CLARIFICATION OF PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING THE LIMITED PROCEEDING AND SUBSEQUENT TARIFF FILING

Florida Public Utilities Company ("FPUC" or "Company"), and the Citizens of the State of Florida, by and through the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") (collectively, the "Parties") hereby file this clarification of procedure for conducting the limited proceeding and subsequent tariff filing as set forth in the Parties' Joint Motion filed on July 21, 2017. The Parties, having met and conferred, agree the following procedure shall apply in this docket:

- 1. FPUC will file a tariff in a separate docket based on the Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Proposed Agency Action ("PAA") vote within 15 days of the PAA vote.
 - 2. The PAA order will be issued on or before 20 days after the PAA vote.
- 3. For the purposes of this proceeding, and as agreed to by the Parties, 21 days following the issuance of the PAA order shall be deemed the filing deadline for any and all objections to FPUC's tariff, as well as the PAA Order ("Filing Deadline"). If any substantially affected person and/or OPC want to have a hearing on the PAA vote rates, they must file both a protest in the PAA docket and a separate request for hearing in the tariff docket on or before the Filing Deadline. If FPUC wants to have a hearing on the PAA vote rates, it shall be required to file a protest in the PAA docket by the Filing Deadline.

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If no timely protest is filed in the PAA docket and no request for hearing is timely

filed in the tariff docket, the tariff rates will go into effect the day after the Filing Deadline and

both the tariff and the PAA dockets will be closed.

5. If either OPC or a substantially affected person files a timely protest in the PAA

docket and also files a request for hearing in the tariff docket, the tariff rates shall go into effect

the day after the Filing Deadline, subject to refund.

6. If only FPUC files a timely protest in the PAA docket, FPUC shall simultaneously

withdraw its tariff and the tariff docket will be administratively closed. The net effect of the

withdrawal of the tariff is that there will be no rate increase during the pendency of the hearing

process.

7. Should a PAA protest and a request for hearing on the tariff be filed, the tariff

docket and PAA docket will be consolidated for hearing purposes only.

8. This procedure shall be limited to this case, Docket No. 20170150-EI. FPUC and

OPC agree that neither waive any argument in any future docket as to the application of the "file

and suspend" statute to limited proceedings nor shall this agreement be deemed "res judicata" as

to any argument regarding that question in any future docket,
