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CHAIRMAN BROWN: All right. Moving on to Item 6.

MS. WATTS: Commissioners, Item 6 is staff's recommendation for the acknowledgment of the resolution of the Board of Commissioners of Leon County declaring Leon County subject to the provisions of Section 367, Florida Statutes. Staff is available to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. Staff, I do have questions on this. I'm curious the genesis behind this resolution and why the board of county commissioners is -- has submitted this transfer resolution.

MS. WATTS: It is my understanding that one of the utilities that was under the Leon County jurisdiction wanted a rate case, and Leon County decided not to handle it.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: Said "Not on my watch"? So they transferred all the private utilities?

MS. WATTS: Yes.

CHAIRMAN BROWN: And how many would that be?

MS. WATTS: Well, they have provided us a list where they've listed three wastewater systems and four water systems that they believe should be under our regulation as well as five water systems that they

believe meet the small system exemption. And we are 1 investigating that to either confirm or, you know, find 2 3 that they're not exempt for this or other reasons. CHAIRMAN BROWN: And obviously Florida law 4 allows them to do that, but which utility is the one 5 that came in for a rate case that --6 7 MS. WATTS: Seminole Water. CHAIRMAN BROWN: Waterworks. So when should 8 9 the Commission see that? MS. WATTS: We've got that in and we are, you 10 know, looking through it. We are doing deficiencies, 11 12 you know, and -- it's in process. We received that the same day we received the resolution. 13 14 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Would the transfers be individually transfer applications? 15 MS. WATTS: Yes. 16 17 CHAIRMAN BROWN: So are the utilities then 18 responsible to file with the Commission the transfers 19 requested? MS. WATTS: It would be for an original 20 21 certificate actually. 22 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Uh-huh. 23 MS. WATTS: They would be filing for a 2.4 grandfather certificate. And we are, you know, in 25 communication with them to determine whether or not they

meet any exemption, and after which time, if they don't, 1 then we would request that they file for the grandfather 2 certificate. 3 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Thank you. 4 Commissioner Graham. 5 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Just a quick question 6 7 for staff. When a county transfers the authority over to us, isn't there a time frame before they can take it 8 9 back, if they choose to take it back? 10 MS. WATTS: Yes, there is. There's ten years. COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: 11 Ten years. MS. WATTS: Uh-huh. 12 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. So they can't 13 just send it to us to do a rate case and take it back. 14 MS. WATTS: Right. 15 16 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Once they send it to us, 17 we have it for ten years. MS. WATTS: Right. 18 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Okay. I just wanted to 19 20 make sure. Thanks. 21 CHAIRMAN BROWN: Let us vote on the rate case 22 and then they take it back. I see how it works. 23 Commissioner Polmann. 24 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Madam
