**DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA, LLC'S
PRELIMINARY LIST OF ISSUES AND POSITIONS**

Duke Energy Florida, LLC (“DEF”) hereby submits its Preliminary List of Issues and Positions with respect to its Energy Conservation Cost Recovery factors for the period of January through December 2018 pursuant to Order No. PSC-17-0111-PCO-EG issued March 17, 2017.¹

GENERIC ECCR ISSUES

ISSUE 1: What are the final conservation cost recovery adjustment true-up amounts for the period January 2016 through December 2016?

DEF: The adjusted net true-up for the period January 2016 through December 2016 is an over-recovery of \$3,391,426, which is the difference of the actual true-up over-recovery of \$7,271,001 and the estimated/actual true-up over-recovery of \$3,879,575. (Cross)

ISSUE 2: What are the appropriate conservation adjustment actual/estimated true-up amounts for the period January 2017 through December 2017?

DEF: \$4,192,118 adjusted net true-up under-recovery. (Cross)

ISSUE 3: What are the appropriate total conservation adjustment true-up amounts to be collected/refunded from January 2018 through December 2018?

DEF: \$3,078,883 adjusted net true-up over-recovery. (Cross)

ISSUE 4: What are the total conservation cost recovery amounts to be collected during the period January 2018 through December 2018?

DEF: \$111,408,966. (Cross)

ISSUE 5: What are the conservation cost recovery factors for the period January 2018 through December 2018?

ISSUE 6: What should be the effective date of the new conservation cost recovery factors for billing purposes?

DEF: The new factors should be effective beginning with the first billing cycle for January 2018, and thereafter through the last billing cycle for December 2018. The first billing cycle may start before January 2018, and the last billing cycle may end after December 31, 2018, so long as each customer is billed for twelve months regardless of when the factors became effective. (Cross)
