Florida's request for partial
8	relinquishment of its eligible telecommunication
9	carrier status in Florida, also known as ETC. As
10	an ETC, AT&T Florida has been receiving Universal
11	Service funds for the LifeLine and high-cost
12	programs.
13	And in their AT&T's petition, they are
14	seeking to retain ETC designation in areas where
15	they receive high cost, but they're wanting to
16	relinquish in areas where they receive
17	reimbursement for LifeLine only.
18	Federal rules allow carriers to relinquish
19	their ETC designation, provided there are more than
20	one remaining ETC in the relinquished area, and
21	also, that the remaining ETCs ensure the state
22	commission that customers will continue to be
23	served.
24	After review, staff determined AT&T Florida
25	has met federal requirements to relinquish its ETC

1	designation. Therefore, staff recommends the
2	Commission grant AT&T Florida's petition for
3	partial relinquishment of its ETC designation.
4	There are no customer comments in this docket.
5	And staff is available for questions.
6	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you for that
7	introduction.
8	Commissioner Brisé?
9	COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Thank you, Madam Chair.
10	Just wanted to express my appreciation to
11	staff for all the steps that they've taken to
12	ensure that customers actually have a place to go.
13	And maybe if staff would go through explaining
14	that process so that people are aware of the steps
15	that were taken.
16	MS. DEAS: Okay. AT&T identified the ETCs
17	that would be remaining in the relinquished areas.
18	And we sent a data request staff sent a data
19	request to those ETCs to to ident to assure
20	us that they would continue to serve those
21	customers and that they were currently serving
22	customers in that area.
23	Once we got the responses back, we went
24	further to look at every wire center and check
25	zin samples of zin codes in those areas and co

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1	to each ETC's website and put in those zip
2	codes to to see that they, in fact, would be
3	continue would be serving those customers.
4	And then we looked at the list and it and
5	identified the wire centers that would have the
6	least number of ETCs remaining once AT&T
7	relinquished. And we asked AT&T to provide us with
8	the customers' addresses in those areas so that we
9	could go to each ETC that was remaining in that
10	area to their website, and put in that address
11	to ensure that that customer would be able to
12	receive LifeLine service with those customers. So,
13	they have options. And we just wanted to make sure
14	of that.
15	COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Thank you, Madam Chair.
16	I thought that was important for for the record,
17	for people to understand the steps that were taken
18	for those who are on the program and that they have
19	options and they have a place to go.
20	CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you, Commissioner
21	Brisé.
22	Commissioner Graham.
23	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you, Madam Chair.
24	I just want to take a minute to thank Beth and
25	her people. You know, since I've been here the

1	last seven years, we're doing our responsibility
2	for telecom has been less and less, but that
3	doesn't mean that our drive and our work ethic
4	hasn't been any less.
5	This is a perfect example of going over and
6	above board what is expected. And I I do
7	appreciate the fact that, even through the the
8	direction of Braulio, that that we continue to
9	do what we need to do for the state of Florida for
10	the for these people that are still under
11	under our control. And I do appreciate them.

13	kind of disregard this stuff. We do appreciate
14	what you guys are doing every single day on this.
